CASE HISTORY

UNKNOWN X-9018

AGRS Mausoleum, Liege, Belgium

The remains of Unknown X-9018 AGRS Mausoleum, Liege, Belgium, were recovered above ground at Section 29, Hurtgen Forest Area, Vossenack, Germany.

No skull found. Remains consist of Mandible, vertebrae badly shattered portions of femur, pelvis, one rib and skeletal remains of hands and feet. Steel helmet and liner, (no markings), remnants of GI clothing and equipment (no markings), portions of a wallet and M-1-rifle bearing number D-28291-125A found contiguous to remains.

The only identifying clue to his remains is the mandible which is not contradictory to several casualties reported KIA in or vicinity of Hurtgen, Germany. There is no record of rifle serial numbers available at this headquarters.

Due to the lack of identifying data Unknown X-9018 is submitted as UNIDENTIFIABLE.

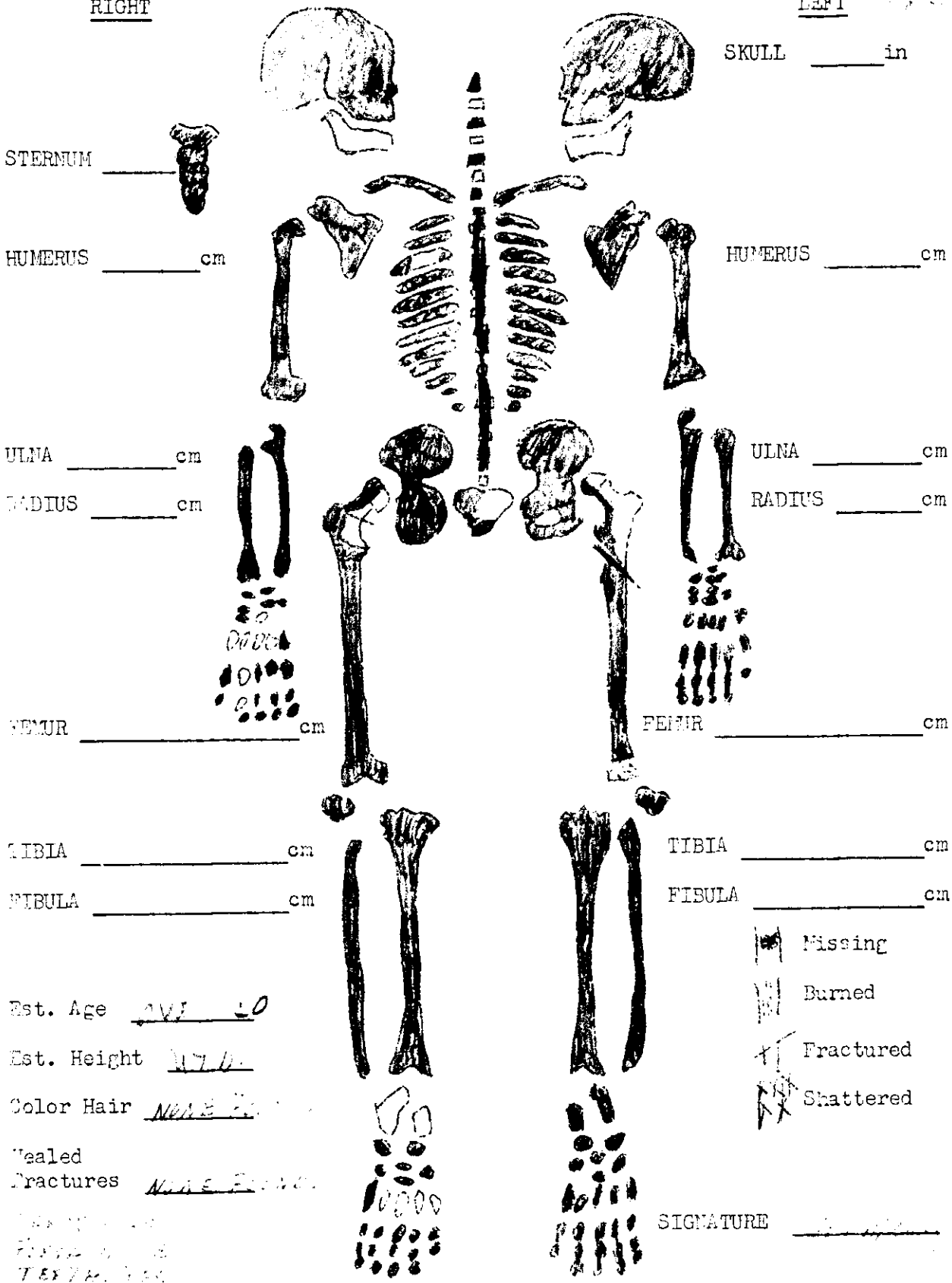

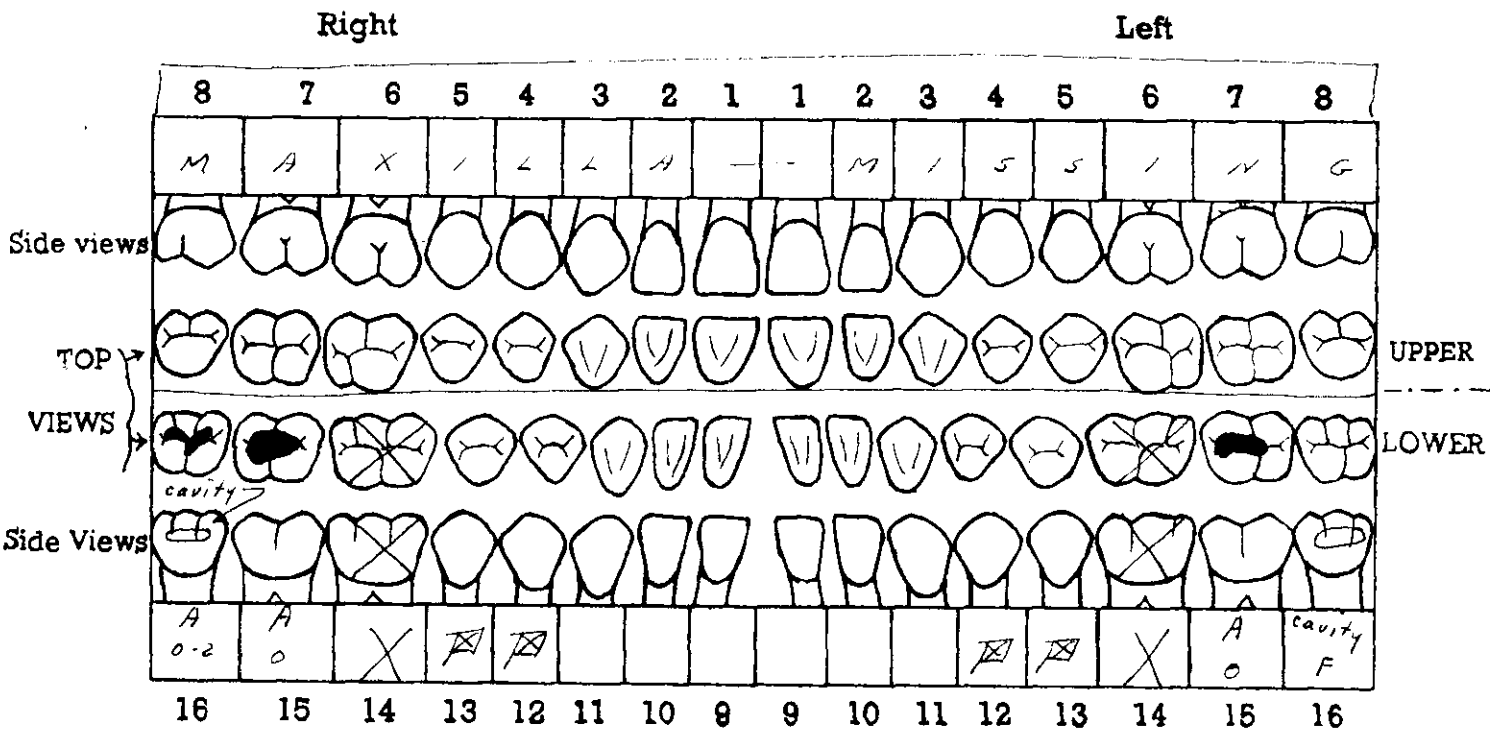

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. Remains received as SR-681 have been processed this date and assigned X-9018. Due to the mangled condition of the remains it is impossible to give a height estimation. Age is estimated over 20 based on closure of epiphysial lines of skeletal portions present. Remains are slightly burned. Remnants of clothing found were OD trousers; Wool OD sweater; Army issue overcoat; One pair of army issue arctic, size 10; Army issue raincoat; One army issue canteen cup and one rifle M-1 from Springfield Armory # 613519 and another number D-28291-125 A. The remains were received at the Civil Morgue wrapped in a mattress cover and metallic liner.
