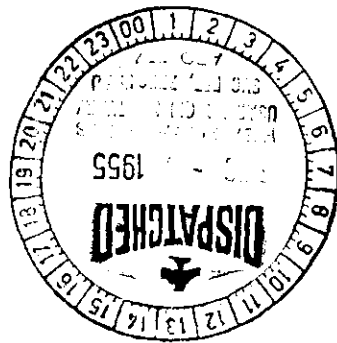



CASE HISTORY

X-70073	Frankfurt Mausoleum	Grave 75

Unknowns X-70073 and X-70074 were recovered as SR 785 A & B respectively. Recovery was effected from a mausoleum crypt (vault 115, Row 5) at the community cemetery, Cadelbosco di Sopra, Province del Emilia, Italy. The outside stone facing of the vault was marked with the letters "U.S.A."

Information secured from local citizens related that at 1400 hours, 24 April 1945, an American tank was struck by enemy fire and burned. The tank was travelling from the village of Zurco and at the road junction leading to the center of Cadelbosco di Sopra the incident occurred. Two crew members immediately evacuated their burning vehicle while it was believed another two were not successful.

It was further learned a few days after the incident the tank was evacuated by an military recovery unit.

The cemetery caretaker several hours after the incident removed from the scene portions of carbonized remains. These portions were placed in a sealed zinc container with an outer wooden casket and interred in vault 115.

Both remains essentially comprise of near complete torsos with only fragments of adjoining portions and are severely charred thruout. There is neither skull nor any intact extremity present. The only physical identifying media are the estimated age factors and charred portion of a US Service shoe for which the width "E~~F~~" was discernable.

A review of Mediterranean Zone files of casualties lost in the area an approximate date cited above and available records of remains (identified and unknown) recovered from the vicinity of Cadelbosco di Sopra failed to provide any reasonable association.

In view of the lack of physical data and incompleteness of recorded casualty information it is recommended Unknowns X-70073 and X-70074 be considered unidentifiable.

