This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth) cuspids or canines (tearing teeth) bicuspids (chewing teeth) and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates) and any deformity of jaws found. 


1 The records pertaining to Unknown Y - 756, Plot EEE, Row 17, Grave 7061, USC, Epinal, France have been reviewed in accordance with par 159 SF 830-110-5, D, dated 31 March 1940, and it is the opinion of the Board of Review, appointed by par 2, SO to 66, this headquarters, dated 14 June 1950, that sufficient evidence is not available to establish the identity of the deceased concerned, and it is recommended these remains be classified as unidentifiable.

UNIDENTIFIABLE

Subject remains were disinterred from civilian cemetery of Fraize, France and buried in USMC Epinal on 29 March 1945. Body was originally identified as S/Sgt Dwight E SUDDOCK, 37217507, 141 Inf Regt, by means of an ID tag attached to the wrist of the remains.

However, these remains were redesignated to Unknown X-736 since S/Sgt Suddock, a liberated Prisoner of War, was returned to military control on 29 April 1945.

Subsequently, this headquarters identified Unknown X-756 as the remains of Pfc Berton J McQueen, a member of 141 Inf Regt, KIA on 23 November 1944 near Fraize.

OQMG letter, dated 9 February 1949, stated in view of the fact that physical characteristics, date and place of death for Pfc Morris E Swackhammer, 32839186, (an unresolved member of 143 Inf Regt, KIA near Fraize on 23 November 1944) also compare favorably with Unknown X-756, the identification of Pfc McQueen could not be submitted for approval.

It is noted that information from next of kin of both Pfc McQueen and Pfc Swackhammer indicates no civilian dental work was performed, and since available Army dental records are also inadequate, positive association of these remains cannot be made with either decedent.

In view of the above, the remains identified as Pfc McQueen were redesignated Unknown on 3 May 1950 by this headquarters.

Consequently, OQMG requested in letter, dated 24 April 1950 that the remains of X-756 be examined by the anthropologist to determine whether the noted physical characteristics for Pfc McQueen which were not previously of record in their office, are present with subject unknown.

Upon reprocessing, the relevant report of the anthropologist revealed the characteristics, as cited in the OQMG letter, were not present with remains of X-756.

Inasmuch as no further unresolved casualties in vicinity of Fraize France can be definitely associated with remains of X-756 it is recommended the subject Unknown be declared UNIDENTIFIABLE.

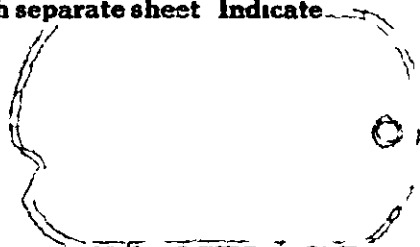

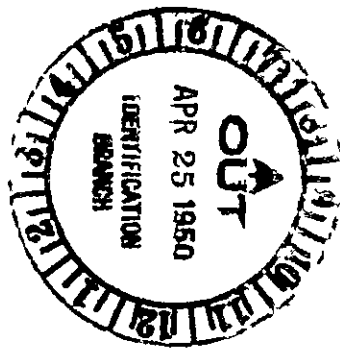

1. Corrected Report of Burial for Unknown X-756, USMC Spinal, France, identified by your Headquarters as Pfc. Burton J. McQueen, 35800045, is returned herewith.

2. Reference is made to paragraph 2, basic communication. Although investigation reveals no evidence contradictory to findings submitted as basis for identification of Unknown X-756 as Pfc. McQueen, comparison of identifying data for the remains with corresponding data for Pfc. Swachhammer is equally favorable. Therefore, the necessary elimination of the latter as a possibility is impossible.

3. With reference to Unknown X-6093, St. Avold, information from next of kin of both Pfc. Swachhammer and Pfc. McQueen indicates that no civilian dental work was performed, and since available Army dental records are also inadequate, positive association of these remains cannot be made with either decedent.

4. In view of the above, it is recommended that, unless further investigation reveals additional evidence, the remains identified as Pfc. McQueen be redesignated Unknown and declared Unidentifiable. It is also recommended that Unknown X-6093 remain in an Unidentifiable status as currently designated.

1 This Headquarters is trying to establish the identity of an unknown soldier whose remains were recovered from an isolated grave at Fraize, France, Map sheet K 49/V45. When the body was disinterred from the isolated grave the Identification Tag of Dwight E. Suddock, 37217507, was found tied to the wrist by string. Cause of death was given as G S W - Pen, L. Kidney, and the date of death was estimated to be 15 December 1944.

