SUBJECT: HAYES, John W., 38691665

DISCUSSION:

1. The decedent was killed instantly by shrapnel from an enemy tank shell, 4 January 1945. His remains were previously identified by the field as being interred in U. S. Military Cemetery, Fosse, Belgium, Plot 1, Row 8, Grave 149, and later redesignated Unknown X-134, authority, CGMG letter dated 13 October 1949 (Tab A).

2. Letter dated 2 March 1945 to the NOK from Major General Bolling (Tab B), states that Pfc Hayes' remains were interred in an American Military Cemetery in Belgium with a cross above his grave permanently marked with his name and serial number.

3. A thorough search of records in Identification Branch for burial information that may be associated with Pfc Hayes, other than X-134, met with negative results.

4. In view of the above a reinvestigation of Unknown X-134, Fosse, for possible identification, has been accomplished with the following results:

a. Burial Report shows the estimated height of the remains as 5'7-5/8" and wearing combat boots, size 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ -C. Army records reveal Pfc Hayes was 5'9" in height and wore shoe size 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ -D.

b. The remains were recovered with a pistol holster marked, "Norman Williams 34836689". Survivors who have been contacted state PFC Hayes was issued a holster and two survivors indicate that there is a possibility that Hayes may have had possession of Williams' holster (Tabs C and D).

c. The circumstances surrounding the death of Pfc Hayes and the condition of his remains after death are very similar to the cause of death and the condition of the remains designated Unknown X-134 (Survivor's statement Tab E).

RECOMMENDATION:

That an Officer of the Division visit the NOK to apprise them of the circumstantial nature of the evidence in this case.
