Cemetery Hamm Plot GG, Row 6, Grave 148

UNIDENTIFIABLE

Unknown X-538 was recovered from an isolated grave near Dausfeld (Ger 6/L-08), Germany in March 1945. The remains were later identified as the decedent Pfc Milton J. Piner, 36656498 and returned to the United States (May 1950) for permanent interment.

Recently (1954) search and recovery operations in the Dausfeld area resulted in the recovery of two sets of identification tags of Pfc Piner found with virtually a complete skeletal remains. This remains was designated Unknown X-9220 Griesheim/Main Mausoleum.

Processing of Unknown X-9220 irrefutably established the identity of the remains as those of Pfc Piner. Remains were consequently returned to the United States in replacement of remains originally identified as the decedent which upon completion of the transposition were assigned Unknown X-45 (OQMG) and returned to area for disposition.

Upon receipt of remains by Graves Registration USAREUR, Unknown X-45 a skeletal and dental chart were preapred and remains given original designation, Unknown X-538 USMC Hamm, Luxembourg.

A review of recorded dental and physical characteristics pertaining to unresolved casualties reportedly lost in the area of Dausfeld, Germany compared against like data of X-538 was negative. Similarly the Office of The Quartermaster General indicated in a letter, file QMGMT 293, Unknown X-538 Hamm, Luxembourg; subject: Disposition of Remains, dated 22 July 1955, that their office had been unable to effect an association for the remains originally identified as Pfc Piner.

It is therefore recommended that remains now designated Unknown X-538 be considered unidentifiable.

2. A review of the anthropological report (NYFE) for Unknown K-9220, Griesheim/Hain, Hausoleum, dated 2 Doc 54, reveals that Dr. H. L. Shapiro agrees in the main with the findings of Dr. E. Breitinger, Professor of Anthropology, University of Frankfurt, Germany, with minor exceptions.

- 3. With reference to the concluding statement by Dr. Shapiro that he would regard the identification more certain if investigation of hip weakness and musical skill of Pfc Piner proved favorable, additional information obtained reveals that Pfc Piner had Army Speciality Rating as Bandsman, playing both the saxaphone and clarinet (subject was a member of the AAF Band from 5 June 1943 to 23 May 1944). Although there is no specific reference in the medical records of Pfc Piner concerning the hip weakness as described in full by Dr. Shapiro and also discovered in the examination of X-9220 by Dr. Breitinger, there are medical records for Pfc Piner indicating treatment for (1) "Myositis of the left thigh muscles (27 May 43), cause unknown", (2) "Sacroiliac strap to sprain" (26 Oct 44), "Pain in the left heel strap heel and heel pad" (29 Dec 44), and "Right and left heel painful question of wearing into the situation" (17 Jan 45). It is the consensus that the treatments as described herein may be compatible with the peculiarly shallow acetabulum of the left hip joint of Unknown X-9220. According to Dr. Shapiro, this condition may have possibly affected the stability of the joint during life. (Exhibits "Y" & "Z")

- 5. On 6 March 1946, the 6890 QM GR Company recovered the remains of Unknowns X-537 and X-538 from isolated graves at grid coord: WL 0881, Namur-Luxembourg Map #6, near Dausfeld, Germany. The remains were brought to USMC Hamm, Luxembourg for reburial on 12 March 1946. On 28 April 1949, Corrected ROI with confirmatory Board Findings were received for Unk. X-538, identified as Pfc Godfrey L. Bardwell, 34 981 635. On 15 July 1949, this Office advised the Field by letter that subject identification as Bardwell was not acceptable because the partial tooth chart and physical characteristics were more favorable with like data for Pfc Milton J. PINER. In view of the foregoing, Corrected ROI's with confirmatory Board Findings were submitted by the Field, dated 24 August 1949, re-identifying subject Unknowns as follows: X-537 as BARDWELL and X-538 as PINER. The identifications as re-established were approved by Identification Branch on 21 December 1949.
- 6. On 2 July 1954, remains designated Unknown X-9217, Griesheim/Main, Maus., were recovered as SR #560 from a row of German deceased in the Honor Cemetery at the north exit of Dausfeld, Germany, MS Germany #6, L-08. The remains were originally found by the German War Graves Commission during disinterring operations of a mass grave in Dausfeld for the purpose of reburying the German deceased in the Military Cemetery at Gondelsheim (Ger #6, L-18) Germany. The GWC notified the QM Mort Svc Det at Frankfurt by cable and requested dispatch of a team-for examination and recovery of subject remains. The remains were recovered with two (2) ID tags for "Fred W. Phillippe 36 897 124", one (1) ID bracelet "Fred W. Phillippe", and one billfold inscribed "Fred W.Phillippe" containing various cards and papers for subject EM. Corrected ROI with confirmatory Board Findings were received from the Field on 27 July 1954. The identification of X-9217 as Pfc Fred W. Phillippe, 36 897 124 was established by means of ID tags, PE's, favorable dental and physical characteristics, shoe size, area of recovery and associated recoveries. The identification was approved by Identification Branch on 6 August 1954.
- 7. In view of the recent recovery of remains identified as Pfc PHILLIPPE, who was a member of Co "I", 22nd Inf Regt., it was deemed advisable by the Field to conduct a reinvestigation at Dausfeld in an effort to recover three (3) other unresolved casualties of Company "I", namely, BUPF, SEGER and OSMUN, as well as one (1) unresolved casualty from Co "L", 22nd Inf, Pfc John R. HALEY, 38 694 852, KIA 28 February 1945 near Buchet, Germany.

