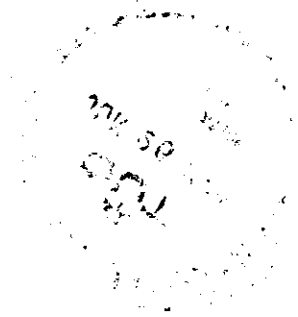

1. Reference is made to basic communication.
2. Investigation conducted by this headquarters revealed the following facts which would tend to preclude a definite association of Unknown X-115 (Foy) with Pvt John V. COX, Jr., 38 683 488.
3. According to available records, Pvt Howard M. McLAUGHLIN, 42 021 346 and Cpl Alfonso DIAZ, 34 794 283, both members of the same organization as Pvt. John V. COX, Jr., and MIA on 7 January 1945, are also unresolved casualties at Flawierge, Belgium, where Unknown X-115 was recovered.
4. Review of the case papers revealed that a tooth chart dated 25 April 1945, was prepared for Unknown X-115 (see inclosed tooth chart). (It is noted that the tooth chart obtained for Unknown X-115 does not compare favorably with the a vailable Army Dental Records for Pvt. COX, Jr., Pvt. McLAUGHLIN or Cpl DIAZ). However, CIL reprocessing on 20 October 1947 disclosed that no teeth were recovered with subject remains.
5. Inasmuch as the reprocessing of Unknown X-115 revealed no physical or identifying media, the presumption that the subject remains are actually those of Pvt. John V. COX, Jr., cannot be substantiated by valid evidence.
6. The association of Unknown X-115 with Pvt. COX, Jr., was primarily established due to the similarity of the circumstances surrounding the death but it is believed that this fact alone is insufficient evidence to conclusively identify the remains as Pvt. John V. COX, Jr., 38 683 488,
7. In view of the facts presented above, the subject case is being forwarded without Field Board of Review findings for reconsideration by your office.

1. Reference is made to Reburial Report for Unknown X-115, USMC Foy, Belgium, Plot I, Row 8, Grave 196, for whom Unidentifiable Certificate was received with Letter of Transmittal #3097, dated 16 September 1948 and approved by this Office 25 September 1948.

2. Upon reviewing the file of Private John V. Cox, Jr., 30683488, a member of 513 Parachute Infantry, it is noted that your headquarters made association with subject Unknown, due to the similarity of circumstances surrounding the death.

3. Copies of certificates from eye-witnesses, who were members of the same organization as Pvt. Cox, are inclosed as an aid in making further investigation of this case.

4. According to available records, there is no other casualty of the 513th Infantry Regiment who could be associated with Unknown X-115.

5. In view of the facts presented above, it is recommended that, if evidence is considered sufficient to warrant identification as the remains of Pvt. John V. Cox, Jr., 30683488, such evidence be presented to the Board of Officers and findings forwarded this Office by Air Mail.

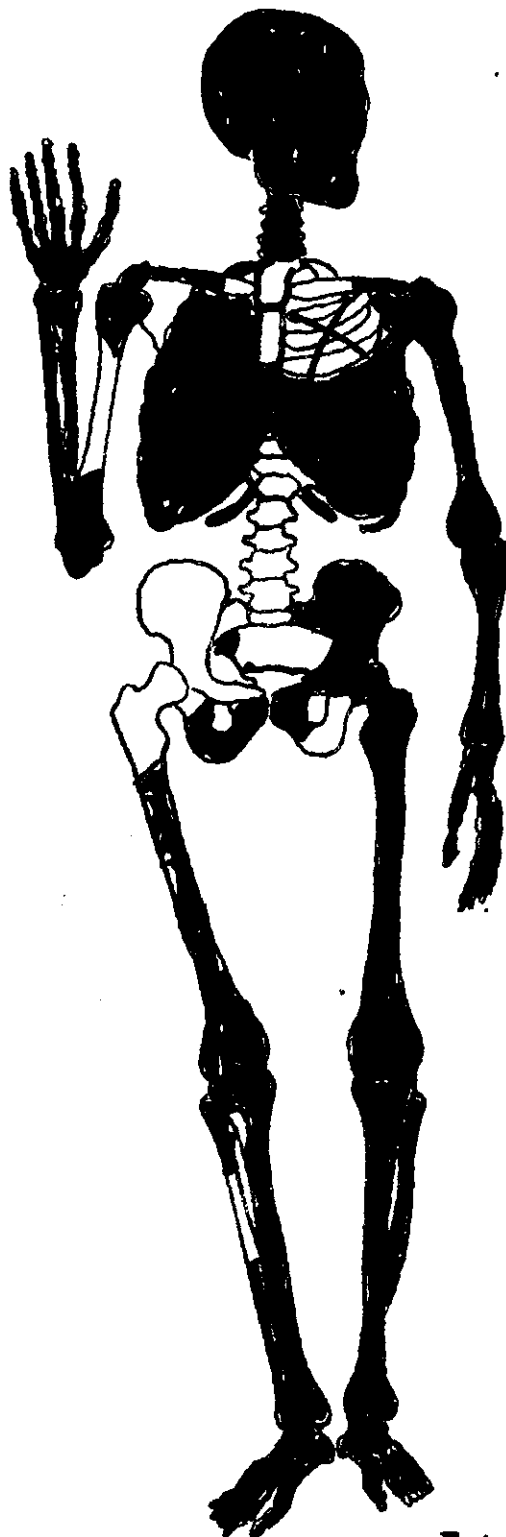
