1. The records show that 2nd Lieut. Gene F. Walker, O1 018 340, was reported missing in action in Germany, 24 November 1944. A later report showed that he departed from Eschweiler, Germany, 24 November 1944 on a mission to Hucheln, Germany. Lieutenant Walker's tank was hit by anti-tank fire and burned up. One body was found in the tank. It was impossible to determine whether the body was that of Lieutenant Walker or Private First Class Veronie, however, 11th Indorsement dated 26 December 1945 indicates that Private First Class Veronie was returned to military control. Subsequently, a report was received which showed that Lieutenant Walker was killed in action 24 November 1944 in Germany.

2. The records further show that Basil M. Cook, 35 777 225, was reported missing in action 25 November 1944 in Germany. Subsequently, a report was received which showed that he was killed in action 25 November 1944 in the vicinity of Breinig, Germany.

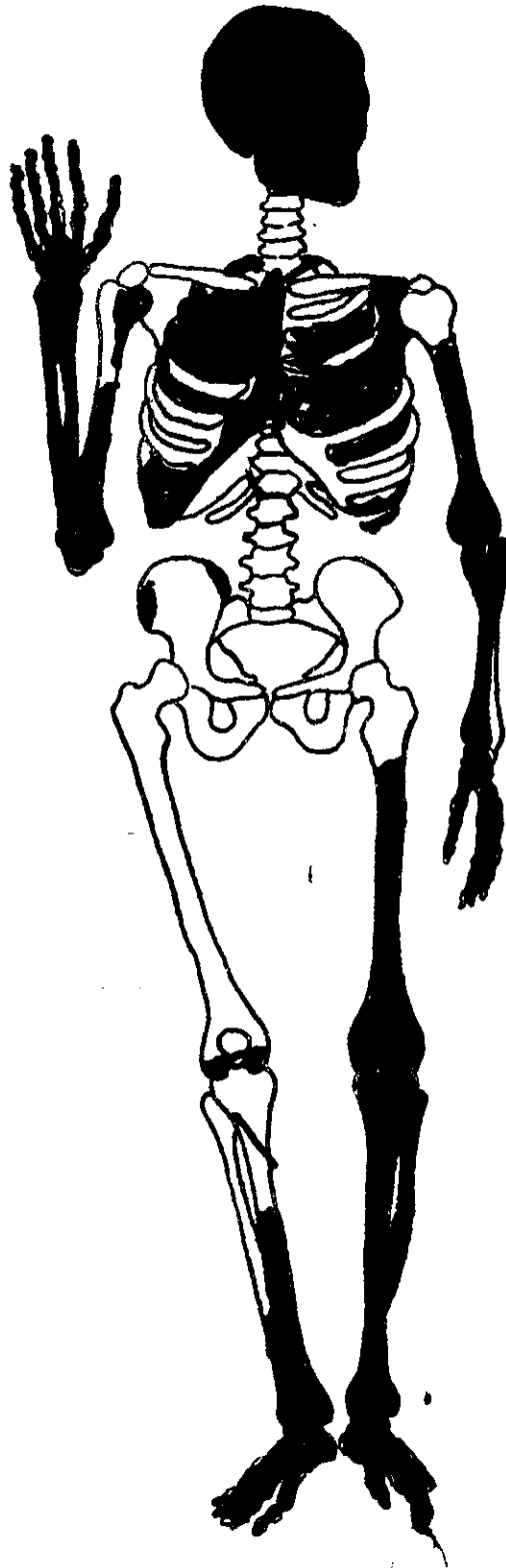
