Upon reprocessing by Subordinate Identification Point #1 Carentan, Case Unknown X-455, was found to be a mass burial of four (4) men. Because of the difference in size and structure in the bones, separation was possible. Segregation was made into cases Unknown X-455 A, B, C and D. Due to the small amount of bones recovered, the four remains were buried in one casket.

No clothing found. The teeth found were a mass common among the remains. They were all placed with remains of case A and the Tooth Chart is enclosed with case papers of case X-455 A.

Original Report of burial found in debris states the following :

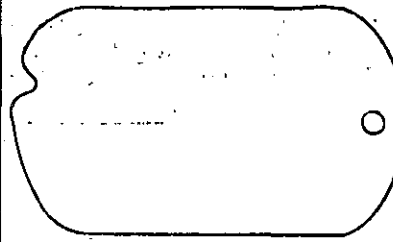



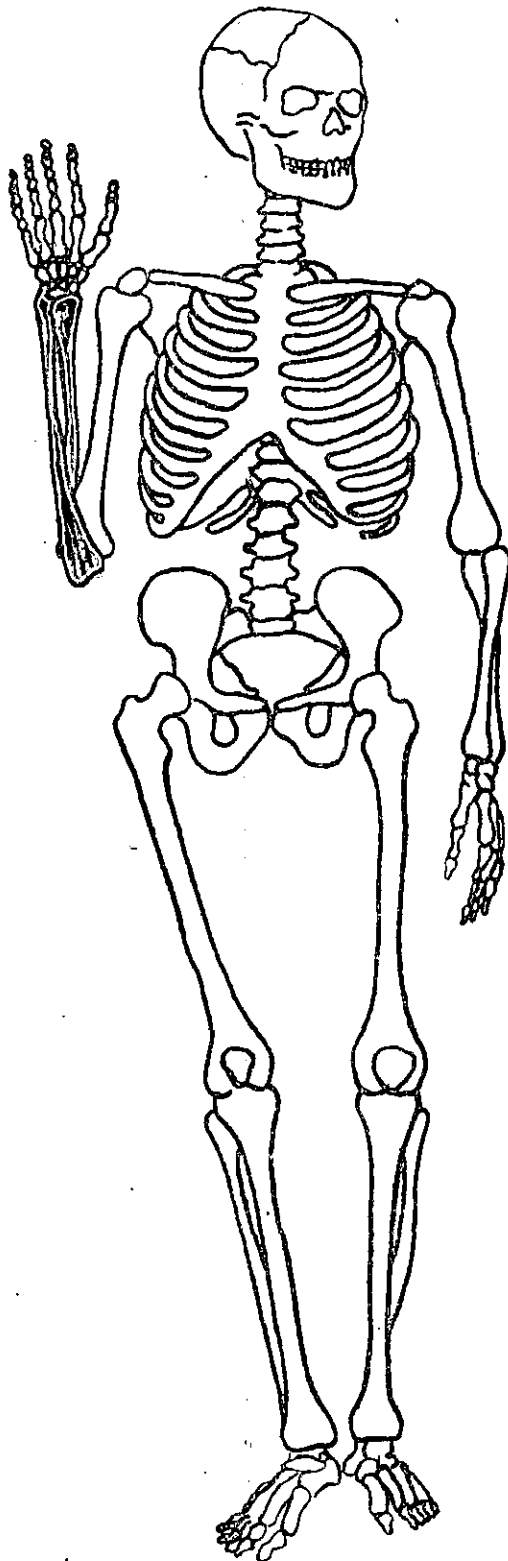

NARRATIVE

Case X-455 buried in Plot BE, Row 5, Grave 94, USMC La Cambe, was recovered as a mass burial of four men in skeletal form. The bones in all four cases were common among a mass.

The bones were laid out in anatomical order and all that remained were bones from the forearms of each case. In case A, two fibulae were recovered, a part of a right humerus and a few foot bones. The bones were measured and separated according to their size and structure.

It is possible that consolidation can be made with any of the cases referred to in below mentioned burial report.

Teeth were charted and placed with case A of this series.

No clothing was found.

A burial report was found in the debris which stated:

" This body disinterred from Common grave. (Buried by Germans-No " "
" records. With George E. TILLET, 13047453, X-450, X-451, X-452, " "
" X-453, X-454, X-456, and Edward A. BOCHNIASZ, 16016671, 5 mi. " "
" north-west of Pont-Hebert. "

This case is now separated into cases X-455 A, B, C, D respectively and each case remains Unknown. They are buried in one casket, due to the small amount of bones.
