4. Other cases of identifying unknown bodies at a later date, after being reported, have proved to be especially difficult. It was the understanding of this headquarters that a duplicate copy of the identification report, listed in paragraph 12 B, section II, Circular 22, Hq First Army, 18 Feb 1945, would be returned to the reporting unit. As yet, this company has never received a copy, after the "X" number has been given to a body. Such a procedure of sending one of the copies back would be a great help in following up a case.

3. At this time, no collecting team was with the 30th Division, although the one 3rd Armored Collecting Point had accepted a number of bodies evacuated to them by this unit. No members of the collecting point recall the exact date that the body was evacuated to the cemetery and do not remember promising a statement of identity at a later day. Indications were that no way could be found that would make it possible to identify the body, which was buried beyond all recognition.

2. While operating in the vicinity of Spa, Belgium, 25 December 1944, a burned body was brought to the 3rd Armored Collecting Point by members of the 30th Division. This particular case was unknown, and the only information given to collecting point personnel was the fact that the body had been picked up along the side of the road while the Division was moving through that area. No coordinates could be given of the location where the body was found, so the name of the driver evacuating the remains to the point was taken. This man stated that the body was not near any vehicle or airplane, and that he would bring back more information as to the approximate place where the body had been found, when he returned the next day. The driver never returned. The body was believed to have been evacuated, along with the name of the driver from the 30th Division within the next few days, which would make it near the 29th of December 1944.

1. In the preceding endorsement forwarded by this headquarters, there was no available information on X-283, after checking all terms of collecting points. A recent investigation and a report by one of the medical sergeants of this organization, who was in the hospital at the time of the first report, may throw some light on the case, although very little information is available.

1. Attention invited to basic communication and preceding indorsement.
2. Subject deceased was evacuated to cemetery on 29 December 1944 and remained unburied at cemetery until 5 January 1945 waiting for statement of identity which was to be forwarded by the 603rd QM Graves Registration Company but was not received.
3. The manner in which subject unknown was handled at collecting point is not considered satisfactory in that place of death of deceased was not obtained, the name of person evacuating remains to collecting point was not obtained and manner and circumstances whereby deceased was killed was not obtained. Deceased died of 3rd degree burns which would indicate that deceased was probably killed in a vehicle or plane, however no information was obtained at collecting point to indicate this to be a fact. The commanding officer of the 603rd QM Graves Registration Company has already been advised by this office that steps must be taken to increase operating efficiency. It is felt advisable, however, to bring this case to your attention to show the laxness in which subject unit is operating. It is desired that steps be taken through your office to bring this unit up to the standard required by this headquarters.

