S/Sgt. Frank D. De Vito, 32389335, Company L, 349th Infantry Regiment, 88th Infantry Division, Killed in Action on 25 October 1944 somewhere in Northern Italy. The remains of "Believed to Be" S/Sgt. De Vito (Unknown American X-59821) were recovered from an isolated grave near Tazzola, Italy, and reinterred in USMC Castelfiorentino, Italy.

FINDINGS

The Board, having considered the evidence presented, finds that:

(a) S/Sgt. De Vito was Killed in Action on 25 October 1944 (Exhibit B, OQMG Form 371).

(b) Statements by members of his unit indicate that S/Sgt. De Vito was killed on Hill "38" as the result of a direct hit by a mortar shell (Ex. C, Report of Investigation dated 25 November 1944, and Exhibits D, E, and F, Affidavits).

(c) Hill "38" (not shown on maps available to this Headquarters) is believed to be Hill "Casa Torre dell'Eredi" (Map Reference L 91-31, Sheet 11, Road Map of Italy 1:200,000) which is approximately 380 meters above sea level and may have been referred to as Hill "38".

(d) An LRS/MZ searching team, sent to recover the remains of S/Sgt. De Vito, recovered the remains of "BTB" S/Sgt. De Vito from an isolated grave at the above-listed coordinates (Ex. G, Investigation of "BTB" S/Sgt. De Vito dated 6 May 1946).

(e) The remains of "BTB" S/Sgt. De Vito, reburied in Plot 2-J, Row 87, Grave 4788, USMC Castelfiorentino, may be those of S/Sgt. De Vito, as evidenced in the following findings:

(1) S/Sgt. De Vito is the only unrecovered American casualty recorded at this Headquarters as having been killed in the immediate vicinity of coordinates L 91-31. S/Sgt. De Vito appears to be the only unrecovered casualty from the unit which captured and occupied Hill "38", according to statement in Exhibit D, while Exhibit G indicates that no remains other than those in Grave 4788 were recovered from coordinates L 91-31.

(2) As the result of a direct hit from an enemy mortar shell, S/Sgt. De Vito's remains were severely mangled, especially the

upper portions of his anatomy. Most of the upper part of the skeletal structure of "BTB" S/Sgt. De Vito is missing, with the remaining bones containing imbedded fragments of metal, bearing conclusive evidence that "BTB" S/Sgt. De Vito had been near the center of explosion of a mortar or artillery shell.

(3) The date of death of "BTB" S/Sgt. De Vito was estimated to be 25 October 1944, identical to the actual date of death of the subject deceased (Exhibit H, Report of Reburial; and Exhibit I, CIP Report dated 2 November 1948).

(f) While the almost complete absence of identification data precludes the possibility of a detailed comparison of identification characteristics, the date of death, place of death, circumstances of death, and condition of the remains furnish strong evidence that the remains in Grave 4788 are actually those of S/Sgt. De Vito.

(g) A check of identification data pertaining to the subject deceased with those of all unidentified American remains recovered from Northern Italy failed to effect favorable association.

RECOMMENDATIONS

In view of the findings the Board recommends that records of this and Higher Headquarters be amended to indicate the identity of the remains reburied in Plot 2-J, Row 87, Grave 4788, USMC Castelfiorentino, Italy, as "Believed to Be" S/Sgt. De Vito (Unknown American #59821), to be that of S/Sgt. Frank D. De Vito, 32389335, in accordance with provisions of Letter, The Adjutant General's Office, file AGAO-S 293.9 (27 Mar 47) D-M, subject: Establishment of Boards of Review for Identification of Unknown Dead Overseas, dated 9 April 1947.








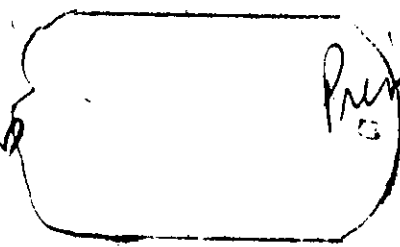
