Search and Recovery Case # 870

1. S & R Case # 870 contained portions of at least four (4) different deceased which have been tentatively segregated and are now designated as Unknown cases X-9038 A, B, C and D, Grave 39, AGRS Mausoleum, Liege, Belgium.
2. There are no complete measurable bones and most portions are charred and/or shattered. The only teeth recovered are in a portion of left mandible.
3. It is believed that portions recovered are additional parts belonging to remains of American deceased previously disinterred from this grave site.
4. Proper segregation will not be possible unless the associated cases can be processed simultaneously with these portions.
5. CAUSE OF DEATH: Shattered and/or charred condition of these remains indicates death was caused by explosion and fire.

NARRATIVE OF INVESTIGATION

1. Authority:

Pursuant to instructions contained in Investigation Directive 730-R the Search and Recovery Team commanded by the undersigned proceeded to Klein-Zerlang, Germany, on 18 May 1951, for the purpose of recovering the remains of T/Sgt., John J. Clark, 12172204, which were, according to German Dulag reference KU-2327, buried in the Klein-Zerlang Cemetery, Row 1, Grave 1. ?

2. Facts and Circumstances:

Check of community records disclosed that Plot 1, Grave 1, was recorded as a formermass grave of six (6) US airmen in which the identification tags of the following:

Edward B. Arum 0-753268

James E. Dozier T-186182

Joseph Ostrander 13096132, who were crewmembers of the

same aircraft as subject decedent, were found. A single grave was also recorded as the former burial site of Glen E. Swing 0-717332, another crew-member. These graves had previously been disinterred by US personnel and the remains evacuated. No reference was made to Clark. (see enclosure # 1)

In effort to verify that no additional remains were present, this mass grave was once again disinterred and a box containing, what subsequent examination proved to be portions of at least three (3) remains, was found. With these remains a white metal ring bearing the inscription "United States Army Airforces" and containing a black stone was discovered. Engraved inside the band are the letters "W.H.S." with numbers "43". It is assumed that the ring may be a personal effect of 2nd Lt William H. Stooks, 0-760709 a crew-member of the aircraft, who has been identified in a group burial of unknowns formerly disinterred from this grave. Disinterment of the single grave from which Lt Swing was previously recovered verified that it was empty. The portions recovered from the mass grave were assigned evacuation number SR-870.

In the course of further interrogation it was learned that another former grave of an American was reportedly located at Zechlinerhuette a nearby community. Through investigation at that locality it was ascertained that an US flyer "John Clark" had been interred there in June 1944 (see enclosure 2 & 3), and that the remains had been removed by members of the Occupation Forces in June or July 1947. The remains of Clark, according to local authorities, were recovered one (1) week after the others, which were buried at Klein-Zerlang. A small cross bearing Clark's name was originally placed over the grave. Later it was replaced by a larger marker containing the same inscription "John Clark". In June or July 1947 an American disintering team purportedly photographed the marker and the grave then exhumed and evacuated the remains and the marker.

It was further learned that the former Burgermeister, a woman, who was responsible for the marking of the grave had disappeared and her present whereabouts are unknown.

Insofar as it could be ascertained the aircraft of this crew was the only aircraft that crashed in this vicinity.

3. Conclusions:

a. That the remains of Clark are either interred in an USMC as an unknown or that the remains recorded as "Clark" were subsequently identified as those of another crewmember.

b. Or that the only recoverable remains of subject decedent are among those recovered during this investigation and which are being evacuated as SR-870.

4. Recommendations:

a. The records of the headquarters be searched once more in effort to verify whether or not the remains of Clark are buried in a USMC as an unknown or another crewmember.

b. Failing recommendation "a" that the remains of SR 870 be jointly reprocessed with other available remains in effort to determine if Clark's remains are present.

We had the grave marked with a cross (inscription "John Clark) opened in the usual manner. The grave site and the remains were photographed by the American Commission, the remains and the cross were then put into coffin which they had brought along.

One American Bomber was shot down, the remains of the crew were buried on 22-6-44 in our East Cemetery. The question of place of burial was waived by the community of Zechlinerhutte. One crew member who was found a distance away from the wreckage received a single grave. His identification tag had the inscription:

Glen E. Swing, O-717332 T 43-44 A

The other six (6) crew members were carbonized to the state of non-identification, these six were placed in a newly made box instead of a coffin. Their three (3) identification tags read:

Edward B. Armm, O-753268 T 42 A.
James E. Dozier T-186182 T 42-43 O. P
Joseph Ostrander 13096132 T 43-44 O.C.

All identification tags were doubles with the exception of Glen E. Smith which was a single.

Found also was an identification bracelet possibly silver with the inscription "Joseph Ostrander, 13096132"

Swing was also buried in a new made box instead of a coffin.

At the burial all the Serbian P.W.s were present, also 3 Polish civilian workers, among them the Baker Anatol Wlodarski. Since the presence of clergy was not permitted, the undersigned held the grave speech.
