On 25 August 1944 a double-fuselaged American plane (Lockheed P-38) fell in flames as a result of enemy action in the commune of Angy. Body of pilot, burned and badly mutilated, was buried by French civilians in cemetery. Grave marked by plain wooden cross, to which is affixed an American flag. Two of plane's propeller blades flank grave. Mayor, M. Charpentier, states that pilot had black hair.

In addition to items mentioned in identifying paragraph above, the following items may assist in identification:

Number on rubberized cloth pouch: 095(D)35AL

Number on flap of this pouch: 3567/220/176 Dec 1943

One U.S. five cent piece.

Mayor stated that a German stole a ring from finger of above body.

Body was disinterred from Angy and re-interred in U. S. Military Cemetery #1, Champigneul, Grave C-6-140. Disinterred 25 Jan 45; Reinterred 26 Jan 45.

Remains consisted of small bits only, in an advanced stage of decomposition, and all characteristics such as operative scars, physical characteristics and such identifying aids were impossible of observation. There were no teeth, and no other identifiable remains.

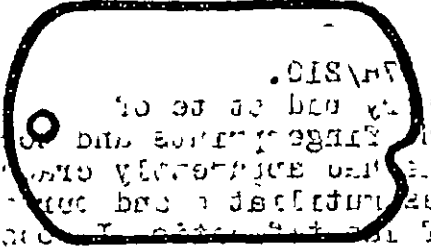
