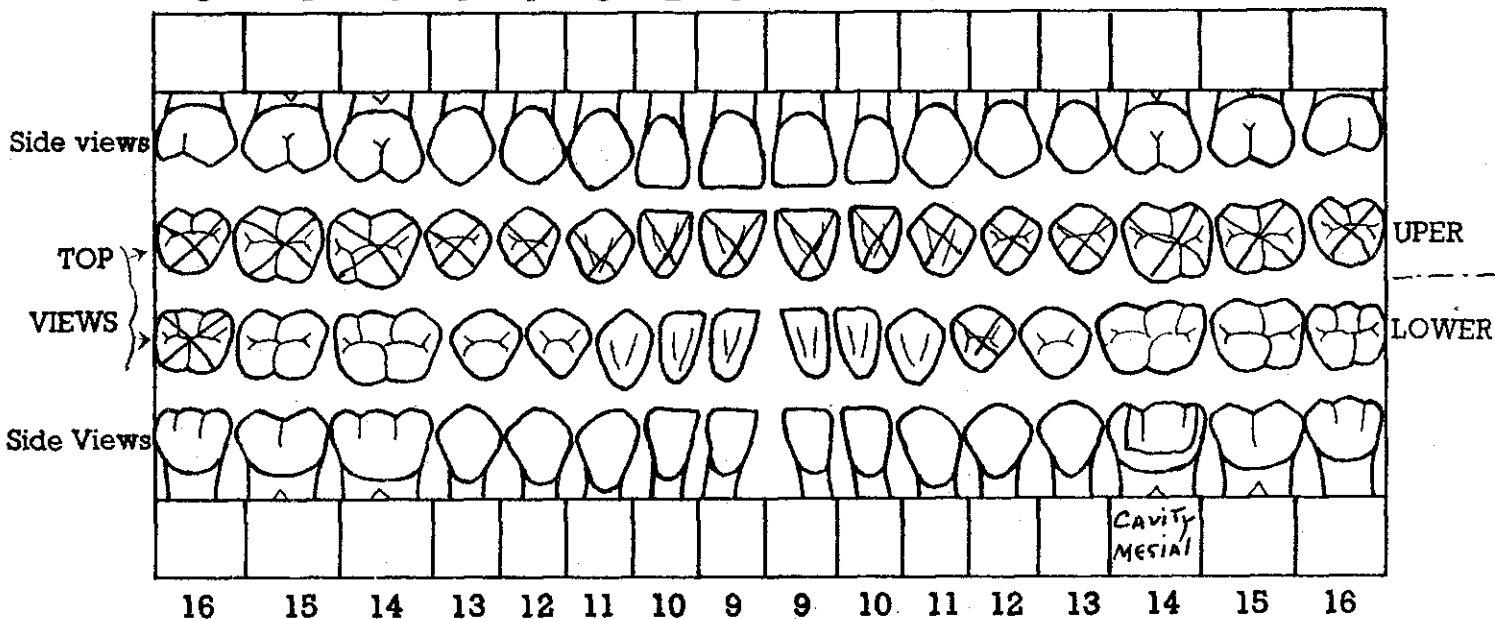

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 1. It will be noted that QM GR Form No. 1 for Unknown X-60, Liney U. S. Military Cemetery lists Personal Effects as including seven hundred (700) French francs. Actually only three hundred (300) French francs were found on the body. One of the bills were of the 1938 series on which no numerals appear but only the words "Cent Francs". This was originally interpreted as meaning five hundred rather than one hundred.

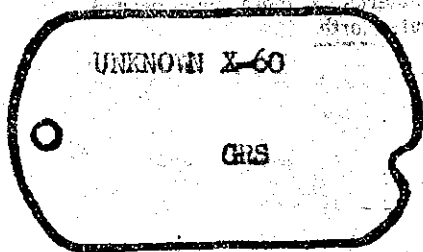
