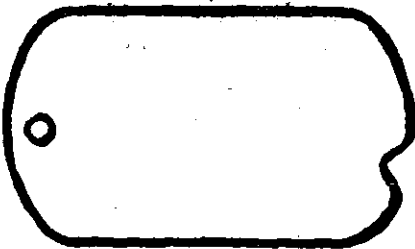

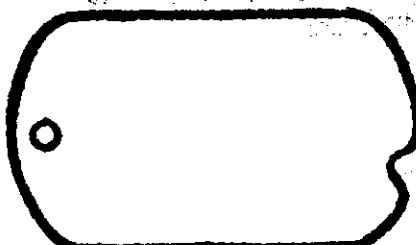

SUBJECT: Unidentified Deceased Personnel. (Unknown X-59, and 60, Foy)

TO : Commanding General, Ninth United States Army, APO 339, U.S. Army.

1. It is requested that action be taken to determine the identity of the two deceased soldiers whose remains were buried in U.S. Military Cemetery No 1, Foy, Belgium as Unknown X-59 and Unknown X-60. All known facts concerning the place, time, and cause of death are included in the attached Reports of Burial, as well as clothing markings, and a description of the remains.

2. It is requested that the following information be forwarded to this headquarters:

a. The name, rank and serial number of all men who were killed by the mine explosion at Beho, Belgium.

b. The date on which they were killed.

c. The color of hair and shoe size of any men still carried as missing or deceased in the vicinity of Beho except those for whom a Report of Burial has been received, and a statement indicating whether or not these men were circumcized.

3. If a statement can be furnished by Pfc Donald R. Pierce, or if any other facts can be obtained which will assist in identifying Unknown X-59 and Unknown X-60, it is requested that they be forwarded also.

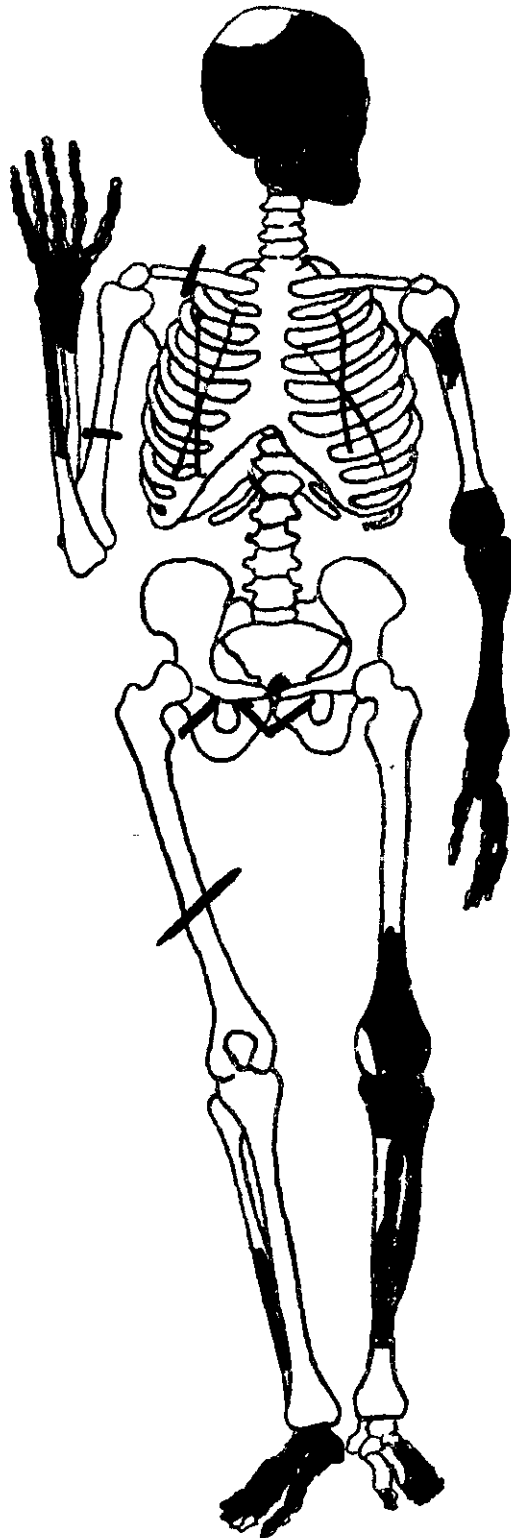

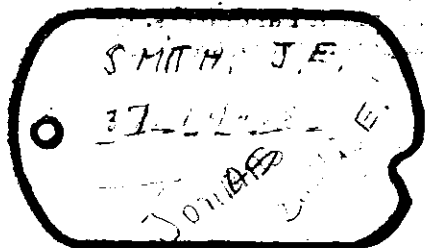

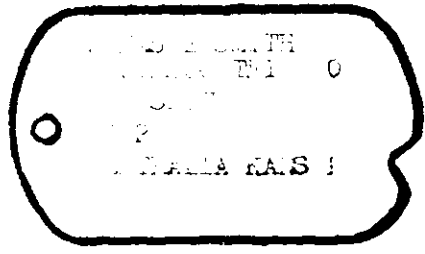
