REMARKS

As indicated by MACR 6723, Lt. Oscar A. Weeklund was the Pilot of A/C 41-29371 which crashed at Bretigny, France, 25 June 1944, and is the only crew member to be accounted for.

In view of the fact that all other deceased crew members have been identified and burial reports indicate that entire bodies were present, the remains referred to and designated as Unknown X-364, are believed to be, beyond a reasonable doubt, the only recoverable remains of Lt. Weeklund.

NARRATIVE

On 31 October proceeded as directed to Bretigny-sur-Orge (S & O) to investigate case Seine et Oise #1669.

Went immediately to Airport, and through the Personnel Section located people who were employed at the Airport in June of 1940.

Interviewed a BONIS, Jean who told of an air crash near the Airport on a Sunday. Looked at a calendar and found that the date given on the MACR report #G173 relative to crash of plane piloted by 1st Lt. WEEKLUND was that of a Sunday

Interviewed Mr. CAUCHOIX, R. owner of the farm upon which the plane crashed, and also a laborer of his farm, and M. SIGOT, a farrier, who lives adjacent to the farm. They all mention seeing 5 bodies after the crash, and M. SIGOT advanced the information that it was the consensus of opinion of the Germans as well as the civilians that the plane was piloted until the moment of the crash because of the way it was manoeuvred, and not like a plane out of control, and that when the explosion, presumably that of a large bomb, took place the pilot's body was blown into tiny bits.

Visited the scene of the crash, and found that although the mass of wreckage of the plane had been removed by the Germans to an unknown spot and the hole filled in, there were bits of metal found scattered about.

The Field had been used for the cultivation of potatoes in 1946.

Searched the field and located human bones scattered about.

Since the bodies of five deceased crew members have been recovered and identified, by the process of elimination, these bones must be those of 1st Lt. WEEKLUND, Oscar A, # O-690016.

Proper forms completed and recovery sent to CIP for identification.

Today, I looked at a calendar and noticed that June 25th, 1944 was a Sunday.

I, the undersigned, M. DYMONT Joseph, Polish, field laborer, domiciled at Vert-le-grand, certify that I was employed on the farm called "Chez Mous" when a plane crashed on a Sunday. Many aircrafts were in the air that day, and I saw this one falling. It started to burn in the air and immediately after the crash, exploded with a very large explosion.

When I reached the spot, five bodies were lying around, one two hundred meters from the deep hole where the plane had crashed. The other four charred, lying on the rim of the crater, parts of bodies scattered. All remains were picked up when the bodies were taken away to be buried.

I saw the Germans when they took the wreckage out of the ground, but do not know where it was taken. There were no bodies in the plane when it was removed. This took place a month about after the crash. Later on, the hole was filled in with dust.

While working the land, I occasionally found a piece of bone, some quite large and always bury them again on the same spot.

Ceuchoix, a short time after the accident. I saw five bodies lying around, one some distance from the aircraft, and four near the crater caused by the plane.

Therefore, to my mind, and to the Germans' and civilians' opinion, on that day, the pilot remained at the controls of the ship until the time of the crash because of the skillful working to bring it down, and then his body was entirely blown to bits by the explosion which took place immediately after impact.

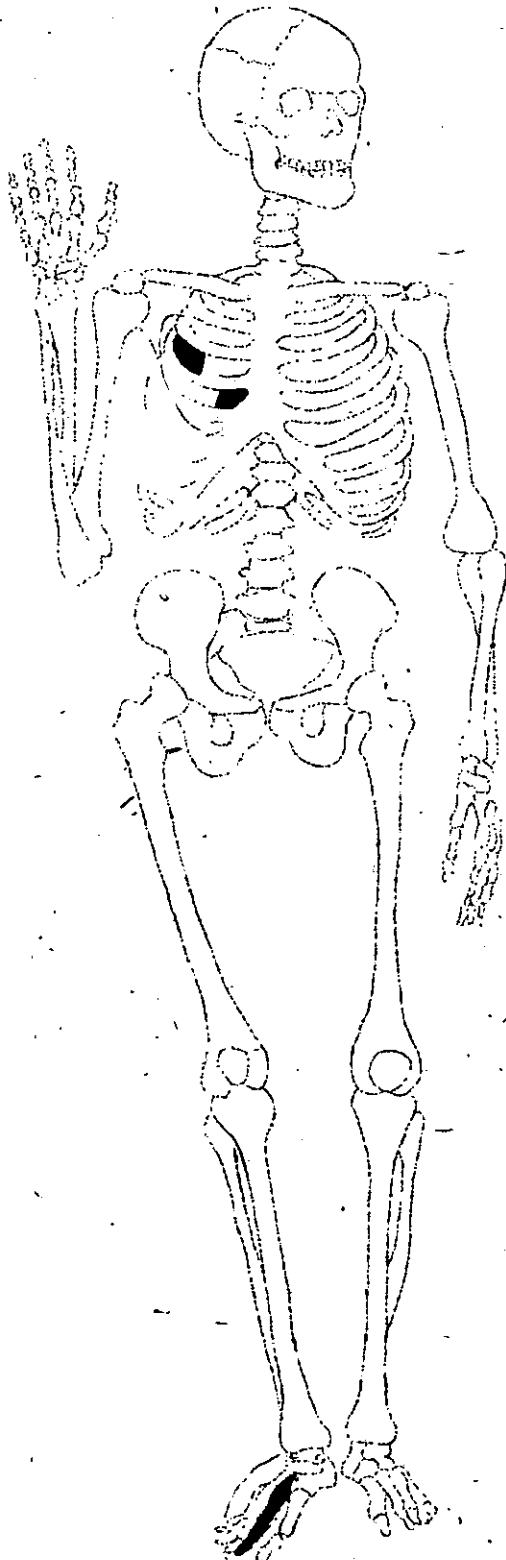

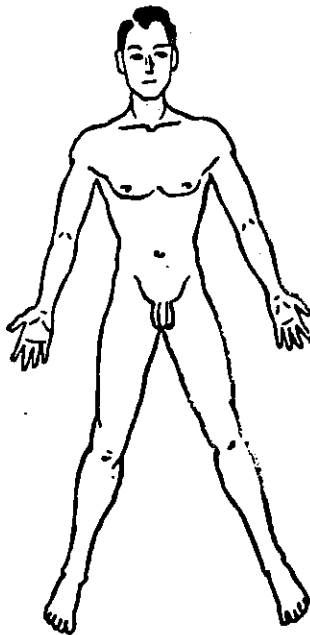

12. Remarks: **Besides the little bone fragments in the black-out chart there are 1 or 2 oz. of bones fragments unable to identify. The bones are very dry and could be old bones. However, these bones were found on surface of ground, not in grave, which may account for their being dry. All remains weight 2 to 3 oz. Fluoroscopic Examination unnecessary. Chemical Laboratory Examination unavailable. This case is classified "Unknown" because processing at Subordinate Identification Point revealed no positive identifying clues.**