2 Dwight E. Suddock was taken prisoner at Fraize on 4 July 1944. He gave one of his Identification Tags to a French girl. The circumstances under which he met the French girl he described in correspondence as follows: "The local police turned me over to the Germans and before the Germans got there they got a girl that could speak English. They wanted some way to show that we had been there or maybe just for a souvenir and they wanted one of my dog tags. I think the girl that spoke English is the one that got it. I don't know her name but the local police will know who she is."

3. Dwight E. Suddock was liberated in April 1945, and subsequently evacuated to the United States.

4 The subject unknown is now designated as X-756, U S M C Epinal. Working on the estimated date of death and isolated grave location, the identity of X-756 has been reduced to the lowest possible number of unresolved casualties. It is requested that an investigation be conducted at Fraize in an attempt to gain some knowledge of the identity of the American soldier to whose wrist was tied the Identification Tag which Dwight E. Suddock had given to the English-French interpreter at the police station.

Report of investigation on Unknown X -7567 USMC Epinal

Special investigation conducted at Fraize, Vosges, France for the purpose of collecting additional information on Unknown X -7567 USMC Epinal resulted in the following findings

The history of the identification tag belonging to DWIGHT E SUDDOCK was traced as follows
The English speaking French girl referred to in Par 2 basic communication is a Mrs Mc GUINNESS, born METIVIER, whose French husband of British origin was killed in this war, and who lives at the present time at "Le Nid", 41 Evelyn Road, Stamford Brook, London W 12 England
It was learned that she handed some personal effects and one identification tag, the inscription of which was unknown to the people in Fraize to a M Jean Philip Weber, schoolteacher at Fraize Later he turned over said effects and tag to an American captain in January 1945 The name of the captain is unknown, however it is presumed that he was in command of the 365 ORD MAINT CO APO 655 US Army, the only unit stationed at Fraize at that time

It is recommended an effort be made to locate the captain in order to learn of the eventual disposition of said effects and tag

In an effort to solve the case from a different angle a careful check was made of all American deceased recovered from the Fraize area Unfortunately no notices of disinterment are available for checking at the townhall of Fraize With the maximum possible accuracy it was established that on 17 April 1945 five Americans were disinterred from the communal cemetery of Fraize According to officials there the American authorities at the time of disinterment identified these remains as to their names and origin, altho no definite written information is available to substantiate this fact Hearsay information obtained from a citizen of Fraize to the effect that one of the remains mentioned above was identified as MORRIS E SWACKHAMMER, Pfc 143 Inf 32839186; whose name appears in the AGRC Casualty Listing # 1 dated 15 August 1946 A check at USMC at Epinal, France,

where all American remains were evacuated in this section, failed to disclose the body of Swackhammer. Therefore it is suggested that records of Military Cemeteries in our section of responsibility be checked for the purpose of locating Pfc Swackhammer and possible the four other remains said to be removed on the same date.

In conclusion it may be noted that X -756X was not necessarily one of the five known remains interred at Fraize, but rather an isolated burial within its confines, evacuated by an unknown American unit.

I, the undersigned, Denis GERL, Mayor of the town of FRAIZE, declare that after the dispersion of the records and archives of the commune during the occupation and liberation I am not able to furnish exact information on the subject of the investigation you are conducting concerning the presence of an identification tag bearing the name of "SUDDOCK DWIGHT E ", which tag is said to have been found on the body of an American soldier who is buried in our territory

In connection herewith I can declare that the American Graves Registration service removed all the bodies of American soldiers killed in this area without leaving any notice of disinterment so that I cannot give you the required information which I would have been glad to furnish

After the visit of your representative, Mr Carpentier, I extended my investigations, unfortunately without any result

To my knowledge there are no more graves of American soldiers in the territory of the commune of Fraize

I, the undersigned, ~~WEBER~~ Jean Philippe, school teacher at Fraize and former deputy mayor of the commune of Fraize, certify that I handed some souvenirs to a US army captain. These souvenirs were: two rosaries, one identification tag, two amateur-photographs. I cannot remember the name on the identification tag.

These souvenirs were handed by me to the above mentioned American captain about the middle of January 1945 (It is absolutely impossible to give the exact date). This captain belonged to a unit which was stationed at Fraize (les Aulnes). The unit stayed about 3 weeks in our village.

