This is in reply to your letter dated 17 April 1951 concerning the medium of contact with foreign governments in Graves Registration matters.

It was not my intention to intervene in routine actions such as those you describe in the last paragraph of the first page of your letter. However, the cases referred to in the first paragraph of the second page of your letter should be transferred to this Office.

All cases of unrecovered dead in the Soviet Zone of Austria should also be brought to the attention of this Office for appropriate action through the Department of State. Failure to do this has caused the apparent discrepancy in our respective records regarding the number of cases involved because of the difference in the concept of the requirements of the operation. The discrepancy is illustrated by the fact that while your records indicate only 89 cases whose status is not finalized, our records, as you will note from inclosed copy of our roster of unresolved cases contain 196 such cases.

Dear Sir:

A thorough investigation made by this Office to recover and/or identify the remains of Corporal George C. Miller, 35 381 016, United States Army, has resulted in the conclusion that the remains of Corporal Miller were erroneously identified at the time by the United States Army as those of a British subject, Gunner A. L. Nodd, Royal Army, and so were erroneously released by the United States Army to the next of kin of Gunner Nodd.

A compilation of facts surrounding the death of the decedents and the manner in which the original identifications were made has been outlined in detail in the inclosed memorandum, with attachments, in order that you may be fully informed of previous developments in the case.

While sufficient identifying media are available to substantiate the identification of the remains of twenty-eight of the casualties, we have been unable to locate any records indicating the means of identification of the remains released to the next of kin of Gunner Nodd. The one unidentified remains cannot be identified as those of Corporal Miller; however, the identifying physical characteristics compare favorably with the recorded physical characteristics of Gunner Nodd.

Because of the nature and circumstances of his death in England, the Department of the Army is reluctant to advise the family at this time that the remains of Corporal Miller are not available for delivery to them. It is requested that the Department of State ask the proper British authorities to communicate with the next of kin of Gunner Nodd for permission to exhume the remains now buried as his in order that they may be re-examined by qualified identification technicians to determine whether they are in fact those of Gunner Nodd or, as now appears likely, those of Corporal Miller.

All available evidence indicates clearly that the remains still in our possession are, in fact, those of Gunner Nodd.

Subject: Investigation to recover and/or identify the remains of
Corporal George C. Miller, 35381016

1. The investigation by this Office to recover and/or identify the remains of Corporal George C. Miller, 35381016, US Army, has resulted in the conclusion that the remains identified as Gunner A. L. Hodd, R. A., are, in fact, those of Corporal Miller.

2. Gunner Hodd and Corporal Miller were hospital patients aboard a C-46 aircraft which crashed in the vicinity of Gibbet Hill, Dunsfield, England on 6 May 1945, with 27 US Army and 3 United Kingdom personnel aboard. Twenty-nine of the remains recovered from the wreckage were interred in USID Cambridge, England, and 1 was released to British authorities. Subsequent investigation confirmed and/or established the identification of 26 of the decedents through fingerprint comparison by the Canadian Bureau of Identification, Ottawa, Canada, and the United States Federal Bureau of Investigation, and 3 were identified as follows:

- a. Sergeant Sawyer (US) - identification tags and type of clothing.
- b. Gunner Hodd (Br) - identified at time of crash and buried accordingly (means not indicated).
- c. Sapper H. W. Findlay, R. E. (Br) - process of elimination.

3. The remains originally identified as Corporal Miller were redesignated Unknown X-47, USID Cambridge, England, because the fingerprints on the Report of Interment and those on file in the FBI for Corporal Miller were not identical and the dental and physical comparison was negative.

4. The identification of Sapper Findlay, process of elimination, appeared questionable since the identification of Corporal Miller could not be substantiated, therefore, the fingerprints on the Report of Interment for Sapper Findlay were compared with those on file in the FBI for the 27 US Army personnel, including Corporal Miller, with negative results. It can be concluded that the identification of Sapper Findlay is not questionable.