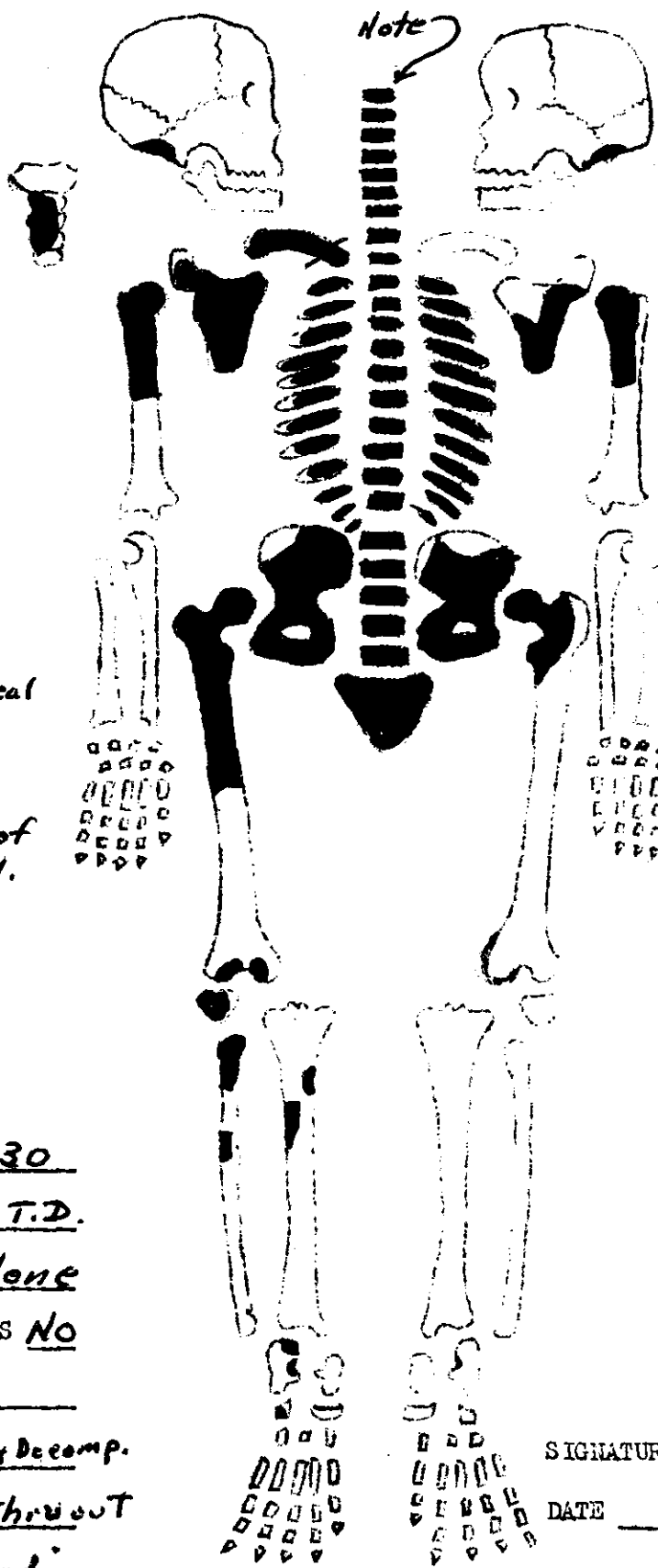

IDENTIFICATION LABORATORY REPORT

1. Search and Recovery Case # 785 pertains to partial remains of two (2) carbonized casualties reported as having been removed from an American tank by the caretaker of the local cemetery at CADELBOSCO di SOFRA, Province of Reggio Emilia, (sheet 74/3080) Italy. Statements of witnesses indicate the tank had been coming from the direction of Zurco and was knocked out at 1400 hours on 24 April 45.

2. An examination of the remains indicates the major portions of torsos for two (2) deceased are present. Subject remains have been assigned Unknown "X" numbers as indicated below:

SR # 785 A is now designated UNKNOWN X-70073
Frankfurt (MED ZONE) Mausoleum
Grave 75

SR # 785 B is now designated UNKNOWN X-70074
Frankfurt (MED ZONE) Mausoleum
Grave 76

3. At the time of processing subject decedents had not yet been associated with missing casualties in the area of recovery. The physical characteristics are as follows:

No teeth were recovered for either remains. A charred U.S. service shoe was recovered with the width "EEEE" stamped in the inner sole. The section of inner sole towards the heel is so charred that the shoe length cannot be determined. Both remains are severely charred thruout.

NARRATIVE OF INVESTIGATION

I. AUTHORITY AND MATTERS INVESTIGATED:

In compliance with instructions contained in Investigation Directive # 1228, dated 10 May 1955, an investigation was conducted in the vicinity of Cadelbosco di Sopra (74/3080, sheet 74, 1:100 000), Italy in an effort to recover remains believed to be those of American World War II Dead.

II. FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES:

Pursuant to information obtained from the Italian War Graves Commission, Rome, Italy, indicating that two (2) remains possibly those of American World War II Dead, were buried in Vault 115, Row 5, left section, in the community cemetery of Cadelbosco di Sopra, district of Reggio Emilia.

III. FINDINGS:

A visit was made by the undersigned at the office of the mayor in the Comune of Cadelbosco di Sopra. The mayor and Mr. Marcello Ferrari, Civil State Officer briefed us as follows:

On April 24th 1945 at 1400 hours an American tank coming from Zurco locality, upon arrival at conjunction that leads to Castelbosco Sopra Center, was hit by a "Panzerfaust" and set afire.

Eyewitnesses inferred that two (2) American soldiers came out of the tank in time, while the other two (2), remained inside and were carbonized.

It is known that the tank was towed away and salvaged by a group Americans within two or three days from that day.

The custodian of the local cemetery, after some hours from the time of accident picked up a few carbonized pieces of human remains among those a hit chest by shrapnel and one hand, without having seen the head of either one of the two (2) remains. (See Exhibit "A").

He then composed the same remains in a unique mortuary case with annexed zinc box and interred them in vault # 115, row # 5, left side of the cemetery. (See Exhibit "B").