The souvenirs in question were handed to me by Mrs Mac Guinness because she was leaving Fraize to go back to London. As far as I understood from Mrs Mac Guinness' explications, these souvenirs belonged to American soldiers who were killed and she asked me to take the necessary steps to have them sent to the States, which I did. The unit to which the captain belonged was the following: 365 O R D Maint. Co APO 655 US Army.





Sir,

In reply to your request I inform you of the notes concerning the Americans who were buried in the cemetery of Fraize in the end of 1944 or the beginning of 1945. These notes can only be informal. I made them myself while Mr Marchal, chief fireman, made some to hand them to the townhall. Some time afterwards I made a transcription of these notes on a separate sheet added to the parochial records of deceased, with the title:

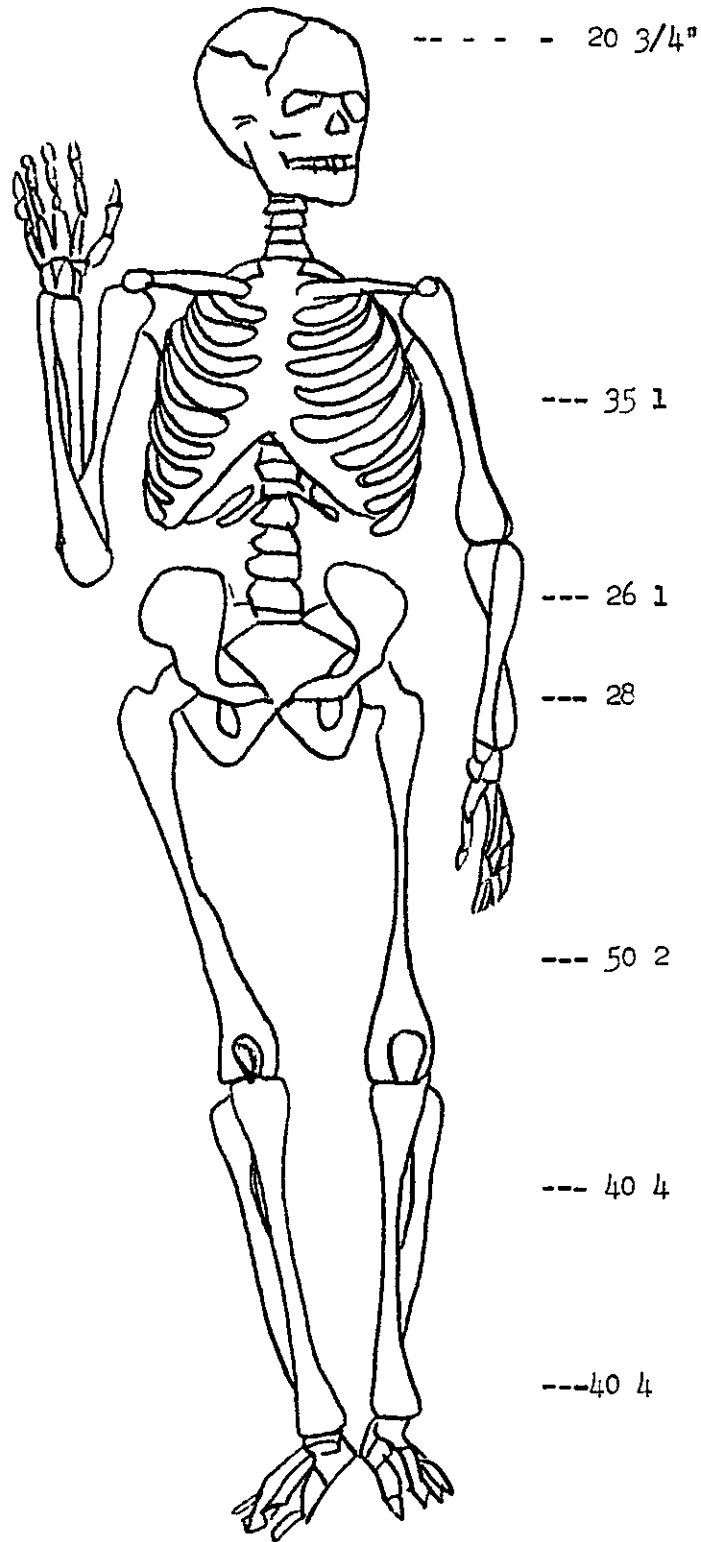
