The Screening Section, Identification Branch, Memorial Division, OQMG, has conducted an investigation to determine whether the subject Unknown remains could be considered as a candidate for selection as the World War II Unknown.</p> <p>2. The following information is the basis for the recommendation of "Eligible" or "Non-Eligible":</p> <p>a. On 13 May 1943 a group of Alaskan natives arrived at Ft Morrow, Heiden, Alaska bearing a partial human skeleton and an "inflated type life-raft". The remains and raft were surrendered to American Forces who made a complete report. (See report dated 17 May 1943 to Asst Chief of Staff, ADC, U. S. Army, in Unknown 293 File). 1st Lt John C. Slaughter, Jr., O 435 730, MC, 1st Bn, 53rd Inf determined that the remains were those of a male individual who had been dead 1 year or less.</p> <p>b. The remains were found four miles south of Ilnik and the raft was found 10 miles southwest of Ft Morrow. The distance between the remains and the raft was approximately 14 miles; therefore any association between the remains and the raft is questionable.</p> <p>c. On 17 May 1943, the Unknown remains were designated Unknown X-1 and interred in Plot 1, Row 1, Grave 3, Fort Morrow Alaska Post Cemetery No. 1. On 17 October 1945, the remains were removed and reinterred in Plot 20, Row 5, Grave 129, Fort Richardson Post Cemetery. On 14 August 1948 the remains were again moved and reinterred in Row AA, Grave 16, Sitka National Cemetery.</p> <p>d. In July 1950 a laboratory specialist was sent from OQMG to the Sitka National Cemetery for the purpose of disinterring and processing this Unknown to determine and record all physical and dental data which could be an aid to identification. Processing showed that the remains are very incomplete consisting only of ribs, vertebrae and the anatomical parts of the pelvic region. No dental features were present nor could an estimate of height, age, weight, or race be made.</p> <p>3. This remains falls in an Unidentifiable category as required of candidates for selection of the World War II Unknown; however, the remains are not sufficiently complete, to consider as a candidate for the World War II Unknown since large portions of major anatomical parts are missing. To insure that all candidates for selection as the World War II Unknown actually represent all of the recoverable remains of an Unknown American it has been determined that the remains should be as complete as possible with at least portions of every major anatomical part represented.</p> <p>4. In view of the above, it is recommended that Unknown X-1, Ft Richardson not be considered as a candidate for the World War II Unknown.</p>

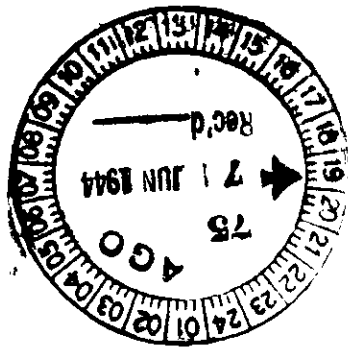

Report of.

TO : Assistant Chief of Staff, ADC, U.S. Army.

1. 13 May, Nick Christensen and twenty-four other natives arrived this station in fishing boats, bringing with them a skeleton and inflated-type life-raft.

2. An unnamed native recently gave skeleton and raft (picture inclosed) to Nick Christensen, stating that both were discovered 25 April 1943, the skeleton four miles South of Illnik and the Life-raft 10 miles South-West of this station (APO 949).

3. Skeleton was interred this date, this station, with appropriate ceremonies. 1st Lt. John C. Slaughter, Jr. O-435730, MC, 1st Bn., 53rd Inf., estimates the following in regards to skeleton:

Sex: Male
Dead: 1 year or less (tissue still on cartilage)
Complete: No - only pelvis, ribs and backbone

4. Information on inflated-type life-raft:

It was torn when discovered, was not inflated. There was no identifying number, It was blue on the inside and yellow on the outside. Measured across the bottom (blue part) it was 52" wide and 102" long. Attention is directed to two red stains which may be blood. Pencil marks around same were added by this office. Printed instruction plaque on raft, 3½" by 8", was set up exactly as follows: (see attached)

5. Life-raft was forwarded this date to AC of S, G-2, ADC, with copy of this letter inclosed.

6. Nick Christensen states that the aforementioned unnamed native also discovered two old, torn life preservers near the life-raft, same date, and they were left there on the beach. (25 April 1943, 10 miles North of Illnik)

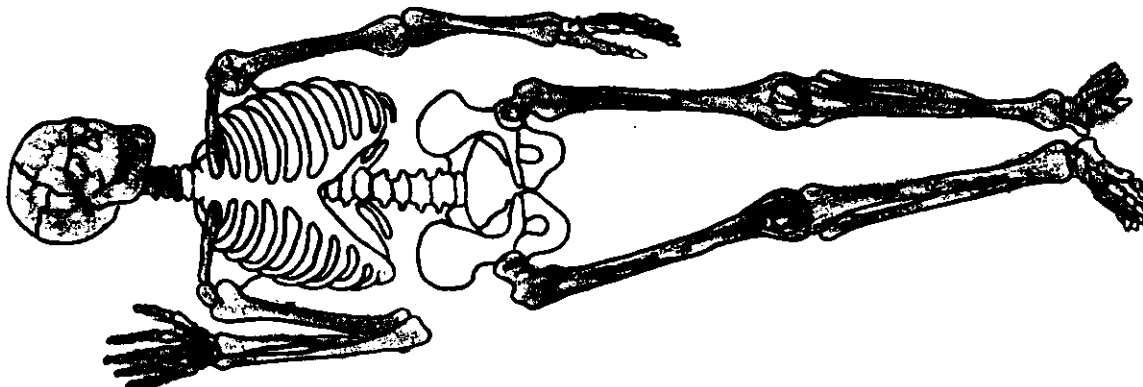
