Subject remains were previously found at a crash site in the woods near Buechelberg, Germany, as a result of an investigation to recover the remains of 1/Lt. Jack T. McWILLIAMS, O-710733.

L/Lt. Jack T. McWilliams, O-710733, was a casualty of A/C 44-20149 (P-47), which was reported to have crashed in the vicinity of Rastatt, Germany, 14 January 1944. Previous investigation at Rastatt and vicinity was made with negative results.

No records pertaining to the crash, where the remains of Unknown X-9016 were recovered, were available at the Burgermeister's office at Buechelberg, however, various inhabitants stated that the crash occurred in January 1945, thus necessitating closer investigation of the crash site since A/C 44-20149 crashed on 14 January 1945.

Anthropological processing of Unknown X-9016 reveal that subject remains cannot be associated with 2/Lt. McWilliams.

Investigation revealed that there is no record (this headquarters) of a crash of an American aircraft at Buechelberg, Germany, in January 1945.

In view of the foregoing the remains of Unknown X-9016 are submitted as UNIDENTIFIABLE.

NARRATIVE OF DISINTERMENT
AT BUECHELBERG, GERMANY
(K-50/R-34)

2 May 1951

In the course of an investigation conducted in connection with ID # 609, Case # 8609, dated 17 January 1951, the undersigned investigator discovered the crash site of a US plane in the woods near BUECHELBERG, Germany (K-50/R-34).

No records pertaining to this crash were available at the Burgermeister's office at BUECHELBERG, however, various inhabitants stated that the crash occurred in January 1945, thus necessitating closer investigation of the crash site since A/C 44-20149 (ID # 609) crashed on 14 January 1945.

Subsequent probing of the scene of crash revealed the presence of various remains including a maxilla with teeth as well as fragments of a skull. A comparison of the teeth with the tooth chart for WILLIAMS, JACK T., did not prove contradictory, though they did not correspond entirely.

The remains were assigned SR-280 and evacuated to the Wiesbaden morgue for subsequent processing at the CIL, Liege, Belgium.

A propeller blade was found. This blade was recovered as an aid leading to the possible identification of the type of plane. US Air Force Maintenance Section, Wiesbaden, upon scrutinizing said propeller blade, identified the plane as a B-26.