The undersigned accompanied by Mr. Marcello Ferrari was escorted to the cemetery and upon arrival was shown the grave in the crypt of the cemetery mausoleum. On the outside panel of the crypt were the letters in brown paint U.S.A.

Narrative of Investigation, dated 1 June 1955, ID # 1228, cont'd)

The undersigned secured labor and proceeded to remove the remains from the grave which was one of several unique graves made in the form of an above ground mausoleum, each grave consisting of an individual compartment measuring three feet wide, two and one half feet deep and six feet long with the entrance sealed with approximately six inches of cement and a head marker giving name, date of birth and death.

It was ascertained by grave site examination of the remains that there were portions of one or possibly two (2) remains and that they could be American decedents since there were portions of an Army type stocking and charred shoe in the casket.

As no other identifying media were obtainable the remains were assigned SR # 785 and evacuated to Leghorn, Italy for further evacuation to Rome, Italy and to the CIL Frankfurt, Germany.

IV. CONCLUSION:

It is the opinion of the undersigned that the remains assigned SR 785 are those of American World War II Deceased.

V. RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that remains recovered as SR 785 be processed for possible association with casualties of that immediate area.

Information taken by the representative during disinterment of the remains of two (2) American soldiers from grave # 115, row 5 (left side).

On 24 April 1945 at 1400 hours an American tank coming from Zurco was hit by a "Panzerfaust" and set on fire, when reaching the conjunction leading to Cadelbosco Sopra Center.

Eye-witnesses stated that two (2) American soldiers left the tank in time, while the other two (2) remained inside and were carbonized. There is no trace of any further remains of the two (2) deceased.

It is known the tank was towed in and salvaged by the same Americans within 2 or 3 days after the occurrence.

Some hours after the incident had taken place the caretaker of the local cemetery collected a few carbonized remains (part of a chest, indicating shrapnel wounds and one hand). He did not see the head of either one of the decedents.

The remains were considered one case, placed in a zinc box and the casket interred in grave # 115, row 5 from the left side of the cemetery.

Il custode del Cimitero locale ~~res~~ prestò la sua opera dopo qualche ora dal fatto; raccolse pochi Resti carbonizzati, fra i quali ricorda un petto colpito da una scheggia e una mano, senza aver visto il capo di ~~nessuno~~ ~~Caduti~~ nessuno dei due Caduti.

Compose i Resti stessi in un unica cassa mortuaria con annessa cassa di zinco e tumulò il feretro nel d/ loculo N.115 Fila 5° lato sinistro nel Cimitero del Capoluogo .