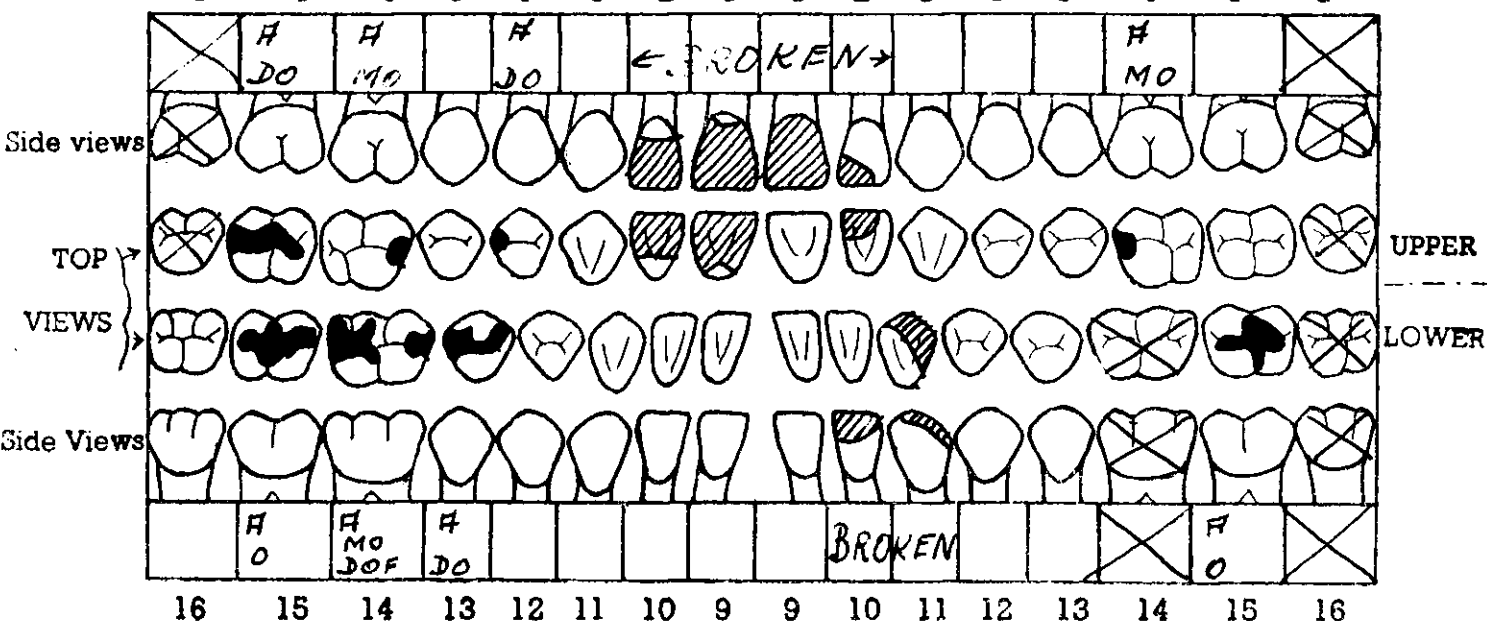

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions : Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 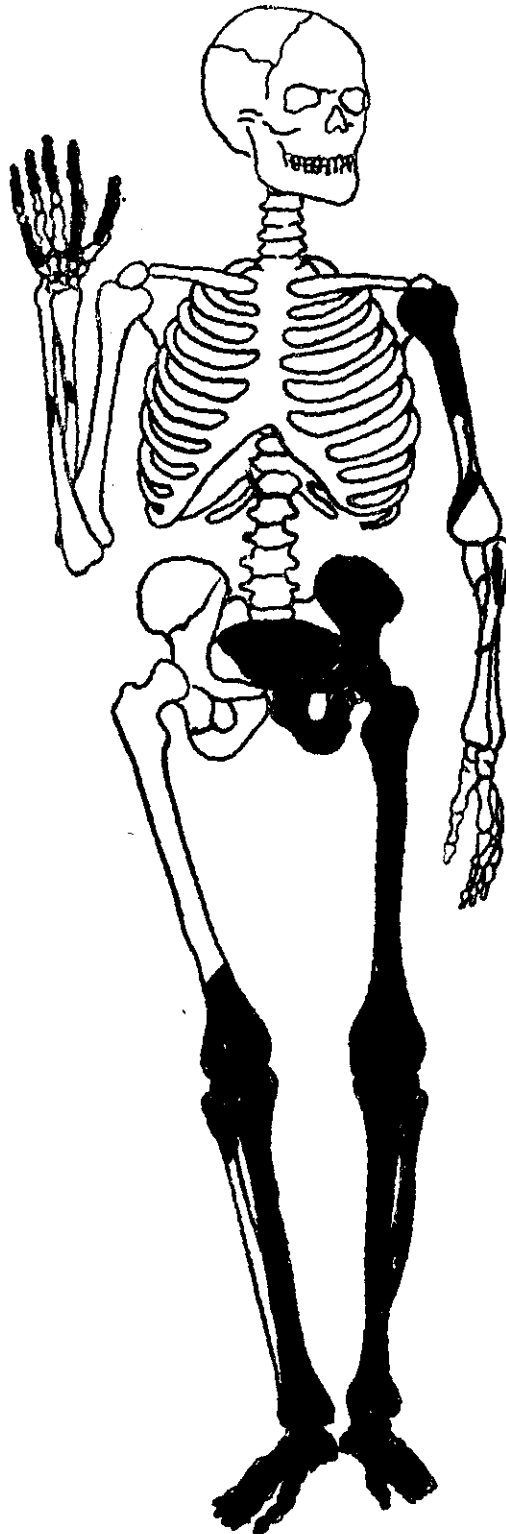

