Unknown Body Buried at Carriacou.

1. This report of Interment was made in compliance with 2nd Ind., of WD, OQMG, Washington 25 D.C., file QMGAR 293 Island of Carriacou, Trinidad, dated 20 Nov 1946 - Basic Letter Headquarters Trinidad Base Command, Port of Spain, Trinidad, B.W.I. to Commanding General Antilles Department APO 851, U. S. Army file 293, subj: Unknown Grave on the Island of Carriacou dated 11 Sept 1946.

2. The information was obtained from correspondence file enclosed with basic letter of Headquarters Trinidad Base Command.

3. The Acting Commissioner of Carriacou reports under date of 22 July 1942:

The body of a young white man was washed ashore on 21 July 1942 in a rubber dinghy on the beach at L' Islette Bay, Petit Carenage District, Carriacou, which bay is located at the northern end of the island. He was clothed only in a white shirt and a white cotton under-vest. His lower limbs were covered by a blanket. These articles together with Signal Kit and dinghy are in custody of the police.

4. The Medical Officer District VIII performed an autopsy at the Mortuary, Carriacou Hospital and reports:

Body of a young white male; Height 5ft 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins; Hair very dark brown or black; Eyes blue; Development fair; no emaciation. Clothing: On upper part of body a white shirt and white cotton under-vest, lower limbs partially covered with a blanket. Teeth: Upper Jaw- 1st molar on right and 1st & 2nd molars on left side missing, other teeth sound. Lower jaw - both last molars absent, probably not yet erupted. Probable age: Between 19 and 25 years. Internal examination: All the organs were healthy. Death probably due to exposure and shock.

5. Information obtained from the Actg. Adm. of Grenada in a letter to the Commander, -South-Caribbean Area, "British Forces" states:

"Markings on the yellow dinghy which is in the Customs Department at Grenada are as follows:

(a) "Product of Air Ships Balloon Inflatable Boats Floatation Gear Equipment Pneumatic Goods - Air Cruisers Inc., Clifton N.J.

(b) Description of blankets: (M.K.) E.O & S. Co. Ltd.

(c) The neck band of the shirt the man was wearing was marked C.S.5 and this, together with all the original police reports on the case, was forwarded by the Reporting Officer of this Colony to the Flag Officer in Charge, Trinidad, on 6th August, 1942.

COPY OF THE MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT.

Sir,

I have the honor to submit my Report on a Autopsy performed by me today at the Mortuary, Carriacou Hospital.

EXTERNAL Examination: The body was that of a young white male. Height 5 ft. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins; Hair very dark brown or black; Eyes blue; Development fair, no emaciation. The exposed surfaces of arms and legs were covered with a sticky black tarry substance and the skin over these parts was desquamating. In the left wrist was a paller area of skin the shape of which suggested that a wrist-watch had been worn. The skin of the scalp was also desquamating, the hair coming away with it. The stubble on the chin suggested that he had not shaved for at least one, probably two days previous to death. Rigor mortis had begun to wear off. No fractures of bones detected.

Clothing: On upper part of body a white shirt and white cotton under-vest
Lower limbs partially covered with a blanket.

Teeth: Upper jaw: 1st Molar on right and 1st and 2nd molars on left side missing. Other teeth sound.

Lower Jaw: Both last molars absent, probably not yet erupted.

Probable Age: between 19 and 25 yrs.

INTERNAL Examination: All the organs were healthy.

There was the remains of an undigested meal in the stomach - probably fruit salad, bits of orange and other fruit were made out.

In my opinion Death was probably due to Exposure and Shock.

1. Further to this Headquarters letter, SCA/1670/3 dated 23 AUG 46, and previous correspondence concerning the unknown grave on the island of CARRIACOU.

2. The torpedoed tanker referred to by the American Consul in BARBADOS in his confidential letter dated 25 JUL to the Honourable Acting Colonial Secretary in GRENADA, was the "SAN GASPAR".

Information has been received from the Naval Officer-in-Charge, TRINIDAD, that this ship was sunk off TRINIDAD on 18 JUL 42.

3. It has been confirmed by the Harbour Master, TRINIDAD, that the survivors from the "SAN GASPAR" stated that they last saw the body of the Radio Operator, the survivor referred to in the above letter, lying on a raft with both feet missing. This description does not agree with the description of the body given in the Medical Officer's report, forwarded to you with this Headquarters letter SCA/1670/3 of 30 MAY 46.

4. Apparently it was believed at that time that the Radio Operator's body had drifted from TRINIDAD to CARRIACOU, a distance of more than 100 miles.

5. The body was washed ashore at CARRIACOU on 21 JUL 42, three days after the "SAN GASPAR" was sunk and the Radio Operator died.

This fact also does not agree with the Medical Officer's report, which stated that the man had been dead for approximately 24 hours.

