formed an Engineer Task Force which assisted in taking Hill #122. The Normandy hedgerows were an obstacle that the 60th Eng. successfully breached, paving the way for the advance of Tanks and Infantry. The heaviest casualties occurred in the attack on St. Lo, mostly from Co "A", incurred from anti-personnel mines and mortar fire while sweeping for ~~the~~ mines.

1. Reference is made to GR Form #1, Report of Burial, for subject officer, which was forwarded to your office on Transmittal Letter #358 dated 6 September 1944.
2. Information received from HQ Third U.S. Army indicated Lt. MacIvor is not dead, but was evacuated to the United States on 18 August 1944. This information was the basis for initiating an investigation to determine the correct identity of deceased who was buried under subject officer's name.
3. Examination of the remains was affected and careful checking failed to establish positive identification of the deceased. No markings were found on the clothing and due to the advance stage of decomposition, tooth charts or fingerprints could not be taken.
4. In view of the results of this investigation, the remains buried in Plot P, Row 2, Grave 14, La Cambé American Military Cemetery, formerly buried as MacIvor, Alexander, ASN O-1324034, have been classified as unknown and have been assigned the number X-481.