**Subject: Investigation to recover and/or identify the remains of
Corporal George C. Miller, 35381016**

5. The remains of Unknown X-47 were processed by an accredited anthropologist on 3 February 1951 to obtain identification data from remains for comparison with the recorded physical data for Gunner Hodd. The comparison and the findings of the anthropologist indicate that the remains of Unknown X-47 are, in fact, those of Gunner Hodd. (See Incl #1)

6. Although no means of identification is indicated for the remains released to the next of kin of Gunner Hodd, the identification was established at the U. S. 3rd General Hospital where all remains had been collected immediately after the crash. There is no indication that British personnel participated in the process of identification.

7. Because of the nature and circumstances of death, it is not possible to advise the next of kin of Corporal Miller that the identification of the remains cannot be established. Therefore, the 7887 Graves Registration Detachment, Liege, requested the assistance of the U. S. Army Military Attache, London, England, in referring the matter to the proper British authorities to determine the possibility of examining the remains interred as Gunner Hodd to verify the identification. This action met with negative results. (See Incls #2 and #3).

4. Further action is suspended pending advice from your office.

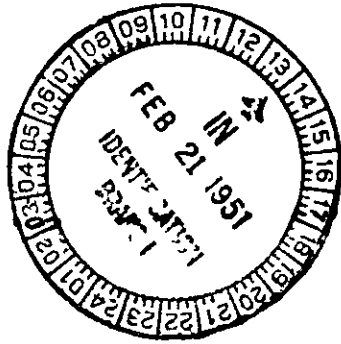



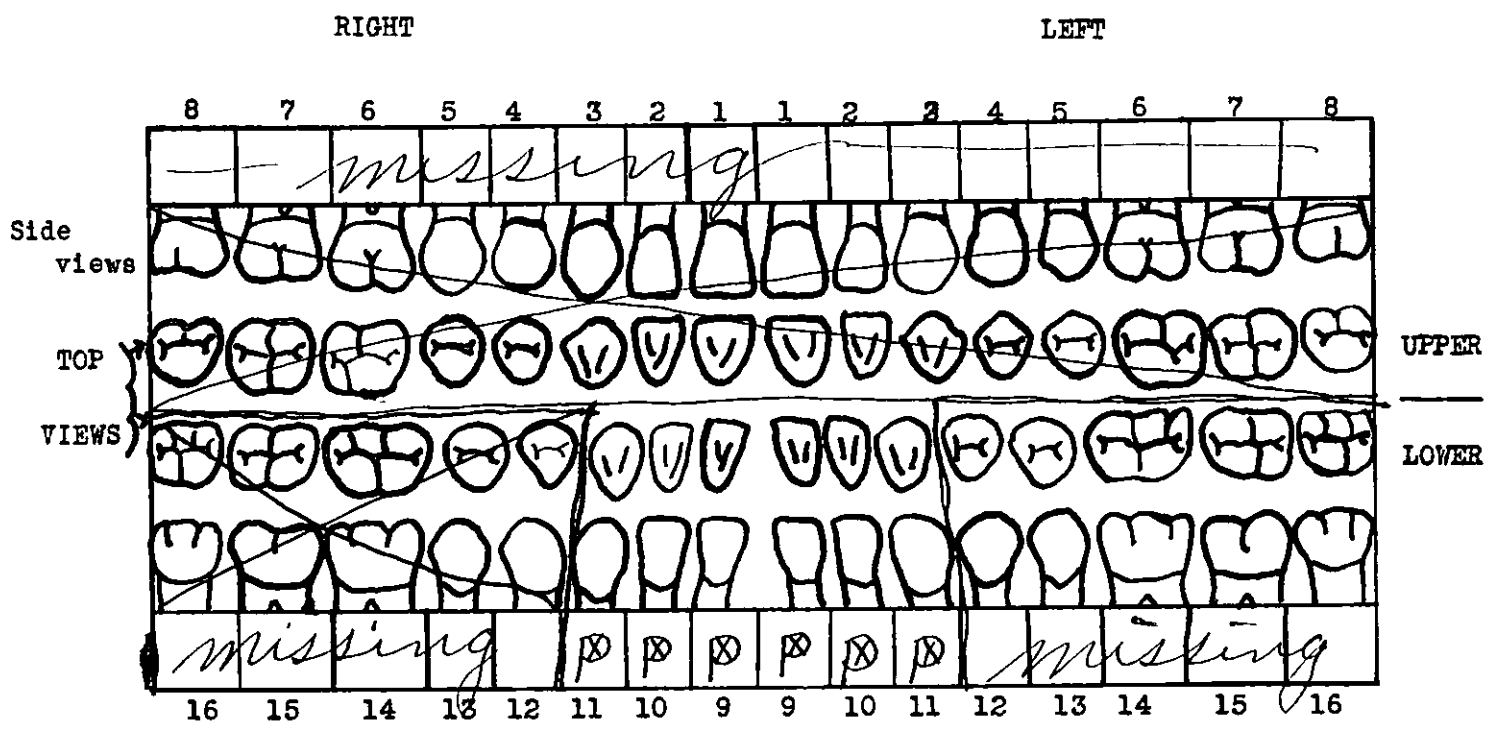

Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. Teeth recovered are not contradictory with Form 371 for MODD. No articulation is possible between the mandible and the skull due to missing portions, however, the skull fragments articulate with atlas. All other articulations are good and the remains is almost complete (embedded in flesh). Age estimation was based on the closure of skull sutures present and epiphysial lines of all the bones. It is noted that the skull fragments have been separated from the scalp which is almost complete and intact with trunk, therefore, these fragments undoubtedly belong to this remains although no articulations are possible between these fragments. The skeletal parts graphically represented on skeletal chart are those of one and the same individual.

Cause of death -

The fragmented condition of this remains indicates a plane crash.

1. With respect to paragraph 5, basic communication, the Consul General at the U. S. Embassy in London was requested to give the Embassy's reaction to asking the Foreign Office for assistance in accomplishing the disinterment of Gunnar Hodd's body.

2. The Consul General's memorandum in reply is attached as Incl. 1 to this Indorsement.

3. It is apparent that the U.S. Embassy in London does not desire to even raise the issue with the Foreign Office, which as is stated in the attached memorandum, would have little or no chance of success.