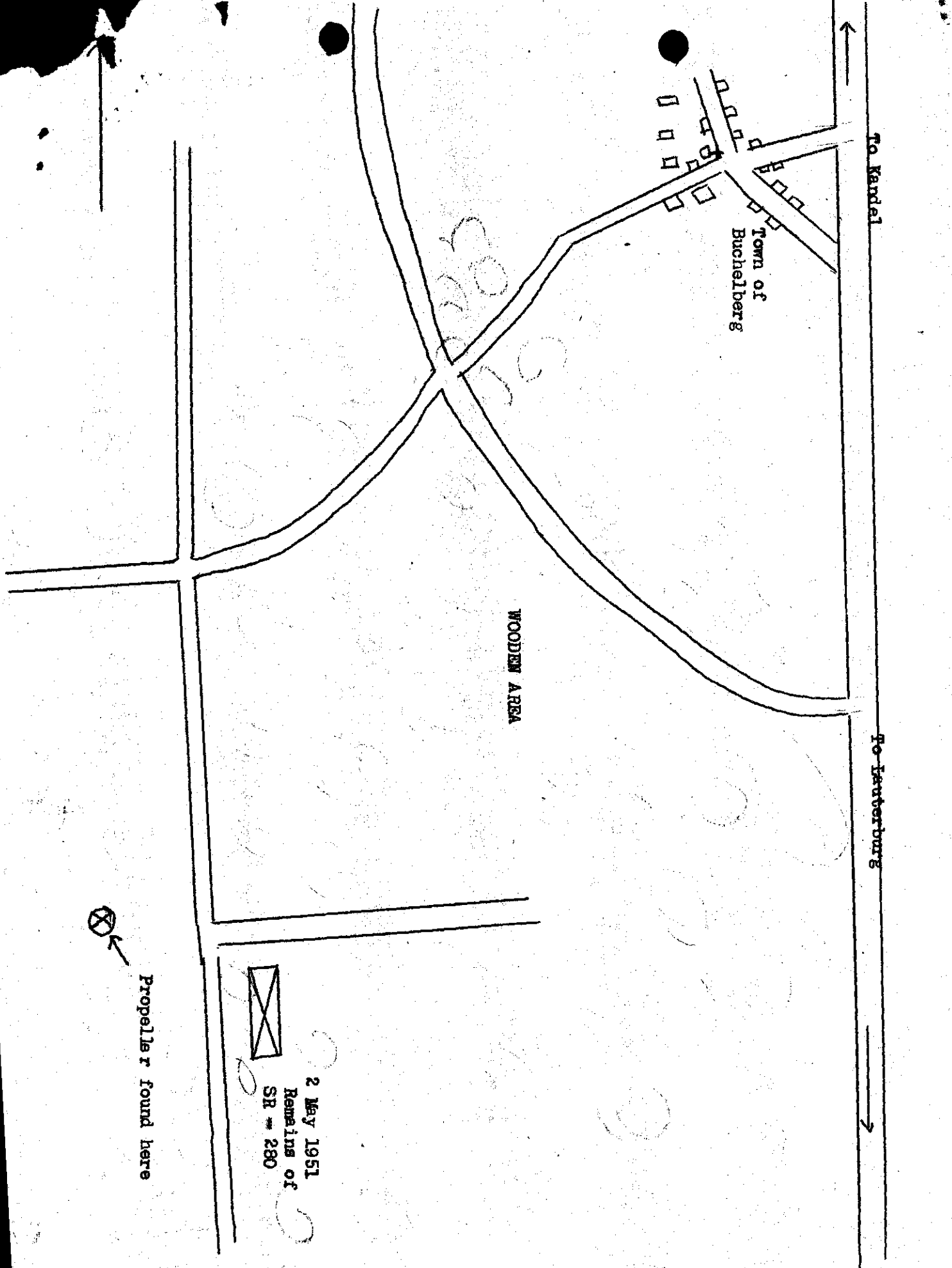



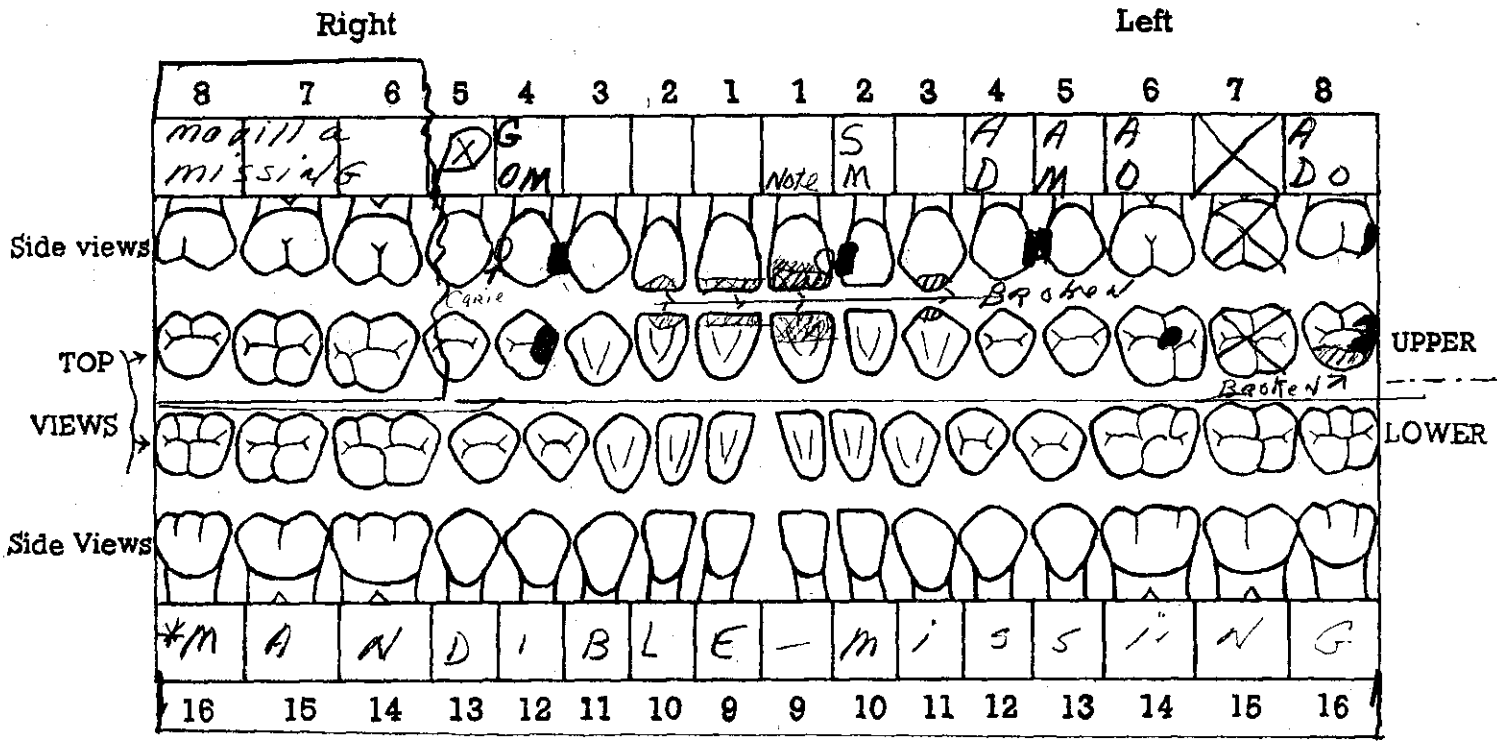

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. The remains of SR-280 was processed this date and assigned Unknown X-9016. Results are submitted below:

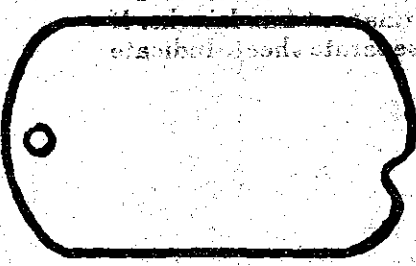
