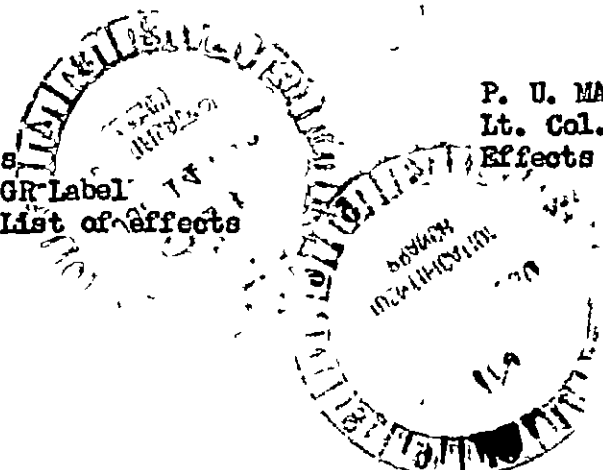
2. All effects have been thoroughly examined for possible clues of identification. The inclosed descriptive list of items is furnished for your information and file reference.

On 8 February 1944, at 1330 hours, a four-motored B-17 American bomber crashed and exploded in the commune of St. Pierremont (co-ord v02332). Seven (7) parachutists seen to descend; at least five are believed to be prisoners of war. History of sixth is unknown. Seventh is known to have been killed. Germans immediately arrived on scene and removed body; destination believed to be Liesse.

Date of interrogation 12 March 1945. Persons interrogated:

M. Mignot, Secretary to Mayor, St. Pierremont

M. Godaire, Civilian on whose property plane crashed, St. Pierremont

M. Eugene Robinet, Secretary to Mayor, Liesse.

One body was in debris of aeroplane. Sec'y to Mayor ~~stated~~ stated that M. Godaire had buried remains of another body in his garden. Investigating officer went to scene and personally disinterred and minutely examined remains. It is the civilian professional opinion of the undersigned investigating officer that the remains were not human remains, but were melted plastic and cloth parts of parachute.
