He was an American soldien who died in World War II. He was Caucasian, medium build, and approximately 70 inches tall. The words "Here rests in honored glory a comrade in arms, known but to God," are inscribed on the white marble cross that marks his grave at Ardennes American Cemetery and Memorial near Liege, Belgium.

Belgian veterans, schoolchildren, embassy representatives, and American officials attended the military burial of this unknown soldier Nov. 8. His casket, draped with a U.S. flag, was carried from the Ardennes memorial by six uniformed, white gloved pallbearers to a hearse and then driven to the burial site. Because he was unknown, Protestant, Catholic, and Jewish clergymen offered prayers at the grave-side service.

A squad from the U.S. Army Memorial Affairs Activity, Europe, (USAMAAE), three seven-shot volleys. Taps were played as pallbearers held the flag steady over the coffin. After folding it neatly, the relay was presented to Maj. Gen. Lawrence M. Jones, Jr., commander of the 21st Support Command. Jones saluted the colors in remembrance and accepted the flag on behalf of the dead soldier's family. Representatives of numerous veterans' groups filed by, lowering their regimental banners in tribute. Belgian citizens kneeled in prayer at the grave. A small schoolboy placed a three-flower bouquet by the cross.

Last Jan. 14, a German citizen looking for WWII souveniers found the soldier's remains and some war artifacts in the forest at Losheimer Grassen, Belgium. Using a

metal dectector the man also uncovered an American helmet, part of a mine detector, and a segment of an American sub-machine gun. He informed German authorities, who told American officials of the discovery. Two weeks later, the remains were turned over to a recovery team from USA-MAE. A snowstorm ended an effort to search the forest for additional remains and artifacts, and the attempt was re-

scheduled for April.

On their second attempt, the team, supervised by Capt. Michael Willson, commander, USAMAAE, and John G. Rogers, mortuary officer, was successful. After searching a 100-meter area, they retrieved pieces of weapons, landmines, and tankers. Further identifying data and remains were not found.

Being unable to identify the remains,

USAMAAE informed its headquarters in Washington, D.C. that the remains were believed to be those of a U.S. soldier. They requested war records be researched to see if any man was listed as missing in that area of Belgium. Washington couldn't associate a name with the remains and directed USAMAAE, located in Frankfurt, to bury him as an unknown American soldier. The seven-man firing sound (Sp4's Wil-

Of the unknown soldier, Jones said, "He was probably tired, terrified, cold and hungry. Nobody knew where he was, so he died alone. Thirty years later he was found where he fell. The grace for soldiers asks that we remember the young soldiers prepared to give their lives for their country, and asks citizens and those in senior positions to be worthy of this sacrifice. It's a sobering thought. WW II was a holocaust in which several million died, and it should never happen again."



A Board of Officers appointed by Letter Orders, DAAG-ZX, dated 16 September 1976 (Tab A) convened <u>19 SFPTEMBER</u> 1978, and after consideration of the factors presented, approved the Unidentifiability of Unknown X-9443 (S&R 5127), U. S. Army Memorial Affairs Activity, Europe, Frankfurt, Germany.

- 1. Case papers received from the US Army Memorial Affairs Activity, Europe, Frankfurt, Germany, indicate that portions of skeletal remains had been recovered from a wooded area in Belgium near Losheimer Graben which is on the German/Belgian border. The remains had been recovered by a German citizen who resides in Cologne, West Germany. No identification tags were found, however, parts of an American type mine detector with inscription "HOLT", as well as an American helmet with the number "5007" painted on the inside, were found.
- 2. A search team from the Frankfurt Mortuary visited Cologne in February 1978, examined the recovered portions, and determined they were insufficient for positive identification. They requested the German citizen to direct them to the recovery site, however, when heavy snow in the area forced them to turn back, the team returned to Frankfurt with the recovered remains and equipment. In April 1978, the team returned to Cologne and traveled to the recovery site. After a thorough search of the site, no additional remains or ID media were found.
- 3. Upon examination of the remains, designated Unknown X-9443 (S&R 5127), it was determined that these are portions of an adult male of average muscularity with an estimated height of 70.1" (left tibia). Paucity of the recovered portions preclude racial determination or more precise age estimation. The mandible and maxilla are missing and no loose teeth were found.
- 4. According to available Outline History of US Army Divisions, elements of the 9th Infantry Division were committed to the Losheim area. The only direct reference to Losheim appears in the Order of Battle Series of the 9th Division "... the 9th crossed the Marne 28 Aug (44), swept through Saarlautern, and in Nov and Dec held defensive positions from Monschau to Losheim."

