
A Board of Officers assembled by paragraph 1, Division Order 182, dated 24 July 1956, convened at 1000 hours, 9 DEC 56, and after consideration of the following factors, approved the identification of Unknown X-7005h, Frankfurt (140) .ausoleum, as unidentifiable.


Unknown X-7002h, heretofore established as unidentifiable, was recovered by the Italians, along with unknown X-7002 and X-7003, from a garden plot in the hills of Arelle (140/127), Italy, on 3 August 1956. Single identification tags for Harry R. Joslin, O-130714, and Charles L. Williams, 32740939, and fragments of US clothing and equipment were found with the remains which had been buried approximately three meters away from two German casualties who were removed to the Arelle Cemetery several years ago, believed to be the year 1950. Inspection of these remains revealed that practically all the lower extremities were missing. Accordingly, on 13 September 1956, another search was made of the grave site now being in the recovery of additional portions of remains designated as 502h, 7 and C. Separation of these remains was accomplished according to age, height, weight, articulation and morphological variation, resulting in X-7003 being designated as Unknown X-7002, 500h as Unknown X-7003 and 51005 as Unknown X-7001, Frankfurt (140) .ausoleum.


Unknowns X-7002 and X-7003 were associated with 2nd Lt Joslin and Pfc Williams, respectively, based on identification tags found with remains and favorable comparison of dental and physical data. Board proceeds in recommending the identification of these two casualties are being submitted simultaneously with this case.


A comparison of the dental and physical data of Unknown X-7002h with corresponding data of all unresolved casualties lost in the Cassino-Arelle area in an attempt to associate an unresolved casualty with Unknown X-7002h was unsuccessful. The Field Laboratory report, dated 10 October 1956, tends to indicate that there may be some question as to the nationality of Unknown X-7002h; however, based on the information of record, the nationality of X-7002h cannot be definitely ascertained.

In view of the above, it is determined that Unknown X-7002h, Frankfurt (140) .ausoleum, is unidentifiable.

IDENTIFICATION LABORATORY REPORT

REMAINS PROCESSED: SR # 5003, # 5004, # 5005 and # 5007.

1. Portions of three (3) World War II casualties were recently recovered from a garden plot in the hills of Italy near Cassino at Terelle (160/8127). Single identification tags for "HENRY P JOSLYN—01309746" and "CHARLES T WILLIAMS—32758939" as well as bits of US clothing and equipment were found with the remains which had been buried at right angles to and approximately three (3) meters away from two (2) German casualties. The initial recovery of the three casualties was made by the Italians and they were designated SR 5003, 5004 and 5005. Examination, however, revealed that major portions of the lower extremities and pelvic bones were missing. A return visit to the recovery site resulted in the recovery of the missing portions from a secondary burial site at the edge of the garden plot where they had been placed several years before. These additional portions were designated SR 5007. Segregation has been accomplished according to age, height, weight, articulation and morphological variations.

2. Unknown "X" numbers have been assigned subject remains as follows:

SR 5003 redesignated UNKNOWN X-70082 Grave 84 Frankfurt (MED) Maus.

SR 5004 redesignated UNKNOWN X-70083 Grave 85 Frankfurt (MED) Maus.

✓ SR 5005 redesignated UNKNOWN X-70084 Grave 86 Frankfurt (MED) Maus.

3. The physical characteristics of each case and association with like data for 2/Lt Henry P. JOSLYN and Pfc Charles T. WILLIAMS are as follows:

Post-cranial articulation is complete with the exception of the missing 6th cervical and 12th thoracic vertebrae. The similarity of adjacent vertebrae indicates the vertebral column is for one and the same deceased. The teeth present with this remains are in excellent agreement with available dental data for 2/Lt Henry P. JOSLYN, O1 309 746 who was lost in the vicinity of Terelle. Both R 8 and L 8 are unerupted due to impaction. The filling in L 14 is very recent and probably coincides with the carious L 15 indicated on OJMG Form 371 for Lt JOSLYN. Tooth L 15 is

not carious. These teeth are exceptionally free of calculus in agreement with MD Form 79 which indicates Lt. JOSLYN had his teeth cleaned five months prior to his death. There were no fifth metacarpals or associated phalanges recovered to enable verification of the indicated finger fracture for Lt. JOSLYN. The cause of death appears to have been chest injuries as evidenced by fractures of the central right ribs. All other skeletal damage resulted from erosion and/or disinterment action.

Post-cranial articulation is incomplete due to the absence of the 1st, 3rd and 5th cervical vertebrae. Although definite articulation can not be established between the skull and vertebral column it has been established that the skull cannot be associated with either of the other two (2) remains recovered with this case. The right ulna has suffered an injury or fracture at an early age resulting in a sharp angularity (approx 25 degrees) at the middle of the shaft. This angularity is such that the ulna was drawn very close to the radius. There is no evidence of limited movement at the elbow or the wrist as determined by the condition of the articular surfaces. The longest foot bones recovered are estimated to be size 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ A or B and can only be articulated with the tarsal bones and tibiae of this case. This is in agreement with the indicated shoe size of "12-A" for Pfc WILLIAMS. Death appears to have been caused by a head injury resulting from an object penetrating the posterior section of the right parietal bone. There is also evidence of shattering at the left knee.

