1. Forward herewith for your review and file is Narrative of Investigation dated 28 July 1953 and attached statements relating to recovery of partial remains assigned SR 526 A and B.

2. Portions recovered as SR 526 A can be associated with Pvt Kenneth A GOODHART, 36641773 now permanently interred USMC Neuville-en-Condroz. Portions designated as SR 526 B cannot be associated with above mentioned decedent or other known recoveries from this area.

3. In view of the above, these partial remains, SR 526 A and 526 B were designated CIL numbers 5075 and 5066 respectively. Attached hereto is the Record of CIL Remains Forms.

4. Advise is requested if your Office concurs in the above designation.

IDENTIFICATION LABORATORY REPORT

1. Search and recovery cases # 526-A and # 526-B represent partial remains found in the Huertgen Forest area just north of GERMETER. Portions designated SR # 526-A were found in a former dug-out along with an ID tag for "KENNETH GOODHART 36 641 773". Portions designated SR # 526-B were found approximately twenty-five (25) meters north of the dug-out.
2. Available records indicate that X-6557 (Neuville) was recovered at GERMETER and subsequently identified as the remains of Pvt Kenneth A. GOODHART by favorable physical characteristics and the presence of an ID card for Pvt GOODHART. The mandible recovered in the dug-out with the ID tag for Pvt GOODHART is in agreement with dental records for subject decedent. It is believed that the twelfth (12th) thoracic vertebra and the second (2nd) metatarsal foot bone as well as the mandible are portions missed during the original recovery of X-6557 (now identified as Pvt GOODHART).
3. Portions recovered as SR 526-B consist of a nearly complete right foot found in a size 9½ D Service shoe. These portions cannot be associated with the remains identified as Pvt GOODHART due to the differences in shoe sizes and the fact that major portions of the right foot are already present with that case.
4. These recoveries will retain their present SR designations pending further disposition instructions.

NARRATIVE OF INVESTIGATION

I. AUTHORITY AND MATTERS INVESTIGATED:

In compliance with investigation directive # 1082, Case Ger-3/Misc. dated 27 June 1953, an investigation was conducted at Huertgen (3-F/03), Germany in order to recover remains of an American World War II deceased, held for safekeeping at the German Military Cemetery Huertgen.

II. FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES:

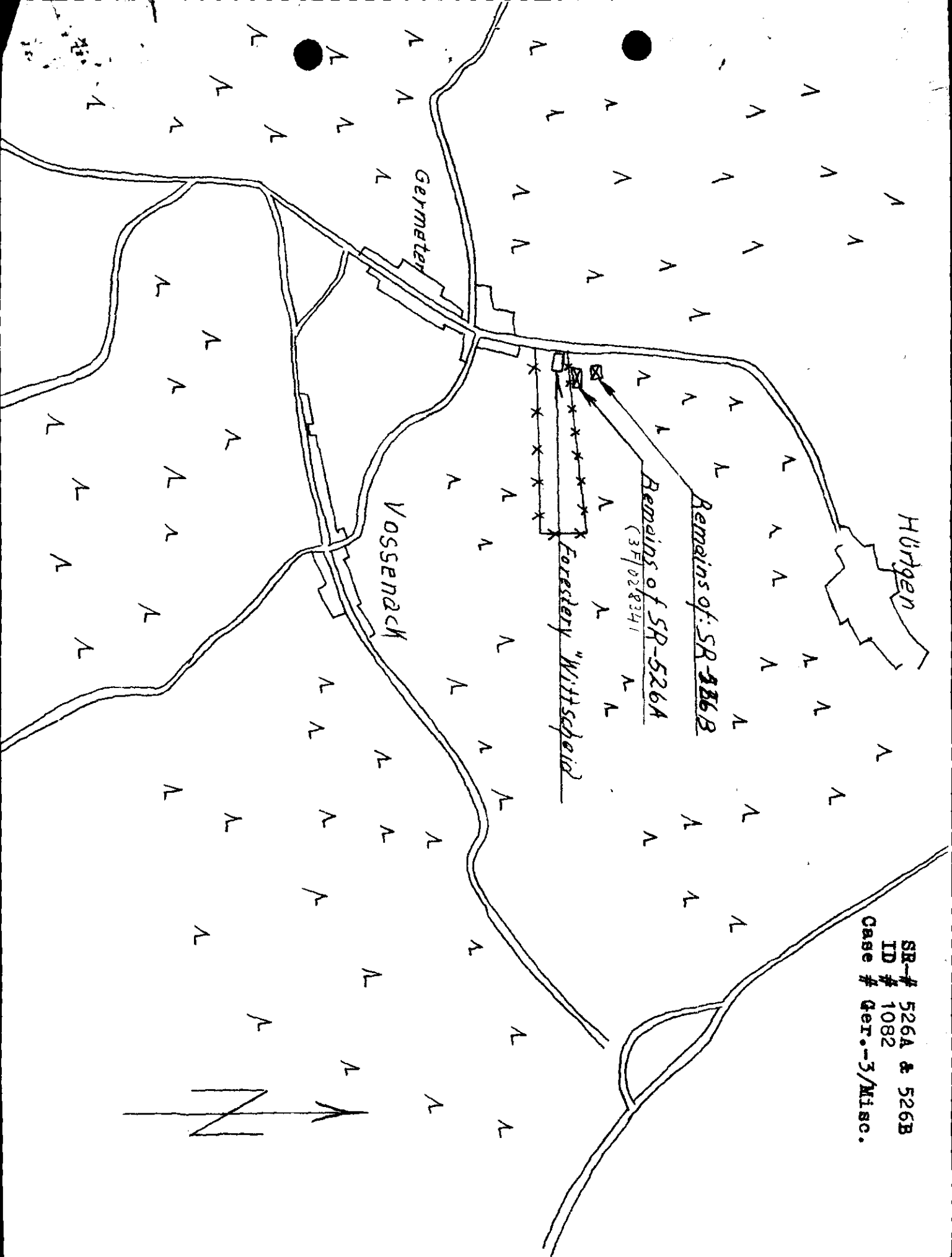
Information received by letter from the police station Huertgen concerns the finding of American World War II remains together with identification tag, inscribed "KENNETH GOODHART" during recent excavations conducted near the forestry station "Wittscheid".