MEMORANDUM

For: Lt. -Colonel P. H. Draper
From: Mr. Bailey

With reference to your call here this morning with Lieutenant Peterson of the American Graves Registration at Liege, for the purpose of explaining to the Embassy the desire of the Quartermaster's office to exhume the body of Gnr. Modd, a British subject killed in the crash of an American hospital plane in 1945 and buried since that time in his family cemetery in England, I should like to recommend that this matter be given further consideration. I feel that it would be inadvisable to make this intention known to the Foreign Office, where, as you know, there is a fundamental divergence of opinion on the subject of disinterment and transfer of remains, and where in the light of our experience in these matters such a suggestion would meet with certain refusal and never be passed on to the parents of Gnr. Modd. It would seem unnecessary to raise an issue which would have little or no chance of success and would in addition bring a loss of prestige to us in the whole matter of the of the removal of World War II dead.

NARRATIVE OF INVESTIGATION

I. AUTHORITY

In compliance with verbal instructions from the Chief of Operations, the undersigned proceeded to Cambridge, England to process the remains of X-47.

II. FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES

Remains of X-47 were in a military aircraft which crashed at Dunsfield, England on 6 May 1945 with everyone on board in a casualty status. Twenty-six (26) were identified by fingerprints, one by identification tags, Gunner Modd (British) was identified at time of crash by an unknown means and turned over to the British. Sapper Findlay (British) was identified by means of elimination. X-47 was identified originally as Cpl. George C. MILLER, 35 381 016, but was later re-designated as X-47 because fingerprint records on file in the FBI did not correspond with those of the remains.

At time of death Cpl. MILLER was 39 years of age, with full upper and lower dentures. Gunner MODD was 25 years and eight months, with most of teeth intact. Miller was 5'8 $\frac{1}{4}$ " in height and Modd was 5'5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " in height.

III. FINDINGS

The remains were processed by Dr. Alexander Tardy, AGRC anthropologist. (See inclosed QMC Form 1044) (Incl. #1) A visit was made to the Office of the Military Attache, London, England with view towards the possible exhumation of the remains of Gunner MODD for reprocessing. The attitude of the Military Attache and the American Embassy, London, England are inclosed. (See Incl 2)

IV. CONCLUSIONS

From the evidence presented in the processing report, is concluded that the remains X-47 Cambridge are not those of Cpl. George C. MILLER.

