- 1. Reference paragraph 3, preceding Indorsement, assignment of CIL numbers to subject remains was accomplished in accordance with sub-paragraphs e, and f., paragraph 118, TM 10-281, Change 1, dated 5 August 1948, since remains were recovered from mass burial, with the remains of Identified Casualties.
- 2. It has been brought to the attention of this office that in initial Airborne descent in France, partial remains were often caught on Branches of trees, while the body, less partial remains were picked from the ground. It is believed that remains which were previously buried in mass grave, from which Unknowns X-450,X-451, X-452, X-454 and X-456 were recovered may well fall into this category, and were picked up by German Troops and buried with the two (2) remains now identified.
- 3. Every possible attempt has been made by this office to associate teeth for subject Unknowns with casualties in area from which remains were recovered, with negative results, therefore, it may be possible that subject teeth belong to other remains which were recovered, identified, and possibly since returned to the United States for burial.
- 4. In view of above remarks it is requested that statement contained in paragraph 3, lst Indorsement be reconsidered, and that CML numbers originally assigned these Unknowns be retained.
- 5. Records of the headquarters will remain unchanged, pending receipt of reply to above.