6. In view of all the above facts and also that no other British ship appears to have been sunk in the area of CARRIACOU on or about 20 JUL 42, it is now considered that the body washed ashore on the island of CARRIACOU on 21 JUL 42 was not that of the Radio Operator of the "SAN GASPAR".



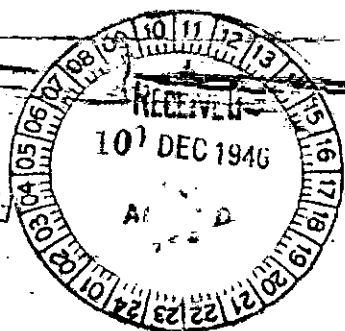

1. Reference is made to 1st Indorsement this Headquarters, dated 18 March 1946 to basic letter your Headquarters, dated 12 March 1946, subject, "Unknown Graves on Island of Carriacoa."

2. The following is submitted for your information and assistance in identifying the recovered body mentioned in the above stated letter.

a. A search of records at this Headquarters shows that seven (7) crew members of two (2) aircraft were reported missing from Beane Field, St. Lucia, B.W.I., on 23 April 1942. The planes were last seen, together twenty (20) miles southeast of Beane Field. The circumstances surrounding the disappearance of the planes is unknown and all search results were negative.

b. Missing crew members of the above mentioned planes are as follows:

1. This headquarters has just received information from British Army Headquarters, St. James' Barracks, Trinidad, B.W.I. to the effect that there is an unknown soldier's grave on the island of Carriacou. Carriacou is a small island in the vicinity of Grenada. British Army Headquarters was first under the impression this was the grave of a British seaman. However, during an investigation by the British Army authorities, which is not yet complete, it was reported that this was the grave of a United States airman. The marker on the grave is dated 21 July 1942, and merely states "Unknown Airman". No reason was advanced as to why it was brought that the soldier was a United States airman. The only definite information that the British Army has with reference to the original discovery of the body is that it washed ashore and was not identifiable at the time. The Minister who performed the funeral services is no longer on the island. The Warden on Carriacou knows the location of the grave and would be the proper person to contact with reference to obtaining additional information. About the only means to communication with the island of Carriacou is via a schooner which plies between Grenada and St. Vincent on weekly trips.

2. Instructions are requested with reference to further action in this matter.

Dead body of white man found in Carriacou-

With reference to my telegraph of yesterday, I beg to forward further facts concerning the body of a young white man which was found in a yellow rubber dinghy on the beach at L' Islette Bay, Petit Carenage District, Carriacou, yesterday morning. This bay is at the northern end of the island.

2. From the Medical Officer's Report it seems that death could not have occurred more than 24 hours or so before, a fact which seems to point to his having met his end not very far from this island.

3. That (1) he was practically unclothed, (2) that the whole signal kit set (6 sells) was unused and (3) that a fair proportion of his body was smeared in a tarry substance (crude oil it seemed to me to be), leads me to the belief that he must at some time not long before have been in an area at sea heavily laden with oil.

4. I am of the opinion that in such surroundings he would naturally rid himself of as many pieces of oil-coaked garments as possible, and would not fire off his flares for fear of starting a fire.

5. The articles found on him are now in the custody of the Police and a list of them is attached. They suggest, at least to me, that he was an airman, presumably of the U.S.A., and that from his apparently recent death that he was attached to one of the bases in the Caribbean.

6. I attach also a copy of the Medical Officer's Report which should be helpful at it gives a detailed description of the dead man.

7. On the left wrist of the dead man was a wristlet watch which was seen by the boy who first noticed the body. Between the time he left to report this and his return, a crowd had assembled and the watch gone. Obviously some dishonest person had stolen it. It was never recovered.

8. An inquest has been fixed for tomorrow, but this will hardly add to the information I now give you.

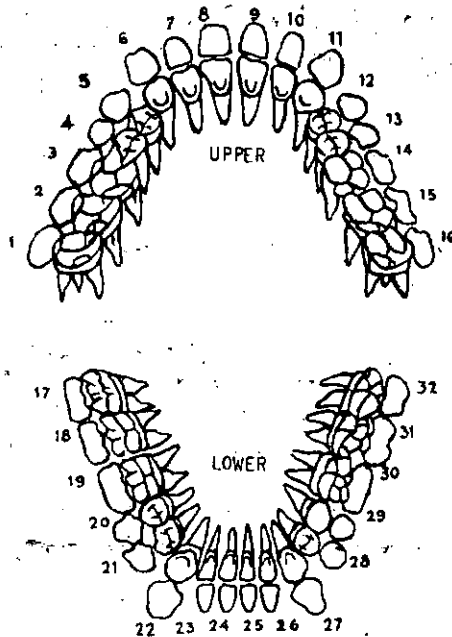


DIAGRAM REPRESENTS THE MOUTH WIDE OPEN