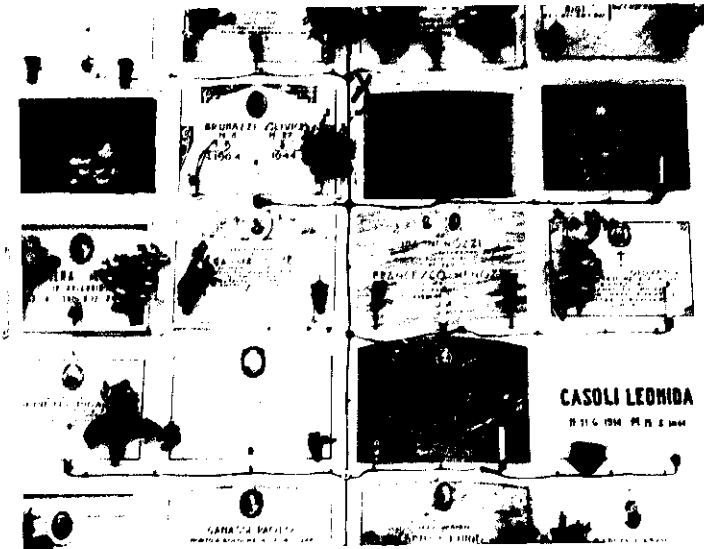
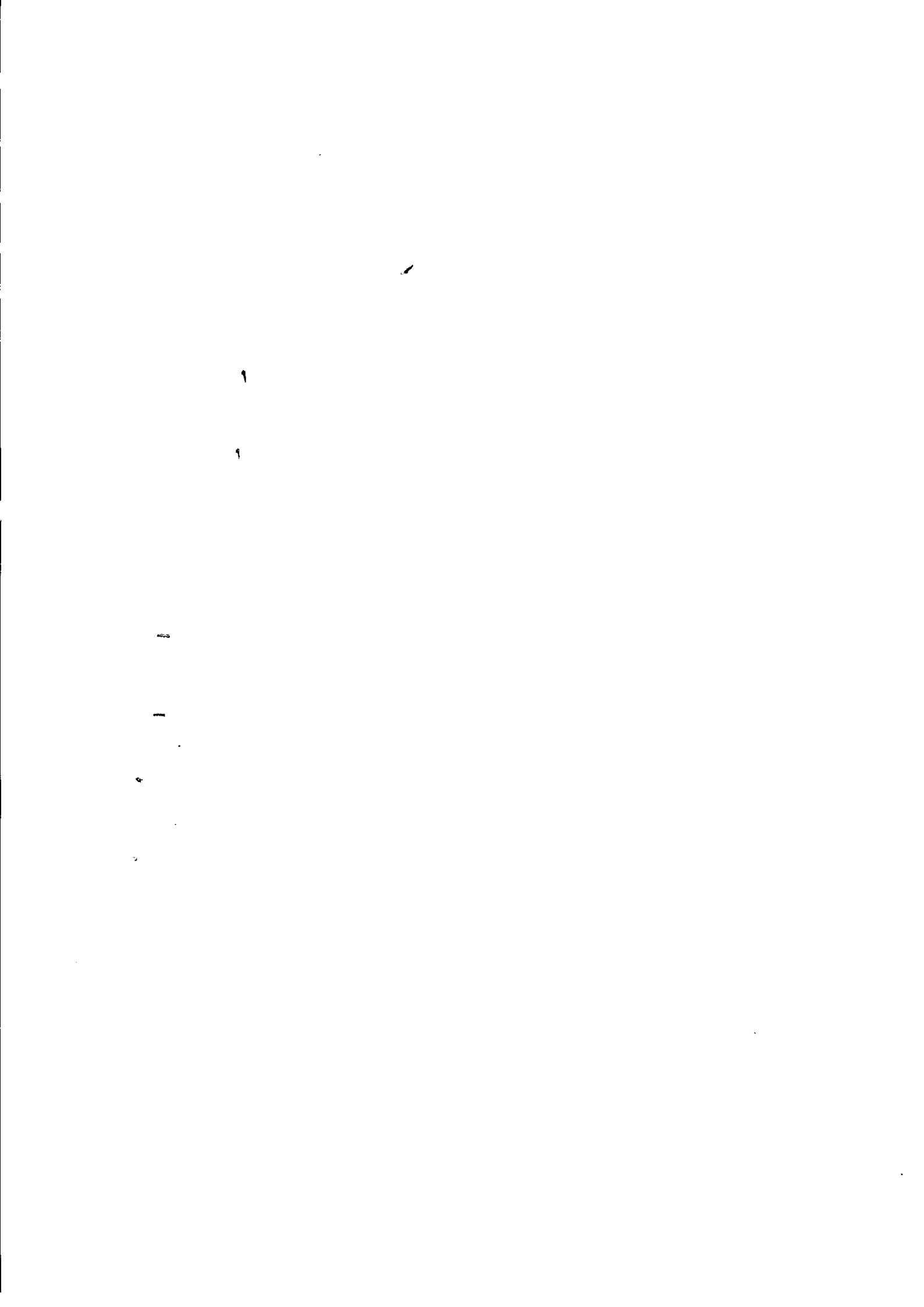

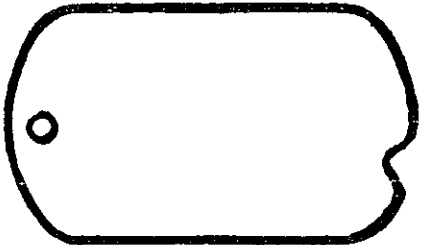
