MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD - (Lee, Extension: 72947)

- 1. Board Proceedings recommending identification of Slc Bernard L. Wolfe, 541 804, USCGR, were received in this Office 10 November 1955. The remains which were extremely fragmentary, were recovered from inside of LCI (L) 91 on Omaha Beach, Normandy, France. No teeth were recovered.
- 2. Board Proceedings were based on information furnished by this Office that Slc Wolfe was the only casualty aboard LCI (L) 91, and favorable comparison of physical characteristics.
- 3. Further investigation has disclosed that this information was erroneous and that there were actually five (5) casualties, including Slc Wolfe, aboard LCI (L) 91. The other four (4) deceased have been identified, three (3) by ID tags and one (1) by fingerprints.
- 4. In view of the very fragmentary nature of the remains designated Unknown X-9252, this case was discussed by Mrs. Lee with Captain Albera, and it was agreed that the available evidence is insufficient to support the identification.
- 5. Radio is being dispatched to the Field advising them that the Board Proceedings have been cancelled, recommending that the Unknown be designated CIL remains and requesting that this Office be advised the number assigned. NAPRATIVE OF INVESTIGATION

I. AUTHORITY AND MATTERS INVESTIGATED:

In accordance with instructions cutlined in Investigation Directive # 1230, this headquarters, dated 11 May 1955, an investigation was conducted at Omaha Beach near St. Laurent sur Mer (8/T-68) Calvados, France concerning the recovery of a partial remains from the wreckage of a landing craft.

II. FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES:

A report received by telephone from Mr. Gibbs in the Paris office of ABMC indicated that partial remains of a casualty had been recovered during extreme low tide from the wreckage of a landing craft by personnel of USMC St. Laurent, France.

III. FINDINGS:

The undersigned arrived at the St. Laurent cemetery on 13 June 1955 but learned that additional search would only be practicable during the next extreme low tides of 20, 21, and 22 June. Other investigations in the area were conducted during the interim and a first visit to the site of recovery was made the afternoon of 20 June 1955.

The undersigned accompanied by two (2) French workers from the cemetery proceeded to the recovery site with a GMC $2\frac{1}{2}$ ton truck with winch. The site of recovery is located at the aft portion of what appears to be the hulk of an ICI. The lower portion is buried in the sand and mud and the previously exposed upper structure has been cut away by salvage crews. The exact length of the ship could not be determined as the aft section was recently exploded by a mine in an added attempt to recover more metal. The breadth (beam) of the ship is approximately twenty-three (23) feet (See sketch Exhibit $^{n}A^{n}$).

The Italian concern which first cut away the exposed structure several years ago is no longer working in the area and could not be contacted for the purpose of identifying the craft.

On the afternoon of 20 June a great amount of sheet metal sections and bed frames were pulled away from the recovery site with the truck winch. The area where the recovery had been made was searched by digging and bailing out an area of approximately two (2) square meters. No additional skeletal portions were found at that time.

(Narrative of Investigation, dated 29 June 1955, ID # 1230, cont'd)

The next afternoon Mr. Darbes, cemetery superintendent at USMC St. Laurent, assisted the undersigned with the additional help of the two (2) French laborers. The same area was enlarged an additional two (2) square meters and although no skeletal parts were found an ID tag for "Douglas R. BECKETT 570797 USCGR" was recovered.

At 0430 hours the morning of 22 June 1955 the undersigned proceeded to enlarge the area of search still more but was handicapped by water seepage. All sand removed from the area was used to build a dam surrounding the site and the seepage was removed by bucket. Additional bed frames, supporting chains and miscellaneous piping and metal parts were removed but large sections of decking were encountered which prevented further search except in a limited area. Mr. Darkes and Mr. Wing arrived at 0545 hours accompanied by the two (2) French cemetery laborers and the search was continued until 0730 when the incoming tide made further search impossible. No additional skeletal portions were found but a British "half penny" coin was recovered in approximately the same location where the ID tag and originally recovered skeletal parts had been found. It was decided that no further search be made with the equipment available at that time.

The original searches performed by the cemetery personnel resulted in the finding of the following skeletal portions:

- A. Proximal 9/10 right humerus.
- B. One (1) right scapula.
- C. One (1) right clavicle.
- D. Nine (9) right ribs.
- E. Seven (7) thoracic vertebrae.
- F. Four (4) lumbar vertebrae.
- G. Distal 3/4 left tibia.
- H. Shaft of left fibula.

Equipment found in the same location during the initial recoveries included:

- A. One (1) US rifle caliber .30 M-1 Serial number # 1390353.
- B. Cne (1) US mess kit.
- C. One (1) US canteen with canteen cup and carrier.
- D. One (1) Metal snap fastener stamped "RAU FASTENER CO. FROV. R.I."

(Narrative of Investigation, dated 29 June 1955, ID # 1230, cont'd)

IV. CONCLUSIONS:

The skeletal portions and equipment listed above were packaged and designated SR Case # 789 and removed to the Central Identification Laboratory in Frankfurt/Main, Germany for further examination.

A further search of subject recovery site is only deemed praticable if sixtable engineer equipment is available. It is suggested that qualified Engineer personnel survey the location to determine if a coffer dam could be constructed around the after protions of the sunken craft and a water suction pump be utilized to eliminate the problem of sand and water seepage. Cutting torches and heavy winch equipment is also deemed necessary to remove the metal which covers most of the search area.

V. RECOLMENDATIONS:

It is recommended that an attempt be made to determine if DOUGIAS R. BECKETT, 570 797, US Coast Guard Reserve is recorded as a casualty. It is further recommended that action be taken to identify the landing craft by association of the ID tag for DOUGIAS R. BECKETT with crew rosters of landing ships lost during the invasion at Omaha Beach. If the sunken craft can be identified then it is also recommended that an attempt be made to associate the recovered remains with a missing casualty from subject landing craft.

Recommendation is also made to send a letter of appreciation and possibly a monetary reward to Mr. ANGERS living at St. Laurent sur Mer, France who made the initial discovery of the skeletal remains and reported his findings to the cemetery personnel.

Such action on the part of this headquarters would spur interest and search activity of local citizens who spend considerable time "combing" the beach. Further, a letter of appreciation to Mr. Marcel Le FLEM living at Colville sur Mer, France is considered necessary in view of his valuable aid in the search and his finding of the ID tag for DOUGIAS R. PECKETT.