- V. RECOMMENDATIONS

That in view of the attitude of the Office of the Military Attache, the American Embassy, London, England and the anthropologist's



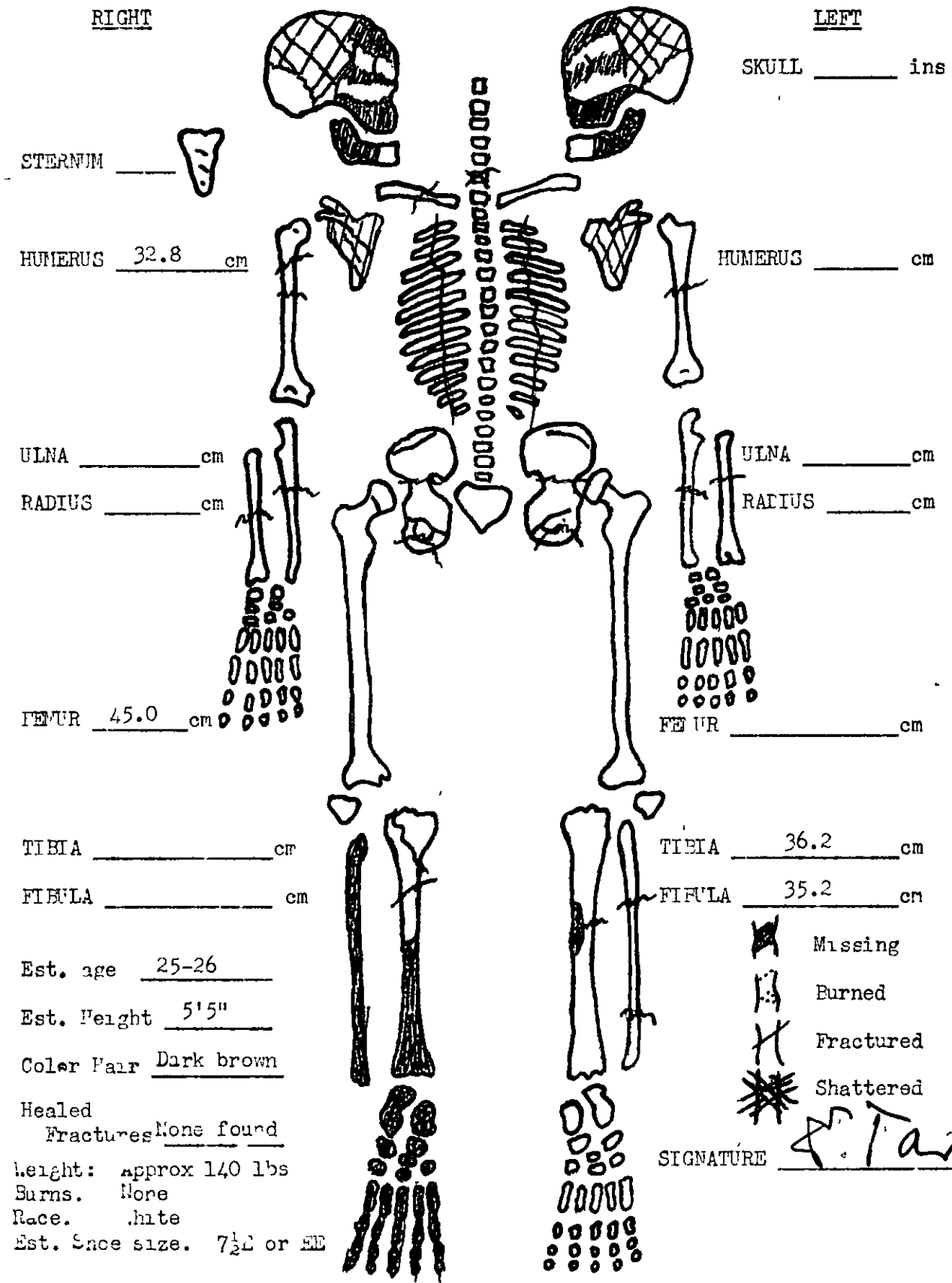
SKELETAL CHART

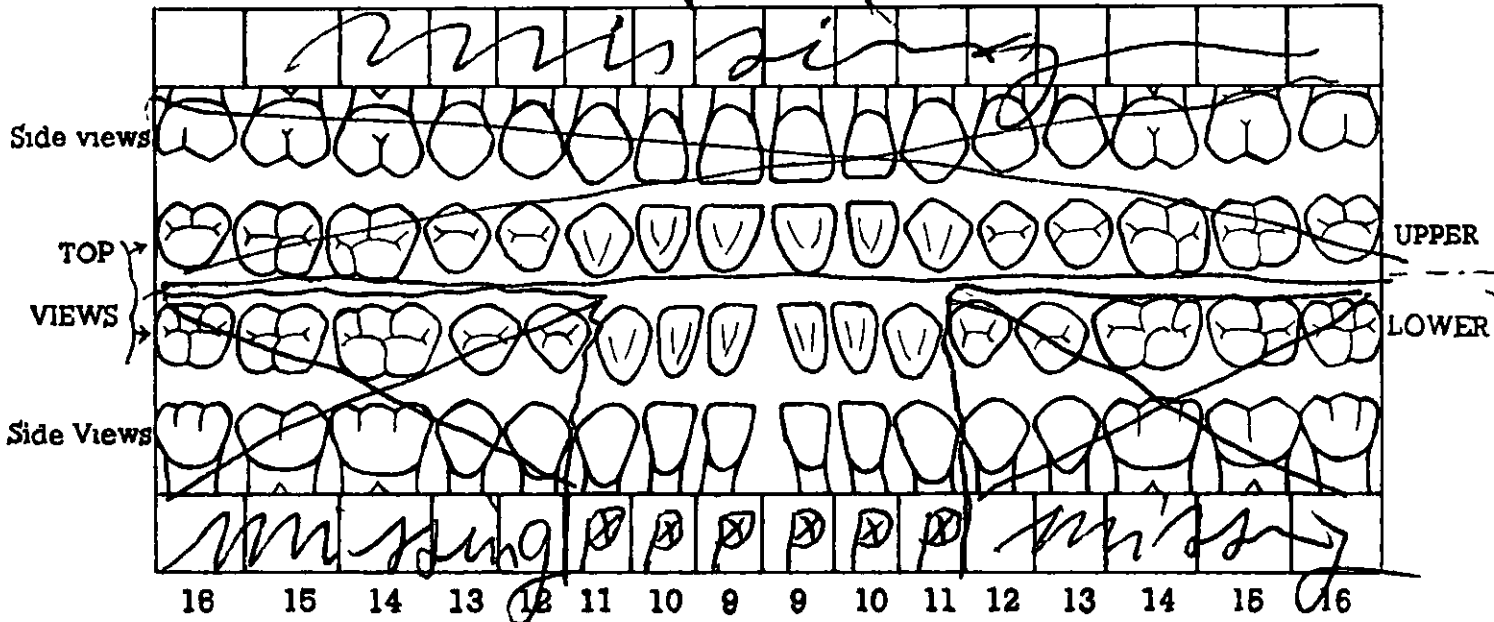

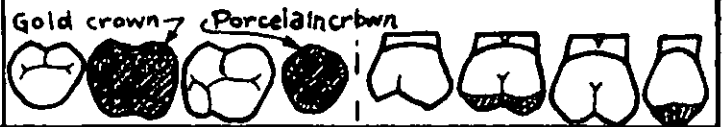

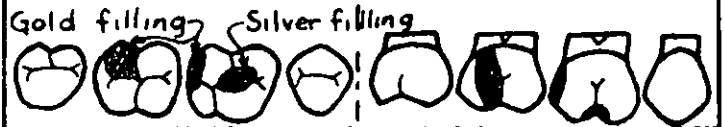

Dear Amlong:

Our friends in the Department of State have been quite disturbed by your action in taking up direct with the British, the cases of second Lieutenant Lincoln D. Bundy, O-804996, and Corporal George C. Miller, 35381016.

