a. Unknown X-65, Plot E, Row 3, Grave 64.

(1) Body was completely destroyed, only skull and bones of arms remained.

(2) Field jacket, O.D. shirt were in shreds. Only small pieces of clothing remained, and laundry markings were not obtainable.

(3) Frontal portion of skull was destroyed, and as a result no teeth were found.

(4) It is the opinion that the body was possibly destroyed by fire in a vehicle.

b. Unknown X-66, Plot E, Row 3, Grave 66.

(1) Body was completely destroyed. Only bones of arms and legs remained.

(2) Trousers, O.D. socks, wool, undershirt, wool, and drawers, wool were visible. All clothing showed results of being burnt, and clothing marks were not obtainable.

(3) Skull of body was missing. No tooth chart could be made.

(4) Height, weight, color of hair, and eyes could not possibly be determined.

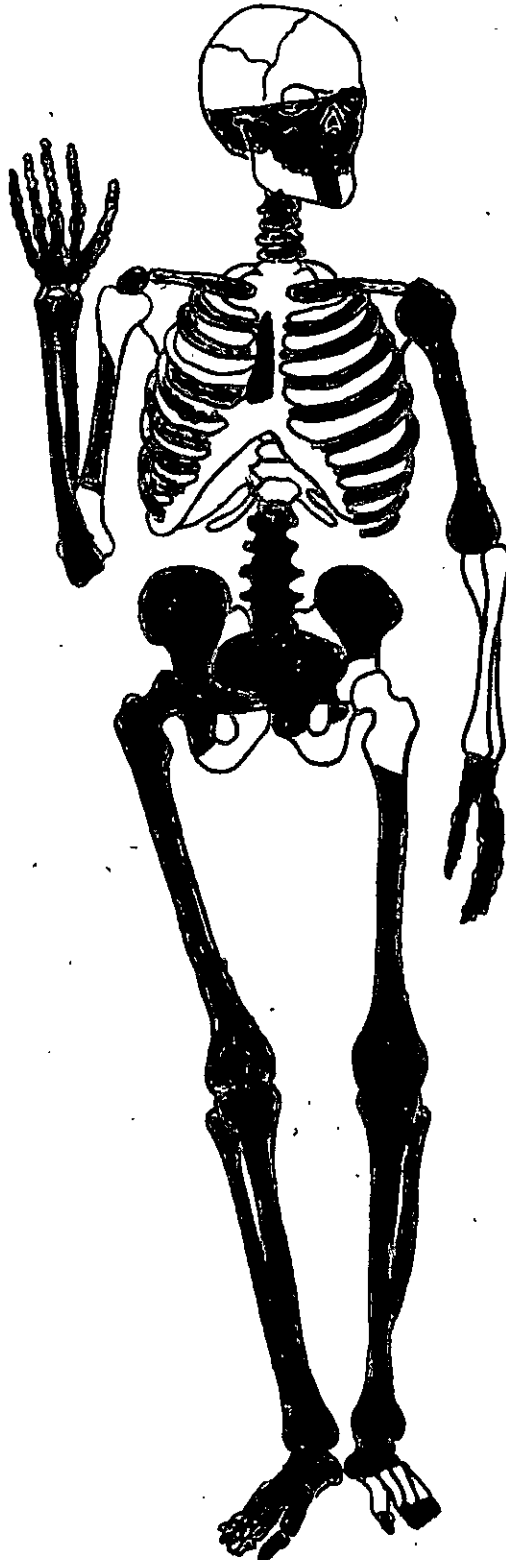

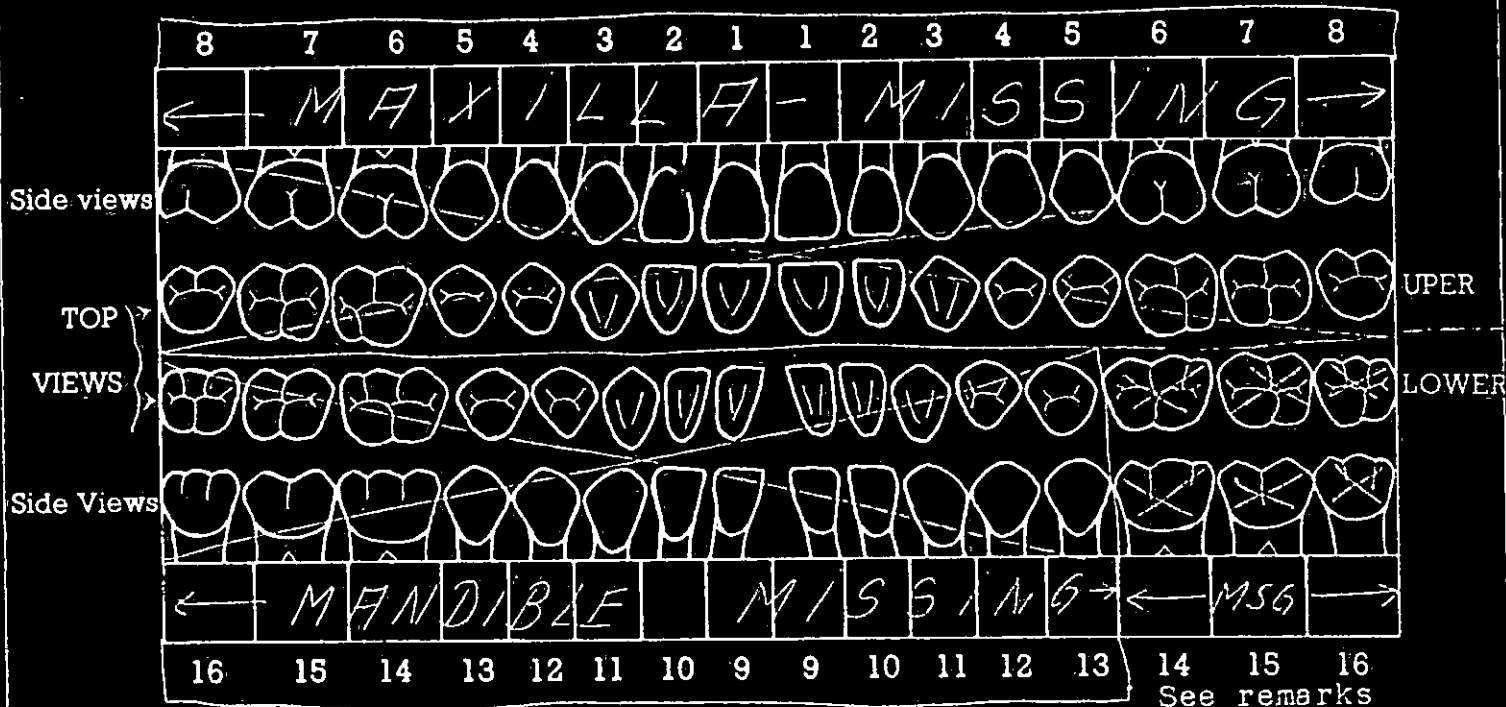