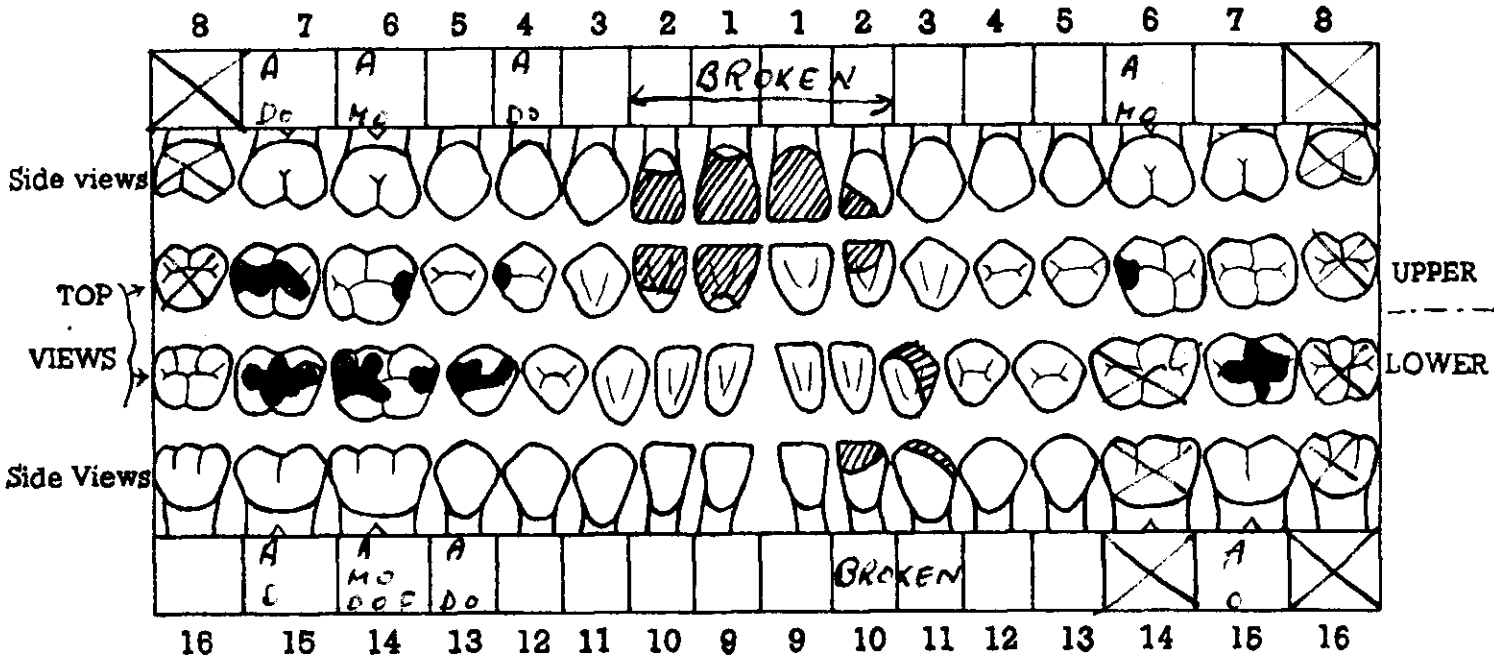

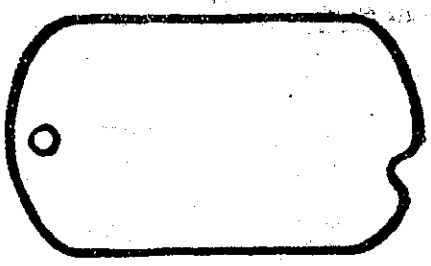
