1. This correspondence is returned with request for recon-  
 sideration of directive contained in the preceding Indorsement, and  
 in paragraph 1 of the foregoing 2nd Indorsement.

2. Basic communication was predicated on the possibility  
 that there might be burials in Iceland hitherto unreported by this  
 headquarters, and was forwarded for information and possible future  
 action based on eventual factual information obtained, or to be  
 obtained, through local state department channels. The only info-  
 mation presently available to this headquarters regarding those  
 burials is of a hearsay nature and completely unauthentic. For  
 this reason, action was taken to solicit assistance of Icelandic  
 authorities as indicated in Inclosure No 4 on the possibility that  
 some factual data might be obtained. Our request was in turn re-  
 ferred by the American Legation to the Icelandic Ministry for  
 Foreign Affairs. The action of this State Department is indicated  
 in their note no 26 which has been added as Inclosure No 5,  
 and which was received subsequent to writing of basic communica-  
 tion. Attention is especially invited to the last paragraph of  
 this note.

3. This command does not have Graves Registration Service  
 personnel available to accomplish the concentration directed in the  
 preceding two Indorsements, nor can a project of this kind be ac-  
 complished within any specified period of time in the near future.  
 Attention is invited to the fact that this Command is committed to  
 complete evacuation from Iceland prior to 5 April 1947. Accord-  
 ingly, it is recommended that all future action in this matter be  
 handled by personnel of the Headquarters American Zone, AGRS.,  
 on their arrival in Iceland as indicated in Paragraph 2 of the  
 foregoing Indorsement.

1. This headquarters has previously reported to the Quartermaster General that there are no deceased military personnel buried elsewhere in Iceland other than burials in Fossvogur Cemetery (American and Allied Nations dead), and Trautskott Cemetery (enemy dead). Records recently brought to light appear to indicate the possibility of numerous burials in isolated parts of Iceland of suspected American dead, particularly the Northwest Peninsula. These records are brief, sketchy, and completely unauthenticated, and on the surface appear to offer little information which might lead to establishment of factual data. However, they do suggest the possibility of burials which have not previously been reported.

2. Copies of the previously undisclosed records referred to in the foregoing paragraph are enclosed as Inclosures # 1, 2, and 3. On the basis of this meager information the American Legation in Reykjavik has been requested to solicit the aid of Icelandic authorities in an effort to obtain factual information regarding these suspected burials. Letter of this headquarters to the local American Minister embodying this request is enclosed (Incl #4).

3. The foregoing information is furnished you at this time in view of the imminent withdrawal of U.S. troops from Iceland. Under existing governmental agreements, evacuation must be completed by 7 April 1947, and since, so far as now known, the project to repatriate American dead from this zone will not be undertaken until this forthcoming spring and summer, it is desired to lay such groundwork as may be necessary to insure the availability of all obtainable information on which to formulate repatriation plans. Your comments and suggestions in this connection, with special reference to paragraph 1 and 2 above, are requested.

The following information from the director of the poor law parish of Svalbar, Sandnes.

No. I. Bjarnarnes. The body in a coffin. Sigurdur Arnason did not see any characteristics.

No. II. Belungarvikursel. Height; about 180 cm., a striped jersey shirt-trousers, black over trousers, padded. No marks on clothing. The head completely fleshless.

No. III. Straumneshlik. Height; 166 cm, Black uniform, stripes on sleeves, insignia on the front and on right arm, (sleeve) (sewn on). The insignia taken off and sent. The head completely fleshless.

No. IV. 1. Furufjordur. A velvet jacket lined with leather, a woolen jumper, oil skin blouse, leather cap. Height; 177 cm. Shaki-Trousers, with rubber belt swimming belt marked 3/8 Alamar. A pocket book containing a passport, (sent) 2 cents, a tooth brush, The head fleshless.

No. V 2. Furufjordur. Leather boot on left foot marked A. H. Swimming belt, unmarked, overcoat, leather lined jacket, oil skin blouse, documents, a spectacle case, a spoon, a tooth brush, a worn pipe. The head fleshless, except for a small (tiny) piece of skin in the back of the head, covered with dark hair. Height; 171 cm.

No. VI. Reykjafjordur. A fat man, considered more than six (6) feet not measured. Black stockings, Grey-Brown overall's., Head fleshless. A gold ring on fourth finger on the left hand, with initials, (sent in spectacles case No. 1.)

All bodies were in bad condition. Djos, August 25, 1942. The things packet does not contain were put in coffins. To the sheriff.

