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

- l. Reference letter your Office BUMED-4542-RLT-wb, 24 July 1958, Subject: Lausted, John J., SIC 6092321 USNR, deceased (WW II) and other World War II recovered remains, and to interim reply from this Office dated 27 August 1958, file and subject as above.
- 2. Inclosed is a copy of the letter, dated 27 August 1958, from this Office to the United States Army Mortuary, Europe, requesting reprocessing of the remains recovered from the USS GLENNON, and copies of 1st Indorsement and Supplemental Laboratory Report which are in answer to that request.
- 3. It is the opinion of this Office that the bones of the bodies are properly segregated and the portions of the skull and teeth properly placed, and that the identification of 19296 as Lausted is firm, based on the following factors:
- a. The mandible with the remains designated X-9296 by the United States Army Mortuary, Europe, and identified by this Office as Lausted, definitely belongs to Lausted.
- b. From the first section of the wreckage to be dragged ashore two incomplete remains were recovered. These were designated X-9296 and X-9297. Attached as Inclosure 3 are copies of the Skeletal Charts for these remains. Based on the physical characteristics X-9296 is considered Lausted.
- c. After the second section of the ship had been dragged ashore a complete skull with mandible was recovered along with a right pelvis, a rib, and the proximal 1 of a left fibula. The skull, with mandibles was designated X-9298 and the remaining portions belonged with X-9296.

It is believed that the skull was from the second section of the ship but that the extra portions were dislodged from the first section and were either dragged up by the second section or uncovered from the beach sand when the second section was dragged ashore.

- li. If the identification of X-9296 as Lausted is accepted by the Navy, X-9297 and X-9298 will be interred in an oversea cometery as Unknowns.
- 5. Reference paragraph 3 of your letter of 24 July 1958 pertaining to Group Burial. It is established policy that known group burials be returned to the United States for final interment in a National Cemetery. This policy was set forth initially in War Department Memorandum No. 30-1820-1 dated 9 September 1946. This practice was adopted so that the next of kin, or other interested individuals, would have an opportunity to attend the interment service.
- 6. The National Cemetery is designated by this Office for group burials after consideration of the residences of the known next of kin, available grave space, commercial transportation facilities, hotel accommodations, etc. If it is still the desire of the Navy to establish a group burial of these remains, it is requested that a roster be furnished this Office showing the name and current address of the next of kin, of each of the twenty decedents, who would have directed disposition of the remains had individual identification been made, and the name, relationship and current address of any other persons to be notified, by the Cemetery Superintendent, of the date and hour of interment services. This Office will consider any National Cemetery suggested by the Navy. A list of National Cemeteries is inclosed.
- 7. If a group burial is established it will be the Navy's responsibility to advise the next of kin of the twenty individuals of the reasons for the group burial, and that the group will be returned to the United States for interment in a National Cemetery. It is recommended that this notification be made after the National Cemetery has been selected. In this connection your attention is invited to the provisions of Public Law 85-716, approved 21 August 1958.
- 6. After the remains arrive in the United States it will be the responsibility of the Superintendent of the National Cemetery to arrange for the interment service and to advise the next of kin of the date and hour of such service.

SUBJECT: Unknown X-9296, X-9297, X-9298 and CIL 5101 (Frankfurt)

#### INTRODUCTION:

- l. These identification comments concern the identification processing of four individual skeletal remains recovered from the salvaged U.S.S. Glennon which sank off Hermandy Beach, France on 8 June 19hb.
- 2. The remains were discovered by Miss Francine Van Richetal of Carenten, France who was probing in a section of the U.S.S. Glennon wreckage which had been cut away and hauled ashere. It is quite probable that portions of remains were lost during the movement of the wreckage to shore for further cutting up and dismentling.

#### RECOVERY:

- 1. SR #5016 (X-9296) and SR #5017 (X-9297) were recovered from the forward portion of the arealogs.
- 2. SR #5018A (X-9298) and SR #5018B (CIL 5101) were subsequently recovered when second section of ship was hauled eshere.

