DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY OFFICE OF THE QUARTERMASTER GENERAL MEMORIAL DIVISION WASHINGTON 25, D. C.

A Board of Officers appointed by paragraph 1, Division Order No. 1, dated 15 January 1958 (Tab A), convened at 1000 hours, 8 MA 1958, and after consideration of the following factors, approved the identification of Unknown X-9298, Frankfurt Mausoleum, as unidentifiable and SR #5018 (B) as CIL remains.

Reference is made to the attached letter, Headquarters, United States Army, Quartermaster Mortuary System, Europe, dated 21 November 1957, Subject: "Letter of Transmittal" which pertains to Unknowns X-9296, X-9297, X-9298 and SR #5018 (B).

The remains of three unknowns were discovered by a resident of the area who was probing in a section of the USS Glennon wreckage which was sunk at Utah Beach on 8 June 1944 during the invasion of the Normandy coast at St. Marie du Mont, France. The remains designated SR #5016, SR #5017 and SR #5018 were recovered during the search conducted on 20 - 24 August 1957 by an American search team and removed to the Frankfurt Mausoleum, Processing of these remains resulted in the remains being redesignated Unknowns X-9296, X-9297 and X-9298 with the extra remains found in the processing of SR #5018 being redesignated SR #5018 (B).

An attempt to associate Unknowns X-9296, X-9297 and X-9298 with an unresolved casualty of the USS GLENNON (list attached - Tab B) has resulted in Unknown X-9296 being recommended for identification as Slc John J. Lausted, SN 609 23 21, Unknown X-9297 as unidentifiable, previously submitted and approved 10 March 1958, Unknown X-9298 as unidentifiable and SR #5018 (B) as CIL remains. SR #5018 (B) consists only of several shattered bones of the skull, scapula and pelvis and undoubtedly represents portions of the remains of a foreign national since the age is estimated to be that of a person approximately 15 years old. Recommendation pertaining to Unknown X-9296 is being submitted simultaneously with this case. (See Tab C for comparison charts for the above unknowns.)

The initials "H.E.A." inscribed on a ring found common with the remains corresponds to the initials of Coxswain Harley E. Alexander, SN 626 78 30, USNR, who was assigned to the USS GLENNON and who was missing in action on 8 June 1944 during the invasion of France. His remains were determined to be nonrecoverable in 1949. Dental and physical characteristics for Alexander do not compare favorably with Unknown X-9298.

SUBJECT: Memorial Division Board of Review

- 1. Establishment. Under provisions of AR 15-6, dated 25 July 1955, there is hereby established the Memorial Division Board of Review (hereinafter referred to as the Board) to assist the Chief, Memorial Division, in the resolution of special cases which involve the identifiability, non-identifiability, or nonrecoverability of the remains of deceased persons.
- 2. Membership. The Board will consist of three (3) officers. The President of the Board will be designated by the Chief, Memorial Division. One member, as designated by the President, will act as recorder for the Board and will be responsible for the documentation of the findings of the Board.
- 3. Authority. In the resolution of all cases referred to in paragraph 1 above, the Board will serve as the reviewing channel between the operating branch and the Division Chief. The Board is authorized to review all such cases as are referred through it to the Division Chief. After documentation of its findings, the Board will recommend the approval of the Division Chief or his designated representative or return the case to the operating branch for reconsideration of its determinations.
- 4. <u>Duties</u>. The Board is charged with the following duties and responsibilities:
- a. Establish a set of standards and procedures to determine the adequacy, authenticity, and completeness of records which serve as an operating basis for the Board.
- b. Review case history reports concerning the identifiability of recovered remains as submitted by the operating branch.
- c. Review case history reports concerning the non-identifiability of individual recovered remains and the non-identifiability of individual remains from group recoveries.



- 1. Reference letter your Office BUNED-1552-RLT-et, 21 July 1958, Subject: Leasted, John J., SIC 6092321 USBE, deceased (WH II) and other World War II recovered remains, and to interim reply from this Office dated 27 August 1958, file and subject as above.
- 2. Inclosed is a copy of the letter, dated 27 August 1958, from this Office to the United States Army Mertmary, Europe, requesting representing of the remains recovered from the USS GLENNON, and copies of 1st Indorsement and Supplemental Laboratory Report which are in answer to that request.
- 3. It is the epinion of this Office that the bones of the bedies are properly segregated and the partions of the skull and teeth properly placed, and that the identification of 19296 as Lausted is firmly based on the following factors:
- a. The mandible with the remains designated X-9296 by the United States Army Mortumry, Enrope, and identified by this Office as Lausted, definitely belongs to Lausted.
- b. From the first section of the wreckage to be dragged ashere two incomplete remains were recovered. These were designated I-9296 and I-9297. Attached as Inclosure 3 are copies of the Skeletal Charte for those remains. Based on the physical characteristics I-9296 is considered Leasted.
- a complete skull with mandible was recovered along with a right polyis, a rib, and the proximal 2 of a left fibule. The skull, with mandible mas designated I-9296 and the remaining pertions belonged with I-9296.

It is believed that the shall was from the second section of the ship but that the extra pertions were dishadged from the first section and were either dragged up by the second section or uncovered from the beech send when the second section was dragged ashere.

- h. If the identification of X-9896 as lausted is accepted by the Many, X-9897 and X-9890 will be intered in an overees cometery as Unknowns.
- 5. Reference puragraph 3 of your letter of 2k July 1958 pertaining to Group Burial. It is established policy that known group burials be returned to the United States for final interment in a Matienal Cometary, This policy was set furth initially in War Department Memorandom No. 30-1820-1 dated 9 September 1966. This practice was adopted so that the ment of kin, or other intermeted individuals, would have an apportunity to attend the interment service.
- 6. The National Cometery is designated by this Office for group burials after consideration of the residences of the known mext of kin, available grave space, commercial transportation facilities, hetel accommodations, etc. If it is still the desire of the Navy to establish a group burial of these remains, it is requested that a roster be furnished this Office sharing the name and surrent address of the next of kin, of each of the trusty decedents, whe would have directed disposition of the remains had individual identification been made, and the name, relationship and surrent address of any other persons to be notified, by the Cometery Superintendent, of the date and hour of interment services. This Office will consider any National Cometery suggested by the Navy. A list of National Cometeries is inclosed.
- 7. If a group burial is established it will be the New's responsibility to advise the next of kin of the twenty individuals of the ressons for the group burial, and that the group will be returned to the United States for interment in a National Competery. It is recommended that this notification be made after the National Competery has been selected. In this promoction your attention is invited to the provisions of Public Law 85-716, approved 21 August 1958.
- 5. After the remains arrive in the United States it will be the responsibility of the Superintendent of the National Cometery to arrange for the interment service and to advise the next of kin of the date and hour of such service.