Records this headquarters reveal that Pvt Kenneth A Goodhart, 36641773, who was killed in action in the vicinity of Germeter (3-F/0235), Germany on 17 November 1944, was recovered as Unknown X-6557 Neuville and later identified as subject casualty on the basis of identity card, height and color of hair, however, skull, mandible, some leg and foot bones were missing, as well as identification tags.

III. FINDINGS:

Arriving at Huertgen, police-master Herbst was interviewed. He stated that on 18 June 1953 during excavation operations in the former battle area Huertgen, 100 meters north of the forestry "Wittscheid" remnants of US Army clothing and several human remains were found. Upon a closer examination the identification tag of an American soldier was found, reading: KENNETH GOODHART.

The remains which were held for safekeeping in the Huertgen Military Cemetery were picked up by the undersigned investigator. Accompanied by police-master Herbst, the original place of discovery was visited. It was learned that the remains in question had been recovered from a former dug-out (Ger-3F/028341). With the help of three (3) local laborers the dug-out and the surrounding area were excavated. With the exception of a mandible and two (2) ribs no further human remains could be found. These remains were assigned SR #526A.

On 13 June 1953, during excavation operations in the former battle area "Huertgen", 100 meters north of the forestry Mittscheid, remnants of uniforms and several human skeletal remains were found. Upon a closer examination the identification tag of an American soldier was found, reading: KENNETH GONDHART, residing Villa Park III.

The caretaker of the military cemetery in Huertgen, Herr Franke, has taken custody of the remains found. The identification tag is hereby submitted to the police Kreis with the request that action be taken to inform the American authorities, who will, as to our knowledge, attend themselves to further excavation operations at the location where the remains have been found.

