#### Narrative Report for the 2nd of March 1945:

At 1430, 2 March 1945, Task Force "X" began moving to cross the canal via WIDDENDORF - HEPPENDORF - SINDORF - RJ 248582 - ICHENDORF and assembly area at 263615. As planned, Task Force "Y" would clear OBERAUSSEM; but enroute to the ascembly area orders were received by radio from the Commanding General, Combat Command "A", to attack the town along with Task Force "Y", using the BUSDORF road as a boundary. Battle Group ORR was first to move across the canal and was given the task of attacking the town. Company "A" dismounted at the assembly area and moved along the road by the FORTUNA factory area and began to meet resistance North of the factory at 262636. Approximately 100 enemy enfantry were observed here and were taken under fire. attack from this direction seemed to completely surprise the enemy. Several enemy soldiers were killed, 17 prisoners taken, and another group began retreating to the Northeast. Artillery was put on the retreating enemy, and Company "A" moved on into town, followed by Company "E", 32nd Armored Regiment. One platoon from Company "E" was brought up and moved into position east of the slag pile at 265637 for protection of the right flank. Resistance in the town was alight and was cleared by 1900. 29 prisoners of war were taken during the day. Elements of the 104th Division moved into town during the night to relieve our troops of the defenses to continue the attack.

#### NARRATIVE OF EVENTS:

2 March 1st Bn, 33d Armd Regt crossed river in 3 battle groups to hold 3 areas just across the ERFT CANAL from GLESCH. One group moved toWEIDENFELD to protect Division left flank. Location at 1730---Co "I" 203651, Co "A" 208647, Co "F" 213644, mortar and assault guns 215641. Tank strength: A-16, F-15, I-15, Hq-3.

2nd Bn 33d Armd Regt remained in place. Tank Strength: B-16, D-11, E-15, Hq-2. Supported by air bombardment "H" Co of 3rd Bn took VIEDENFELD (P-2166) at 1400 after being temporarily held up at P-2165 by morter, arty and SP fire. No casualties. After TOT on AUENHEIM (P-2466) Co "H" plus infantry seized this objective at 1925.

#### SUMMARY OF OPERATIONS

2 March 1945: Time of attack of the 83d Armd Rcn Bn was changed to 0300 and at that time they began the attack to secure a line of departure for the attack of TF Richardson which was to be launched at 0700. The 83d Armd Rcn Bn advanced steadily in two columns and by 0500 the right column had reached a line running from 244645 to 247644 and at 0536 the left column had reached a line extending from 239652 to 243 650.

At 0700 TF Richardson passed through the 83d Armd Ren Bn and the83d reverted to Division control.

TF R advanced in two columns. Enemy resistance was very stubborn and at this time consisted of artillery, mortar, tank, anti-tank and small arms fire. Thie type of resistance was met throughout the morning, but by excellent performance in the use of our superior fire power and maneuver, two companies of infantry and five medium tanks had succeeded in entering Niederaussem by

Summary of Operations (Continued)

1100. The enemy continued to resist in the town, but by 1600 the main part of the town was cleared and at 1740 CO TF R reported that he was in position to button up for the night. Only the extreme north-eastern edge of the town remained in enemy hands.

Task Force Hogan attacked on the left of Task Force Richardson at 0700 from a line of departure in the vicinity of 203652. Likewise, their opposition was heavy and consisted initially of heavy small arms and mortar fire. The advance of the armor was delayed by an AT ditch at 206657. Ron and work produced a crossing and the tanks moved in behind the infantry. On attempting to push the attack to Wiedenfeld, the tanks and enfantry met anti-tank fire from the vicinity. By noon TF H was stopped by the resistance and it was 1400 before the town was entered.

The town was cleared of the enemy, a mine field was removed, and at 1600 orders were issued to TF H to continue the attack from Wiedenfeld to Auenheim. Enemy fire was heavy from the left flank and for that reason TF Hogan's attack was diverted to the southeast. The order directed that the CC reserve would secure Viedenfeld, but was later changed, as CG, 3d AD, ordered CC B to send a force there for that purpose.

By 2000, Auenheim was secured and TF H buttonedup there for the night. At the close of the period, clements TF H left at Wiedenfeld were being relieved by TF Welborn of CC B.

The 1st Bn. 36th Armd Inf Regt, as a part of TF Doan of CC A, crossed the Erft Canal at B reheim and attacked Oberaussem. The attack continued throughout the day against moderate resistance and by the close of the period the town was secured. The 2d Bn. 36th Armd Inf Regt, as a part of TF Welborn of CC B, followed TF Hogan and relieved elements of TF Hogan in Wiedenfeld.

#### SUMMARY OF OPERATIONS:

2 MAR 45 The 1st Plat "A" Co. moved out with TF KANE from DESDORF to attack OBERHAUSSEM and by 1600A hours had taken up positions vic of F258645. The 3rd Plat "A" crossed to the east bank of the ERFT CANAL, by bridge at F260590, to attack with TF DOAM the town of OBERHAUSSEM, at 1615A hours. At 1900A hours the 3rd Plat took up positions in vic of F261641. "A" Co CP with the 2nd Plat moved from BERRENDORF to F2392617 vic KENTEN.

"B" Co -- No change.

"C" Co CP moved from vici of BERRENDORF, east of the ERFT CANAL to F229630 vic BERGHEIM. The let Plat, attacking with TF YEOMANS at 020300 hours to extend the bridgehead east of the Canal, reached positions at F233651 vic HALTROP by 0500 hours. 2nd Plat attacking with TF RICHARD-SON was to pass through the line held by TF YEOMANS. On reaching positions in woods F238642, three TD's bogged down in the soft terrain. The fourth TD was hit by enemy artillery fire, resulting in an oil leak in the engine. This TD returned to BERCHEIM, was repaired, and enroute to action in the vicinity of NIEDFRAUSSEM F2566, when itfell into a damaged portion of a bridge. The weight of the TD was partly supported by the gun tube. This forced the 90mm gun into a recoiled position, Which pinned the Car Commander, Sgt Ramsden, between the operation handle and the turret ring. It was necessary to dismantle the breech mechanism, in order to remove the man, as enemy AT fire would not allow the removal of the vehicle. The 3rd Plat moved into attack with TF HOGAN. At 1800A hours, they had reached WIEDENFIELD F 2266. By the close of the period had taken up positions in vicinity of AUENGEIM F243668.

Ron Co (-3 Plats) located F172592, experienced enemy airractivity, an enemy bomb landed in the vicinity of their CP, injuring one (1) man.