The above mentioned bodies were all buried in coffins in one grave in the Northwest corner of the grave yard at Furufjordur, Sunday the 24th of August 1942.

Sunday, the 3rd of January, 1943 there was also buried in the same grave a body or more accurately, the bones of a soldiers body, which washed ashore in Furufjordur in the Augm of 1942.

Dear Mr. Thomas:

It is reliably reported that numerous bodies were washed ashore on the northwest peninsula of Iceland a short time after the marine disaster involving numerous American vessels, which occurred in August 1942. There were no American troops stationed in this area, and due to the isolated location, burials were made by local Icelanders.

Due to the imminent movement of U.S. troops from Iceland it is therefore imperative that we gain complete information about the location of U. S. dead in Iceland. This information is necessary so that in the event that future plans call for their repatriation, plans can be readily formulated. At the present time tentative plans have been made for the repatriation for the American dead buried in Iceland (Fossvogur Cemetery) this spring and summer.

It is therefore respectfully requested that you approach the proper Icelandic authorities to ascertain the whereabouts of any American dead buried in an isolated location in Iceland. Complete information as to name, rank, serial number, etc. should be furnished as far as possible.

The Ministry for Foreign Affairs presents its compliments to the Legation of the United States of America and has the honour to refer to the Legation's note No. 677 and the Ministry's note No. 19, dated January 14 and 27 respectively, regarding a request for permission to repatriate the remains of United States Citizens buried in Iceland.

The Ministry of Justice and Church has now granted formal permission for this action, provided that provisions of law no. 78 of June 27, 1941 and of regulation no. 159 of September 27, 1941, be adhered to, and that the health authorities in each place supervise the action together with the supervisor of the churchyards in each place.

The Ministry will as soon as such data are available, inform the Legation of the number and location of deceased Americans about whom the United States Army Authorities do not have any record.

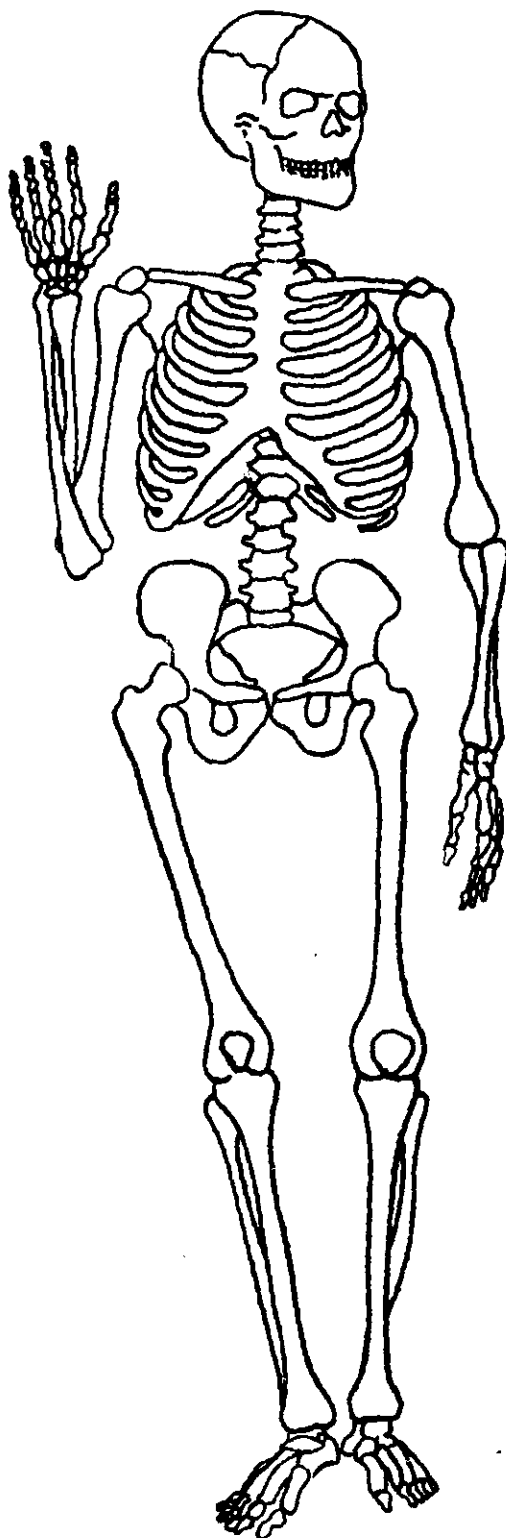