#### PROCESSIM:

- 1. These remains were processed for identification by identification personnel of the U. S. Army Hortuary, and Dr. Hans Fleischhacker, University of Frankfurt Anthropological Institute, Frankfurt/Main Germany. The remains were processed into four cases with tentative unknown numbers of I-9296, I-9297, I-9298 and CIL #5101.
- 2. Original examination indicated the presence of long bones for 2 individuals; I skull and 3 mandibles with teeth; and a few small portions too young to be associated with U. S. military personnel. The skeletal parts were segregated by length, weight, form, age, articulation between long bones, and head of fewer with acetabulum. The segregation procedure resulted in establishing two (2) adult casualties of nearly equal height, but differ in weight approximation. The slightly shorter casualty was heavier and of larger skeletal structure.

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#### IDENTIFICATION COMMENTS

SUBJECT: Unknown I-9295, X-9297, X-9298 and CIL 5101 (Frankfurt)

- 2. Unknown X-9296 consisted of a mandible, long bones, the inominate area, one vertebras and fragments of ribs. The tasth were intact in a damaged and eroded mandible having age indication of approximately 25 years based on degree of tooth abrasion and errupted 3rd molars. The mandible was placed with X-9296 because of non-contradiction to age and weight formation. The dental characteristics of X-9296 are extremely favorable to the dentition of Jehn L. Lausted, 609 23 21, 0.5.%, comparison with the other 19 Dental Records, pertaining to personnel involved in this case disclosed that the dentition could only have belonged to Lausted.
- 3. Unknown X-9297 consisted of a skull w/mandible, long bones, portion of right inequate, a few ribs and vertebras. The teeth were intact in a damaged and eroded mandible having age indication of approximately 22 years based on minimum wear and unerupted 3rd molars. Skull w/mandible was placed with X-9297 because of similar light weight formation and favorable association between the approximated breadths of corresponding mandibular fosses of the skull and coronoid/condyloid process of the mandible. The dental characteristics were compared with Dental mecords for the 20 personnel involved in this case. Lack of individual characteristics resulted in a negative comparison.
- h. Unknown X-9296 consists of a complete skull w/associated mandible. The mandible articulates and occludes with the skull, the teeth have numerous gold inlays. The portions are undamaged, uncroded and are dark in color as contrasted with all other portions recovered which are blesched and croded in varing degrees. The numerous gold inlay dental work indicates this skull may be indigent to the European continent. Dental characteristics for X-9298 were compared with Dental Records for the 20 personnel involved in this case. The result was negative.
- 5. CIL 5101 (Frankfurt) consists of skull, scapula and pelvic portions for an individual considerably younger than any U. S. military personnel.

REPROCESSING: During re-examination of these remains, Ultra-violet light, Spectrograph, Spectrophotometer, Infra-red light, X-ray diffraction analysis, microscopic, and examination of granular structure were utilized to assist in the proper placement of the portions concerned. This re-examination revealed no additional cluse which could be utilized for a more precise placement for the portions.

SUBJECT: Unknown I-9296, I-9297, I-9298 and CIL 5101 (Frankfurt)
PACTS:

- 1. The two mandibles in question were recovered along with soosmpanying long bones from the forward portion of the wreckage.
- 2. The skull designated as X-9298 was subsequently recovered along with a few other bone portions, when the second section of the wrockage was dragged ashers.
- 3. The two mandibles were placed with the respective skeletal remains based on approved scientific criteria.
- h. The two mendibles recovered from the forward portion of the wreckage are related to the long bones recovered at the same time.
- 5. Dental characteristics (gold inlays) are common to European dental practice.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. That I-9296 be identified as Lausted.
- 2. That I-9297 be declared unidentifiable.
- 3. That I-9298 be declared unidentifiable.

A Board of Officers appointed by paragraph 1, Division Order No. 1, dated 15 January 1958, convened at <u>0900</u> hours, <u>10 MAYCh</u> 1958, and after consideration of the following factors, approved the identification of Unknown X-9297, Frankfurt Mausoleum, as unidentifiable.

