IDENTIFICATION LABORATORY REPORT

- 1. Search and Recovery Cases # 1029 and # 1030 consist of partial remains recently recovered from the foreigner's section of the community cemetery at Arneburg (M-53/Y-56), Germany. Available records indicate that two (2) W.S. airmen were buried in the community cemetery following the crash of their B-17 A/C # hh-83276 at Arneburg on 8 April 19h5. The seven (7) other casualties of this plane fell outside the community of Arneburg and were recovered from the commetery in nearby Krusemark.
- 2. The recently recovered remains have been compared with the skeletal charts of the two (2) casualties removed from Arneburg and found to agree with the physical characteristics and portions shown as missing for subject casualties as indicated below:

NOTE (*) The height and weight are not known for this casualty. The original processing report for X-5927 indicates, however, that the right humarus measured 31.2 cm, indicating an estimated height of $65~1/2^n$ which is exactly the same as indicated by the right radius recovered in Case SR # 1030.

3. RECOMMENDATIONS:

The recovery of the above partial remains has clarified certain questions pertaining to burials in the Arneburg semetery but subject portions do not affect the present identification of the associated remains. It is recommended, therefore, that these portions be designated CTL Remains.
