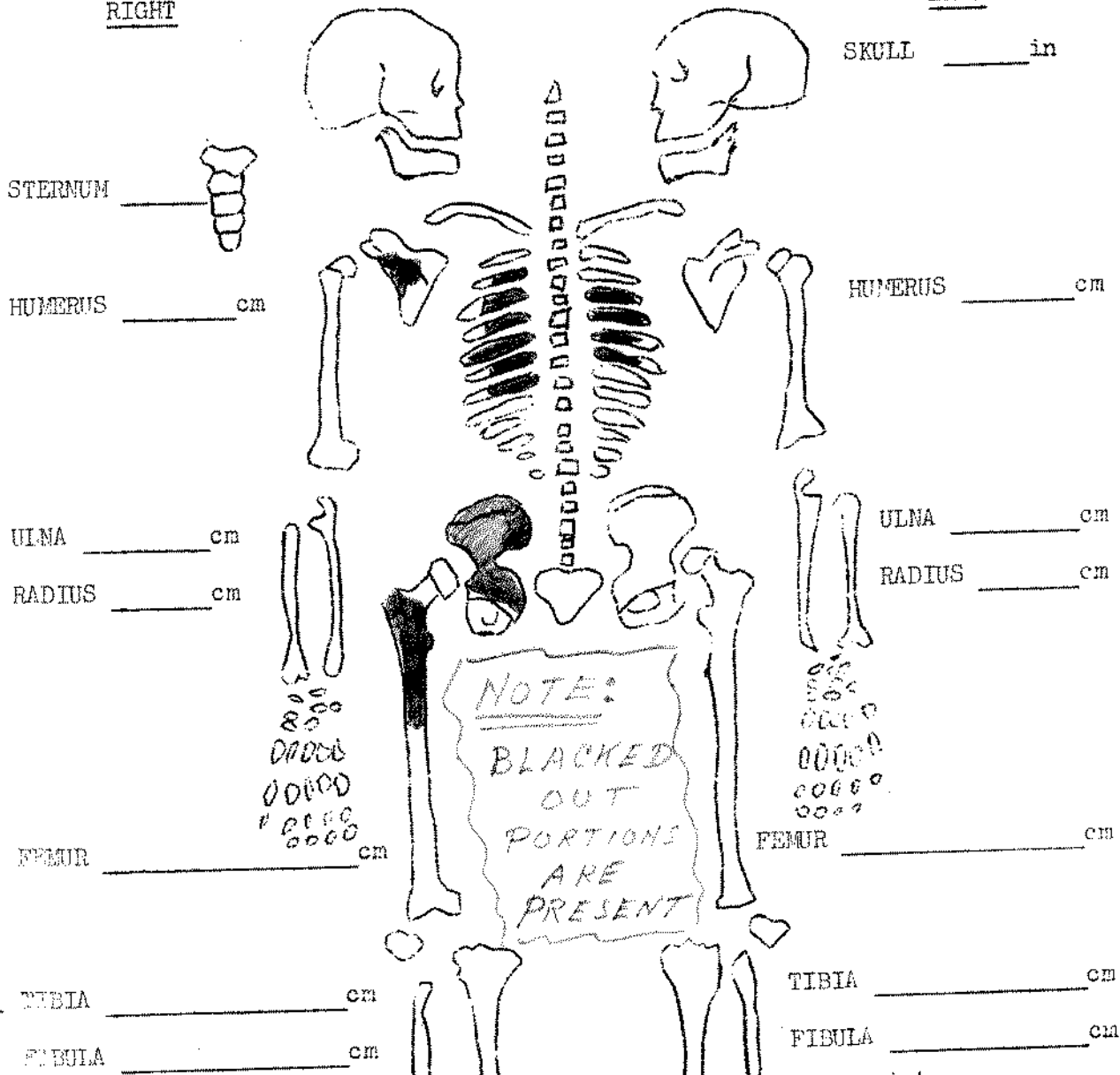
SKELETAL CHART

1. Search and Recovery Cases # 49 A and B have been designated as follows:

3. Case # 49 B consisted of skeletal portions shown as missing on skeletal charts for Unknown X-694 and have been designated as CIL Remains # 4805. *Butterbach*

(a) Remnants of wool drawers with marking "B_9_7_" which agrees with the last initial and last four digits of the army serial number for BUTTERBACH (B-9174) who was an associated crew member.

(b) Three (3) USAAF maps.

(c) Twenty (20) French 100 franc notes (2000 French francs). found in escape kit Mark II-F.

(d) Scraps of "Stars and Stripes" newspaper dated 16 September 1943.

(e) One (1) button type compass.