Reference is made to the attached letter, Headquarters, United States Army, Quartermaster Mortuary System, Europe, dated 21 November 1957, Subject: "Letter of Transmittal" which pertains to Unknowns X-9296, X-9297, X-9298 and SR #5018 (B).

The remains of three unknowns were discovered by a resident of the area who was probing in a section of the USS Glennon wreckage which was sunk at Utah Beach on 8 June 1944 during the invasion of the Normandy coast at St. Marie du Mont, France. The remains designated SR #5016, SR #5017 and SR #5018 were removed to the Frankfurt Mausoleum by an American search team presumably in November 1957 since the Identification and Laboratory Report furnishes no date. Processing of these remains resulted in the remains being redesignated Unknowns X-9296, X-9297 and X-9298 with the extra remains found in the processing of SR #5018 being redesignated SR #5018 (B).

An attempt to associate these unknowns with unresolved casualties resulted in Unknown X-9297 being considered unidentifiable based on the lack of distinctive dental and physical data for positive association. The Identification Laboratory Report states that teeth were placed with each remains and that there is no definite association involved. The initials "H.E.A." inscribed on a ring found common with the remains of Unknowns X-9296, X-9297 and X-9298 correspond to the initials of Coxswain Harley E. Alexander, SN 626 78 30, USNR, who was assigned to the USS Glennon and who was missing in action on 8 June 1944 during the invasion of France. A comparison of the identifying data of Unknown X-9297 with that of this decedent does not compare favorably. The two other unknowns, X-9296 and X-9298, are under consideration for possible future identification.

In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that remains designated Unknown X-9297, Frankfurt Mausoleum, be declared unidentifiable.



SUBJECT: Memorial Division Board of Review

- 1. Establishment. Under provisions of AR 15-6, dated 25 July 1955, there is hereby established the Memorial Division Board of Review (hereinafter referred to as the Board) to assist the Chief, Memorial Division, in the resolution of special cases which involve the identifiability, non-identifiability, or nemrecoverability of the remains of deceased persons.
- 2. <u>Membership</u>. The Board will consist of three (3) officers. The President of the Board will be designated by the Chief, Memorial Division. One member, as designated by the President, will act as recorder for the Board and will be responsible for the documentation of the findings of the Board.
- 3. Authority. In the resolution of all cases referred to in paragraph 1 above, the Board will serve as the reviewing channel between the operating branch and the Division Chief. The Board is authorized to review all such cases as are referred through it to the Division Chief. After documentation of its findings, the Board will recommend the approval of the Division Chief or his designated representative or return the case to the operating branch for reconsideration of its determinations.
- 4. <u>Duties</u>. The Board is charged with the following duties and responsibilities:
- a. Establish a set of standards and procedures to determine the adequacy, authenticity, and completeness of records which serve as an operating basis for the Board.
- b. Review case history reports concerning the identifiability of recovered remains as submitted by the operating branch.
- c. Review case history reports concerning the non-identifiability of individual recovered remains and the non-identifiability of individual remains from group recoveries.

- 4. It was reported by Miss Elekstall, who found the remains, that portions composing X-9296 and X-9297 were first recovered from the wreckage. Case X-9298 consisting of a complete skull with mandible, a right pelvis, a rib and the proximal 1/4 of a left fibula was found later after a second section of the ship had been dragged ashore. Laboratory examination revealed that the portion of fibula and the right pelvis were actually missing portions of case X-9296 and have now been placed with that remains along with the rib portion. Although teeth have been placed with each remains as charted there is no definite association involved. Insufficient portions are present to establish association by articulation. The similarity of age, weight, size and form also prevents a positive association of the skulls and/or teeth with the proper remains.
- 5. Personal effects recovered with subject remains includes one (1) 10 K gold ring bearing the initials "H E A"; one (1) pair of gold rimless eyeglasses.
- 6. The remains designated SR #5018 (B) consists of skull, scapule and pelvic portions for an individual considerably younger than any U. S. military personnel and is recommended to be designated as C.I.L. Remains.