On 16 July 195h, a team was dispatched from Frankfurt/Main to conduct an investigation in the area of Dausfeld. Interrogation of local inhabitants and investigation of a reported grave of US casualties remains. The grave site was described as: the southern end of the trench system at Dausfeld and located approx 50 meters north of road junction on the northern edge of Dausfeld (Ger #6, L-08), Germany. Identification tags were found around the necks of the remains reading:

Personal Effects, numerous pieces of AGF clothing and equipment were found with the remains. These recoveries were assigned S&R #561 and 562 and evacuated to Frankfurt/Main, Griesheim for processing and final identification. Subject remains were subsequently designated Unknowns X-9219 (SR #561) and X-9220 (SR#562), Griesheim/Main, Mausoleum.

- 8. On 2 August 1951, Corrected ROI with confirmatory Board Findings were received by TL #6524, for Unknown X-9219, identified by the Field as Sgt Charles E. OSMUN, 109 169, through ID tags, dental and physical characteristics, clothing, equipment, area and associated recoveries. The identification was approved by Identification Branch on 18 August 1954.
- 9. As set forth in the preceding paragraphs, eight (8) of the ten (10) men listed as MIA on the Morning Report for Company "I", 22nd Inf Regt, 28 Feb 45, have been identified, leaving only two (2) casualties to be accounted for, namely, Pfc BUPP and Pfc SEGER. In addition thereto, one (1) casualty from Company "L", Pfc HALEY is also unresolved.
- 10. During the course of investigation conducted by this Office, it was found that the physical and dental characteristics of the three (3) unresolved casualties mentioned herein compared negatively with the limited dental and physical characteristics for the remains now buried as PINER. (Exhibits "C", "D", "E") In order to effect an over-all elimination and/or association, the physical and dental records, recently obtained from the AG 201 files for the four (1) tag identifications, were compared with like data for the remains now designated PINER. It was found that a favorable comparison exists between the remains now buried as PINER and T/Sgt Howard R. WILLSON, 19 096 295 (presently interred in Golden Gate Nat'1 Cemetery) and is not contradictory with like data for Pfc Orvis D. SENEAR, 37 594 638 (interred in Fort Snelling Nat'1 Cemetery) and Sgt. Wilburn Lewis, 34 495 168 (interred in Mount Vernon Cemetery, Unionville, Tennessee). (Exhibits "F", "G", "H")
- ll. After weighing the limited identifying data (only a partial TC & est ht available) recorded for the remains now buried as PINER, with full realization of the repercussion that could develop in a case of this nature, it is not considered wise to arrive at a positive determination until the remains now buried as Pfc Milton J. PINER are thoroughly processed by an accredited anthropologist.

The differences between the recorded data for the three men mentioned above are not large except in instances mentioned below. Thus the value of these data are somewhat diminished. For example, allowing for possible error the estimated stature for these remains might fit any one of the three possibilities. Similarly the dental information proved to be of only corroborative rather than of critical significance.

Weighing all the available information I am inclined to identify these remains as those of Senear for the following reasons.







- d. In December of 1949 these remains were disinterred and examined by Graves Registration Personnel. One of the remains, designated X-538, was identified as Piner.

- 3. In July 1954 activities of the German War Graves Commission indicated additional recoveries of American Personnel might be possible in the Dausfeld area. The soldier was identified as a former member of Company "I" who was also among those killed on 28 February 1945).

Asmun, 42109169, the other read Milton J. Piner. 36656498. These remains were then designated X-9219 and X-9220 respectively. Personal Effects, numerous pieces of clothing and equipment were also found with these remains.
- 5. On 2 August 1954 the remains designated X-9219 were identified by the field as Sergeant Charles E. Asmun. The identification was based on ID tags, very favorable dental and physical characteristics, clothing, equipment, and personal effects. This action was subsequently approved by Memorial Division, Office of The Quartermaster General on 18 August 1954, and during this same month the remains were released for final interment in the USMC Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium in accordance with the wishes of the Next of Kin.








