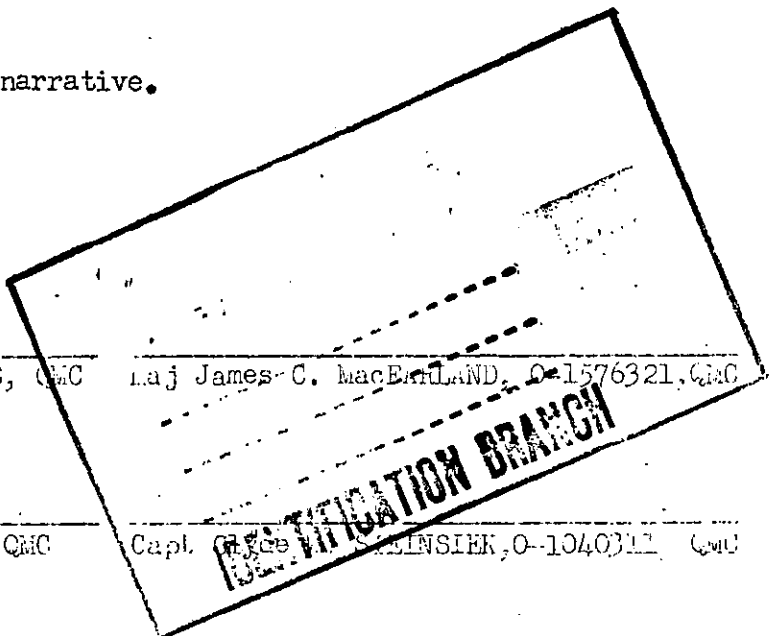

CASE HISTORY

Unknown X-8162

USMC St Avold

A/C # 42-102918 and # 44-40444 crashed near Munich, Germany, on 19 July 1944. Captured German records ME 1651 and ME 1636, indicate that casualties from subject aircraft were buried in North and West Cemeteries at Munich.

All casualties from both planes have been recovered and identified.

The remains now designated X-8162 were recovered from the West Cemetery with identified crew casualties from both planes, and was originally identified by identification tags as T/Sgt Lionel B. BOURASSA, 11 087 596, a crew member of A/C # 44-40444.

Recent reprocessing of associated remains resulted in the conclusive identification of X-6436 St Avold as T/Sgt Bourassa.

Teeth for Bourassa were found with X-8317 Neuville and placed with X-6436. Teeth with X-6436 were placed with remains of Bourassa, now designated X-8162.

Unknown X-8162 can not be associated with any resolved or unresolved casualty in the Munich area.

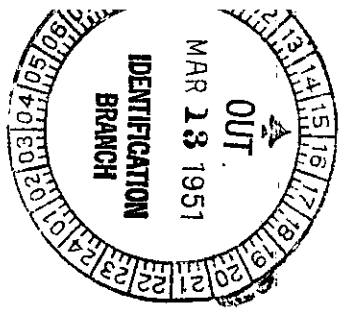
In view of the above, it is concluded that X-8162 should be considered Unidentifiable.

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.

Teeth for SANDALL found with this case but articulation cannot be definitely established because of missing portions. The estimated height is based only on a humerus which accounts for the estimated height being a little under the height for SANDALL. The right fibula is missing in this case preventing verification of healed fracture. None of the fibulae present in the associated cases have any evidence of a healed fracture.

No teeth recovered for HURLEY. The coronal and lambdoidal skull sutures are not yet closed which is favorable for age of HURLEY. The sagittal suture, however, is in an advanced stage of closure which is abnormal for the remains but not necessarily contradictory.

3. Case BOURASSA appears to be incorrectly identified. The age is excessively old for BOURASSA and the estimated height is too short for BOURASSA. In addition, a very favorable association has been made between X-6436 and BOURASSA. Available information indicates that case X-6436 was recovered from the same grave as case now tagged as BOURASSA. This is substantiated by the finding of portions belonging to X-6436 in cases X-8314 and X-8315 which also came from the same grave as case tagged BOURASSA. Teeth found with case X-8317 have been identified as only those of BOURASSA and have been placed with case X-6436 which agrees excellently for BOURASSA as shown below:

Although the skull with this case is identified as that of BOND by the identification of teeth it is noted that there is an inconsistency of skull suture closures. (Coronal suture is completely open but sagittal and lambdoidal sutures are closed).
