1. Reference is made to corrected Report of Burial for Unknown X-1037 USMC Neuville-en-Condroz, dated 30 August 1950.
2. Unknown X-1037 was segregated from the remains now identified as S/Sgt Joseph G. KRALICH, 33 234 207, a crew member of A/C # 42-30013, and now interred POC.
3. Another crew casualty, 2/Lt Dale G. WENDTE, O 735 132 has been identified and returned to the U.S.
4. Recent search to locate the remains of the last two casualties, 2/Lt James H. HOUCK, O 734 691 and Sgt John M. WATKINS, 32 369, 909, has proven negative.
5. It is possible that X-1037 may represent partial remains of either 2/Lt Houck or Sgt Watkins, however there does not appear to be sufficient evidence to support definitely such a conclusion.
6. In view of the above and the fact that X-1037 contains no critical skeletal portions, it is requested that your Office review this case and consideration be given to the redesignation of X-1037 as a CIL remains.

WHEN ORDERED TO COME, THE CEMETERY CARETAKER, AUGUST LOHSE, 74 YEARS OLD, LIVING IN THIS TOWN, KIRCHHOFALLEE 14, STATES THE FOLLOWING: I HAD THE CRASHED FLYER WHO HAD PARACHUTED OUT OF THE BURNING PLANE, IN THE MORGUE. HE WAS BROUGHT TO ME BY THE MARINE. THE DECEASED SOLDIER STILL WORE PARTS OF A BURNT UNIFORM. HE WAS PUT INTO A CASKET IN THE MORGUE AND ALSO CLOSED IN. I SAW THAT ONLY THE BODY WAS PUT INTO THE CASKET. IT HAS NOT BEEN KNOWN TO ME THAT ALSO LIMBS (LEG) FROM ANOTHER PERSON SHOULD BE PUT INTO THE CASKET OR WERE PUT THERE. THE DECEASED FLYER WAS BROUGHT TO ME INTO THE MORGUE BY THE MARINE-HOSPITAL OF NEUSTADT.

WHEN THE MARINE HAD BURIED THE BODY, I WAS TOLD ONE OR TWO DAYS LATER BY MARINE-SOLDIERS, THEY HAD PUT ONE MORE LEG INTO THE CASKET OF THE BURIED SOLDIER. I DO NOT KNOW WHOSE LEG IT WAS.

If I remember right, the Navy was out with boats to rescue possible living or dead flyers. It is possible, the navy picked up above mentioned leg, and buried it together with the body of the dead flyer who had been lying on the dock.  
I dont know the people anymore today, who had seen the human and ~~machine~~ machine parts fly about.

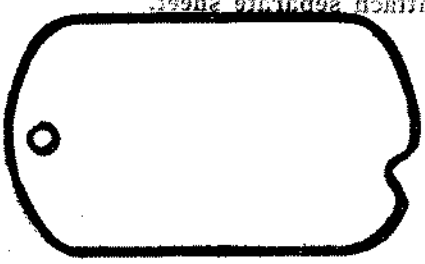

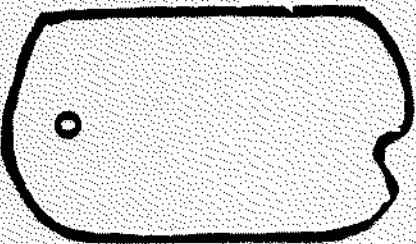
