1. Reference is made to Report of Burial, dated 17 April 1951, and the attached inclosures thereto, forwarded your Office by Transmittal Letter # 6275, dated 4 May 1951, for Unknown X-9003, AGRS Mausoleum, Liege, Belgium.

2. Remains designated X-9003 have been tentatively associated with 1/Lt Bertram L. CHAIET, O 886 099, attached to 21st Squadron, Royal Air Force, PDD 22 January 1945, for the reasons outlined below:

- a. Estimated date, place and cause of death in agreement.
- b. Height, weight and color of hair compare favorably with corresponding records for 1/Lt Chaiet.
- c. Tooth chart is not contradictory with available Army dental records for 1/Lt Chaiet.

3. Due to the lack of sufficient dental data which precludes positive identification, request your Office review the above findings and, if deemed advisable, the family of 1/Lt Chaiet be contacted for civilian dental information to substantiate the association cited.

4. Subject case will be held in suspense by this headquarters pending reply from your Office.

NARRATIVE OF DISINTERMENT

I. AUTHORITY:

Pursuant to instructions contained in Investigation Directive # 671, dated 14 March 1951, an investigation was conducted at TOQUEVILLE sur EU, Seine Inferieure, France, for the purpose of determining nationality of an Unknown deceased, reported by the RAF Liaison Officer F/Lt Masse as believed to be the remains of an American World War II deceased.

II. FINDINGS:

Arriving at Toqueville sur Eu, as prearranged, the undersigned met F/Lt Masse, two representatives of IWGC, Arras, France, and local French authorities at the graveside of subject unknown deceased. The grave had been opened, the remains removed from a wooden casket and laid out in anatomical position. From evidence found, American Airforce clothing, remnants of an electrical heating flying suit, Officers Green clothing, (elastic weave) and plastic buttons (American type), these remains are believed to be those of an American Airforce casualty, and have been evacuated as such as SR # 674. A Notice of Disinterment was left with the local French authorities and IWGC in Arras, France.

The Mayor of the above mentioned locality, stated that these were of the remains of an unknown deceased, cause of death believed to be by drowning, washed ashore on the beaches of Toqueville sur Eu, sometime in 1944, and buried by the Germans, the exact date is unknown.

III. RECOMMENDATION:

That these remains be processed by the CIL and an effort be made to associate these remains with an American Airforce casualty known to have been lost in English Channel area.

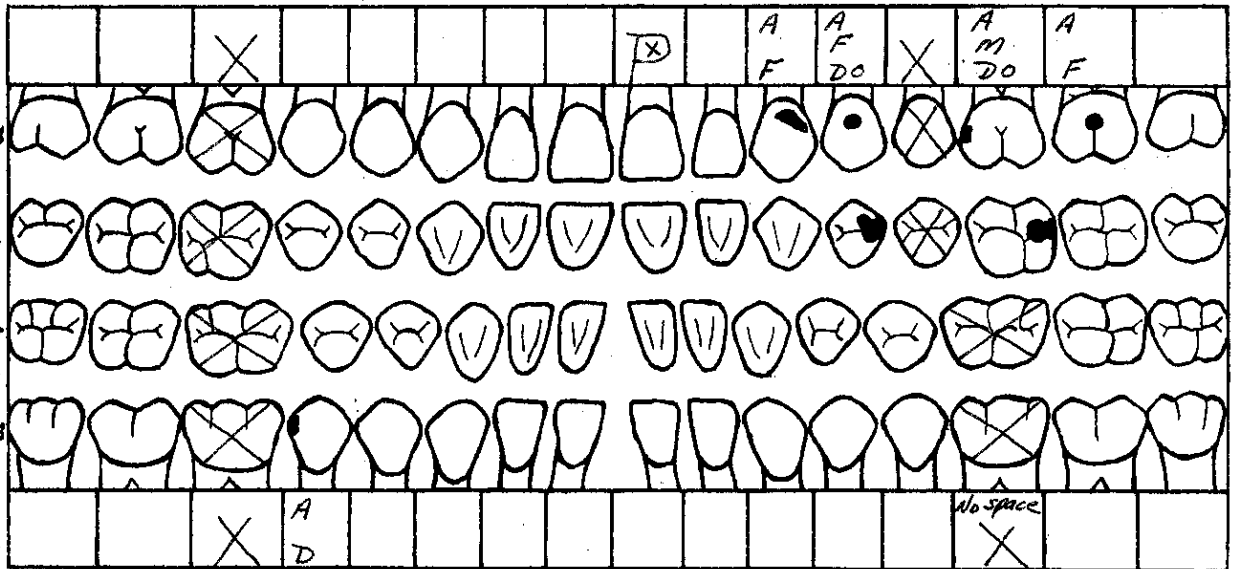

Teeth were recovered with the remains. There is favorable articulation between the skull and the mandible but articulation between the skull and the vertebral column is impossible due to the absence of major cervical vertebrae. Age estimation was based on skull, clavicles, pubic symphysis and epiphysial lines of long bones present. Height estimation was based on measurement of bones of the upper and lower extremities. All major bones are present.

CAUSE OF DEATH: Determination of cause of death is impossible as no visible injury is present.

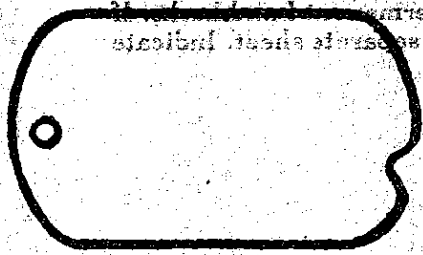
