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

Picture a very small, short, light bone, young man of 22 - 24 years of age. Unfortunately the skull is missing. Therefore, the "RACE" cannot be determined. The small size of the bones, with other primitive traits, are suggestive Native than white origin. Tibia presents backward tilting of the head, squatting facets at ankle joints, anterior bowing of the tibial shaft. All suggest primitive habits.

The polvis and long bones seem to characterise male.

Fluoroscopical examination not necessary. No teeth present.