### CONCLUSION:

While supporting evidence indicates that Unknown X-9443 may be a US serviceman based on the name "HOLT" and the number "5007" appearing on American type equipment, the lack of identifying media and the paucity of the remains precludes an association at this time with an unresolved casualty of World War II.

### 1. CIRCUMSTANCES OF RECOVERY AND INVESTIGATION OF SUBJECT REMAINS:

- a. On 17 January 1978, this office received a telephone call from Mr. Reinhard Scholtis, a German citizen residing in Cologne, West Germany with the following information: "On 14 Jan 78, I recovered human bones minus the head of an BTB/American in wooded area in Belgium near to Losheimer Graben which is on the German/Belgian border. No ID tag was found. I found parts of an American type, mine detector with inscription "HOLT" on it and an American helmet with the number "5007" painted on the inside, therefore I believe these to be remains of an American Soldier from WW II".
- b. On 1 and 2 February 1978, the undersigned and two enlisted GR Specialists went to Cologne to investigate the recovery made by Mr. Scholtis.

I examined the recovered portions and determined they were insufficient for positive identification and requested Mr. Scholtis direct us to the recovery site for an attempt to recover additional portions and/or ID media. On 2 Feb 78, we drove to the German/Belgian border and had to turn back due to heavy snow in the area. We returned to the Frankfurt Mortuary with the recovered remains and equipment and promised Mr. Scholtis we would return after the spring thaw for another search of the recovery site.

- c. On 30 April 78, the undersigned and two enlisted personnel (one was fluent in German) went to Cologne, picked up Mr. Scholtis and drove to the border. The following morning we departed for the recovery site and spent the whole day searching an approximate 100 square meter area around the site where he previously recovered the remains. Rusted and tattered remnants of hundreds of American and German WW II combat artifacts were observed. This included boots, clothing, food containers, vehicle and weapon parts, ammunition, etc., none of which could be associated with subject remains. In addition, several partially filled foxholes in the immediate recovery area were excavated by the team with negative results. No additional remains or ID media were found.
- d. Through our interpreter (SSG Booth) I discussed Mr. Scholtis' previous recovery of remains and equipment on 14 January 1978. He stated at this time that all remains and equipment were recovered on the ground surface, scattered within approximately a 30 square meter area.
- e. There was evidence that the entire forrest area we searched had been previously searched by many war souvenir hunters and the lower branches of most trees had been cut off by Forresters to thin it out for better growth.

### 2. RESEARCH OF REGISTER OF WW II MISSING AND DEAD:

There are 56 "HOLT" names listed in the Register of WW II personnel, 26 of whom are still listed as MIA. The numbers in the helmet, "5007", do not correlate in any way with the recorded serial numbers of any of the 56 listed "HOLT's".

### CONCLUSION:

a. These remains were recovered with several American manufactured items of clothing and equipment.

- b. There are many American soldiers from WW II still MIA in the vicinity of where these remains were recovered.
- c. Paucity of remains precludes association with any specific US, WW II casualty still MIA in that area.



On 2 Feb 78 the team departed Cologne for the grave site. About 20 Km from the German/Belgian border, heavy snow started falling. The border guard said nearly two meters of snow had accumulated in the area over a two week period. The S&R team then returned to Cologne, picked up the remains at Mr. Scholtis' home and returned to Frankfurt.

3. This headquarters will hold these remains pending an additional S&R to the grave site after the spring thaw.

On 14 Jan 78 he found portions of human bones believed to be American soldier from WW II in a wooden area nearby village Losheim (Ardennes/Eifel) near the Belgium border. No ID tag found. Remains WITHOUT HEAD. Mr. Scholtis believes that he (the remains) was a former member of a mine detector team. He found parts of the detector with the inscription - HOLT. Further he found a helmet with the number 5007 and marked with a flower-pot in red paint.

The recovered portions are held by Mr. Scholtis in Koeln.

PS: Mr. Scholtis has dealed with us before, he recovered other remains, he is a "hobby searcher".

I told Mr. Scholtis that I will call him to let him know what action we will take in this case. He will take you to the recovery site if you want to.

Telecon on 24 Jan 78 between Ms Gerhold/Mr Scholtis: The helmet he found is of American origin. The recovery site is approx. 100 Km away from Koeln. Mr.Scholtis is willing to accompany our team to the recovery site for additional searching (head).