In the case of Bundy, the British protested through our Embassy in London that we had gone out of channels, and in the case of Miller, a member of the Embassy Staff expressed a similar view.

While there is no desire here to restrict informal liaison with the operating personnel of other nationalities actually engaged in graves registration activities, our friends in the Department of State feel that approaches to United States diplomatic missions and foreign governments should be made only through our established channel here. The Department of State then will determine the proper action.

I am inclined to agree that at this stage in our operations there is nothing so urgent that it cannot be taken up through this Office with the Department of State. This course will avoid both embarrassment and confusion such as we now are suffering in connection with the unrecovered dead in the Soviet occupation zone of Austria. There somebody speaking in behalf of the Army apparently has informed the United States diplomatic mission that there are only twelve unresolved cases, whereas here we know of nearly two hundred requiring further search.

1. Reference is made to Non-Recoverable Findings, dated 10 October 1949, for Corporal George C. Miller, 35381016, and Report of Burial for Unknown X-47, Plot BB, Row 7, Grave 5, USMC Cambridge, England, previously identified as Corporal Miller.

2. Case papers attached to subject case indicated that thirty decedents, including three British subjects, were recovered from a hospital aircraft crash, in which Corporal Miller was killed, on 6 May 1945 in England. Of the thirty personnel reported KIA, twenty-six (26) have been identified as Americans; three remains released to the British Authorities, and Unknown X-47 is the only unidentified casualty to be accounted for.

3. In view of the fact that fingerprints for Unknown X-47 have been compared by the Federal Bureau of Investigation with those of Corporal Miller, and the twenty-six other American casualties with negative results, it is believed that these remains are actually those of one of the British subjects aboard the aircraft.

4. It is requested, therefore, that the British Authorities be contacted in order to ascertain the possibility of conducting an investigation of the remains previously released to the Imperial War Graves Commission, in a final attempt to locate the remains of Corporal Miller, and possibly establish the correct identification of Unknown X-47.

5. All action on subject case is suspended pending outcome of investigation by your Headquarters.

1. Your attention is invited to the attached copy of letter OOMG dated 5 December 1949 subject. Identification of World War II Deceased.

2. It is requested that the British Imperial War Graves Commission be contacted in order to ascertain the possibility of conducting exhumation processing of the remains of the three casualties now in the custody of the Imperial War Graves Commission in a final attempt to locate the remains of Corporal Miller and possibly establish the correct identification of Unknown X-47.

3. Further resume of facts are submitted herewith for your information:

"Cpl George C. Miller, 35381066 was a patient being evacuated on a C-46 aircraft from France to England on 6 May 1945. Plane collided with a Vadas Rower and crashed on Gibbetts Hill,, England. Missing Air Crew Report and passenger loading list indicated that thirty individuals were aboard the aircraft at the time of crash. Thirty remains were recovered from the wreckage; twenty-seven (27) of these were American personnel and were buried in USMC Cambridge. Three remains were Allied and were turned over to Imperial War Graves Commission. The remains interred in plot BB, Row 7, Grave 5 USMC Cambridge were identified at the time of burial as those of Cpl Miller however a subsequent check of fingerprints submitted on Report of Burial for this deceased with the fingerprints of Cpl Miller on file in Washington revealed that they were not identical and the remains were redesignated Unknown X-47. The fingerprints of Unknown X-47 have been compared with those of the twenty-six other American casualties with negative results. It is therefore logical to conclude that the remains of Unknown X-47 are the remains of one of the three British subjects involved in the crash of this aircraft and that the remains of one of the three casualties released to the Imperial War Graves Commission are actually those of Cpl Miller".

This correspondence shows that the identity of these two men was established to the satisfaction of the American Authorities in 1945 and, as a result, the remains of Galarneau were buried in Brookwood Military Cemetery, and the remains of Findlay were handed over to the next-of-kin for private burial.

In the circumstances, the Commission are unable to consider the exhumation of the remains of any of these three soldiers.
