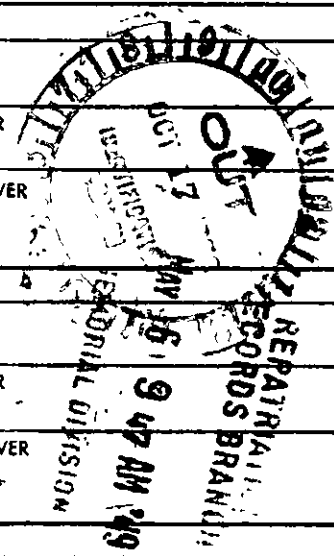

Helmet liner with number painted on inside "9624". A check of these numbers revealed that Helmet Liner may have belonged to Morton Clayton, 33 319 624, a casualty near Forte dei Marmi, 5 April 1945, and a member of the 92nd Division. A combat boot, size 10 1/2 B, appeared to have been blown apart by an explosive. Back part of shoe pack, size 8. A partial toothchart was accomplished for "Tentatively identified" as Elliott and X-281.

8. It is requested that toothchart accomplished be compared with the following list of Unrecovered Casualties in an effort to aid in the identification of Elliott, X-281 and X-280.

1. The remains of Unknown American X-280, 281, and "Tentatively Identified" as Hubert L. Elliott, 33 125 303, were recovered from a mine field on Mt. Canala at Grid Coords: 963-965, Sheet 104, Pisa, Map of Italy 1/100,000 and interred in U.S. Military Cemetery, Castelfiorentino, Italy, in plot 2-J, row 93, grave 4859, common grave for "Tentatively Identified" Elliott and X-281, and grave 4858 for X-280. Date of interment, 28 August 1946.

2. Date of death for Unknown American X-281 and Elliott, Hubert L. is 10 February 1945, whereas, date of death for X-280 is unknown.

3. Elements from the 92nd Division were engaged in combat in this area from October 1944 to April 1945; therefore, it is assumed that remains are those of colored troops, who had burned the area in an effort to clear it of shoe and wooden box mines.

4. Casualty listings have been processed to eliminate all casualties who were not members of the 92nd Division, and casualties in the vicinity of Mt. Canala in February 1945.

5. Tentative identification was made for Elliott by identification tags found with the charred remains together with those of X-281. The other remains (X-280) were found 20 feet down the slope (west) from those of Elliott. With the remains of X-280 were found a shoe, shoe pack and helmet liner.

6. Physical characteristics were unobtainable as remains were badly charred. The presence of elements of 3 bodies was disclosed. The following bones were "Tentatively Identified" as Hubert L. Elliott and X-281:

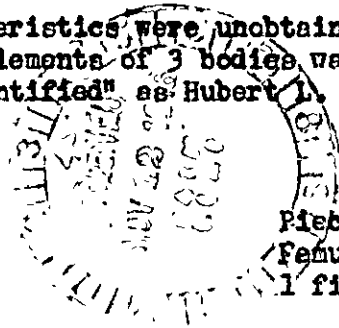

1. Submitted herewith is report of investigation concerning the recovery of remains referred to as those of Tont. Ident. as Hubert L. Elliott, 33125303, Unknown X-280 and X-281.
2. Remains were recovered from a mine field on Mt. Canala at Coord. (963-965) Sh. 104, Pisa Lhp of Italy 1/100,000. 22 August 1946 by T/5 Ryo Uchida.
3. Excerpt from report submitted by T/5 Uchida is as follows:

"....the remains of Tont. Ident. as Hubert L. Elliott were recovered from a mine field. The Italian civilian who had a thorough knowledge of the area led us to the remains of the soldier. On gathering charred remains I ran across "dog tags"....other than the dog tags nothing further was found which would establish identity.

This area had been burned out and I was informed that Negro troops had burned the area in an attempt to clear the area of mines.in all probability the soldier had stepped on a mine as the area had been heavily mined with shoe and wooden box mines....The area is still not cleared so I did not venture to make any further search.

The other remains (X-280) were found about 20 feet down the slope (west) from those of Elliott. With these remains were found a shoe, shoepeg and helmet liner....this also may have been a mine casualty....Through out the slope are indications of foxholes and trenches....Possibly the remainder of remains may be recovered when and if the area is cleared."

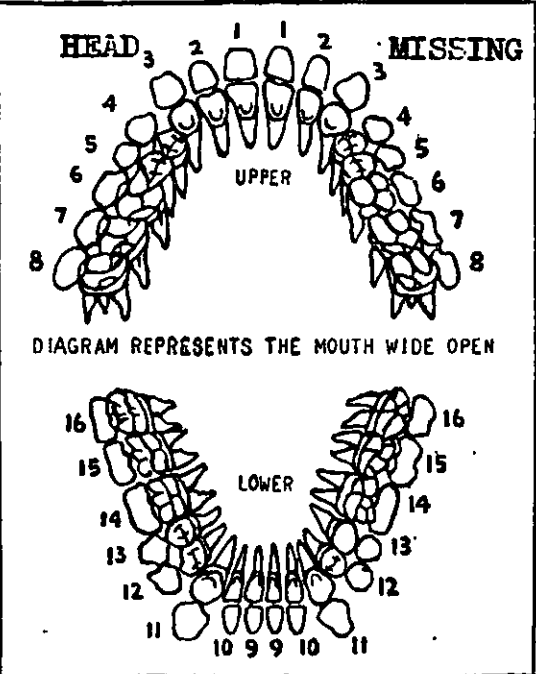

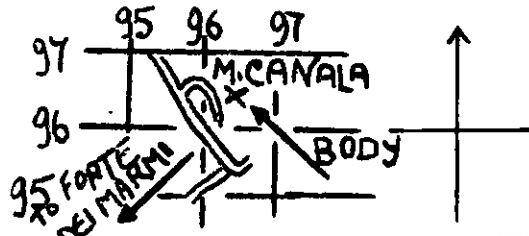