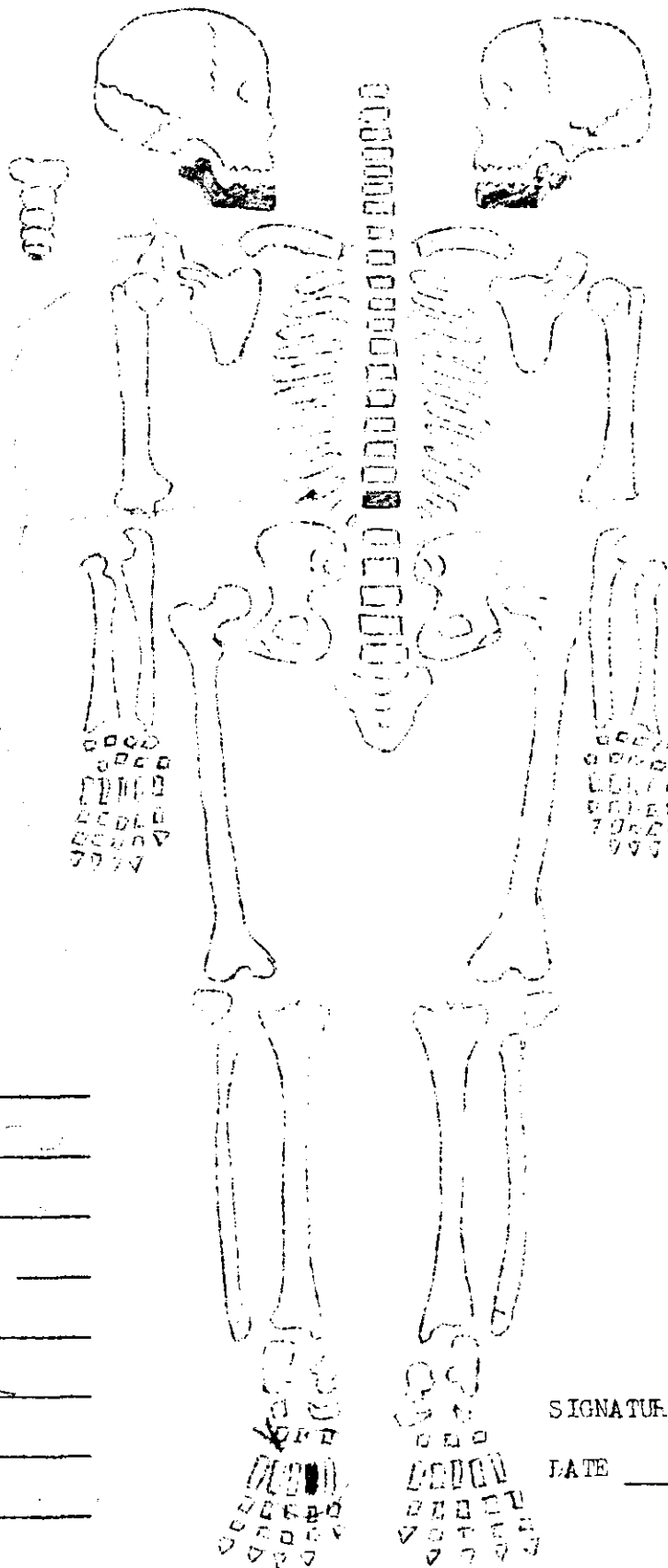

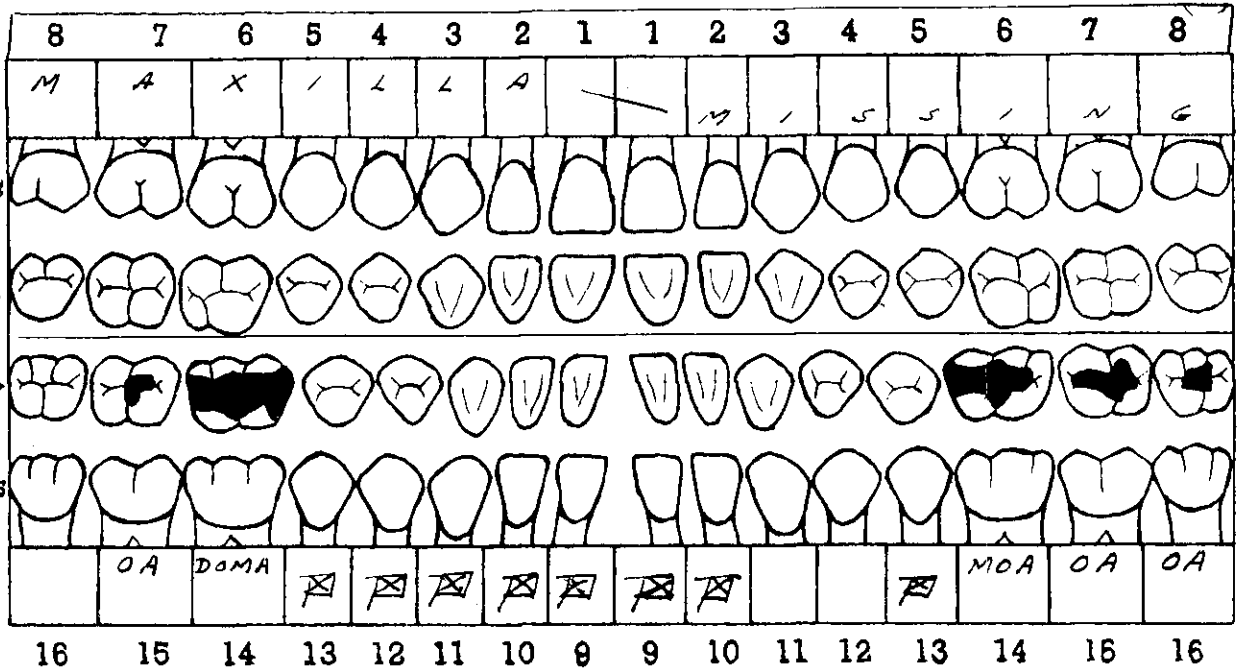

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.
