- 1. T-1813 was disinterred from the Military Cemetery at Geich, Germany, located at ccordinate K51/F 2234. The remains of T-1813 were reburied as Unknown X-519 in USMC Henry Chapelle, Belgium, Plot H-4, Row 6, Grave 118. No other American bodies were found in this isolated cemetery.
- 2. Information concerning T-1813, now X-519, was first reported by a United States Army Unit. The date of death was an estimated report of 23 February 1945.
- 3. Check List prepared at the time the body was removed from the isolated grave is not in complete agreement with CIP Check List of 16 January 1947. Information in agreement is that the subject Unknown had dark brown hair.
- 4. On the first mentioned Check List the clothing was described as burned. Third Degree burns and decomposition made accurate description of remains impossible. The fact that an escape map and khaki trousers were found on the remains suggested that the decedent was assigned to the Air Corps. The estimated date of death, 23 February 1945, indicates that if the decedent were khaki trousers, he were them under a winter flying suit.
- 5. The CIP Check List does not show khaki trousers and escape map and the body is described as burned. Articles of clothing and equipment include a Field Jacket and Shelter Half.

On the 1 July 1947 this investigation team proceeded to Geich, Germany, in an effort to establish the exact date of death of an unknown American deceased according to a basic communication of the A.G.R.C. from the 7 March 1947.

This investigator first contacted the former and the present town-official of the community of Geich. Neither was able to give any exact information since most of the town's people were evacuated at the time when the above mentioned Unknown became a casualty. However it was discovered that this Unknown was killed in the plane crash of a two-motored American airplane, about 600 yards from the outskirts of the towns Geich and Fussenich.

We went to the plane wreckage to obtain the serial number of the aircraft. Since no wings or tail of the plane could be found and all the manufactory-tags were already taken off, we obtained the serial numbers of four (4) 50 cal machine guns found with the wreckage. These numbers are as follows: 916919, 507419, 489011, 149550. There are also two motors still with the wreckage, both are partly charred.

We then interviewed Peter Pieck of Geich who was an eyewitness of the plane crash. He states as follows:

"On 23 February 1945 a two-motored American aircraft crashed near Geich. The plane crash was caused by "Flak" (German anti-aircraft). The crew consisted of six (6) men, which all lost their lives. Four (4) of these bodies could be recognized very well, but two (2) of them were mutilated and charred to unreconizability. 
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



- 1. T-1813 was disinterred from the Military Cemetery at Geich, Germany, located at coordinate K51/F 2234. The remains of T-1813 were reburied as Unknown X-519 in USMC Henry Chapelle, Belgium, Plot H-4, Row 6, Grave 118. No other American bodies were found in this isolated cemetery.
- 2. Information concerning T-1813, now X-519, was first reported by a United States Army Unit. The date of death was an estimated report of 23 February 1945.
- 3. Check list prepared at the time the body was removed from the isolated grave is not complete agreement with CIP Check List of 16 January 1947. Information in agreement is that the subject Unknown had dark brown hair.
- 4. On the first mentioned Gheck List the clothing was described as burned. Third Degree burns and decomposition made accurate description of remains impossible. The fact that an escape map and known trousers were found on the remains suggested that the decedent was assigned to the Air Corps. The estimated date of death, 23 February 1945, indicates that if the decedent were khaki trousers, he were than under a winter flying suit.
- 5. The CIP Check List does not show khaki trousers and escape map and the body is described as burned. Article of clothing and equipment include a Field Jacket and Shelter Half.