Post-cranial articulation is complete with the exception of missing 4th cervical and 4th lumbar vertebrae. The similarity of the adjacent vertebrae indicates the vertebral column is for one and the same deceased. The finding of a small portion of wool OD trousers with this remains found in a burial location adjoining two (2) U.S. casualties separate and at right angles to two (2) German casualties indicates this may be the remains of a third American casualty. Although no evidence of German clothing or equipment was received with this case it must be noted that the initial recovery of the three (3) remains by the Italians was received in an intermingled condition and the remnant of wool OD trousers cannot be definitely associated with this remains. In addition, the teeth in this case do not reflect the normal good dental care received by U.S. military personnel. The silicate filling in tooth L 2 has a hue which

is darker than the usual U.S. silicate filling. The caries present in teeth R 12 and R 13 appear quite large to have escaped U.S. military dental attention. Tooth L 10 has had the incisal edge broken off and is also chipped on the facial surface but the tooth had never been repaired. The irregular and smoothly worn condition of the once jagged surfaces indicates this tooth was broken many years prior to death. The severely shattered facial area of the skull indicates the cause of death in this case.

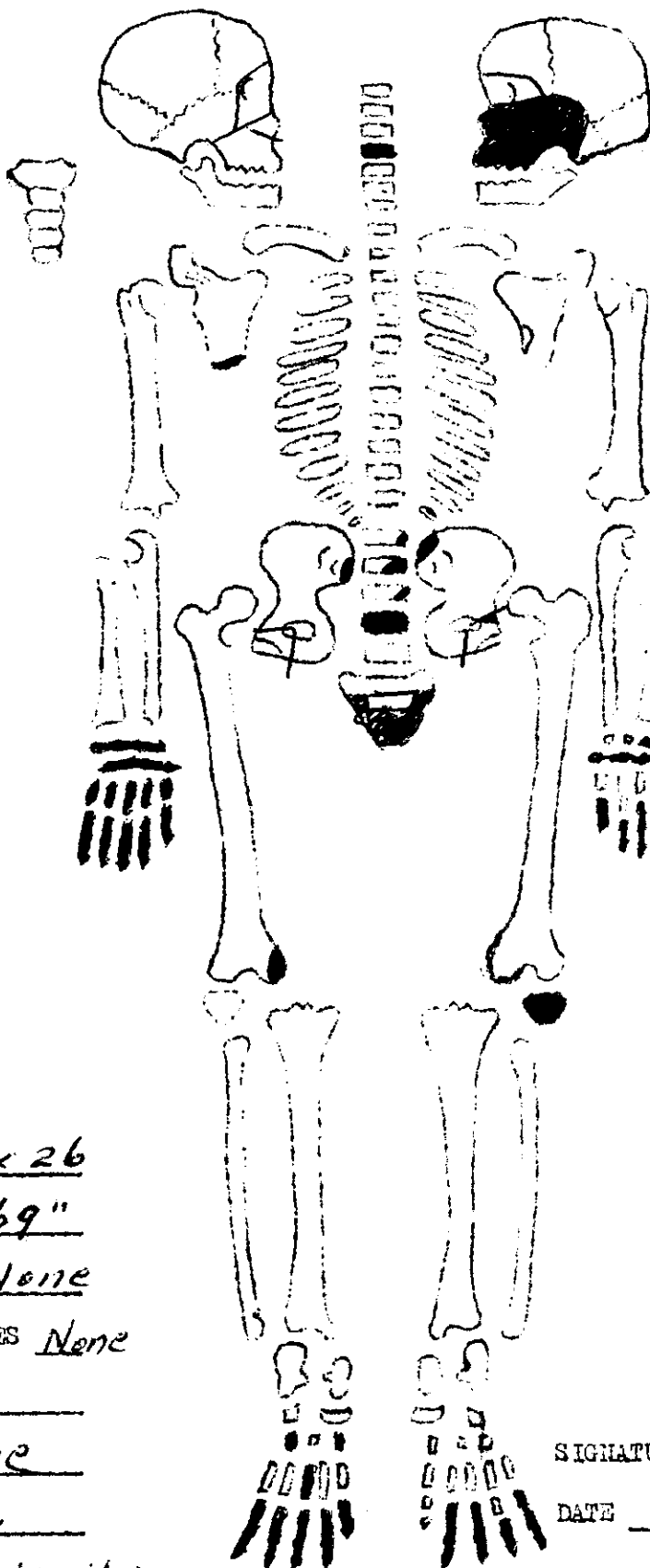

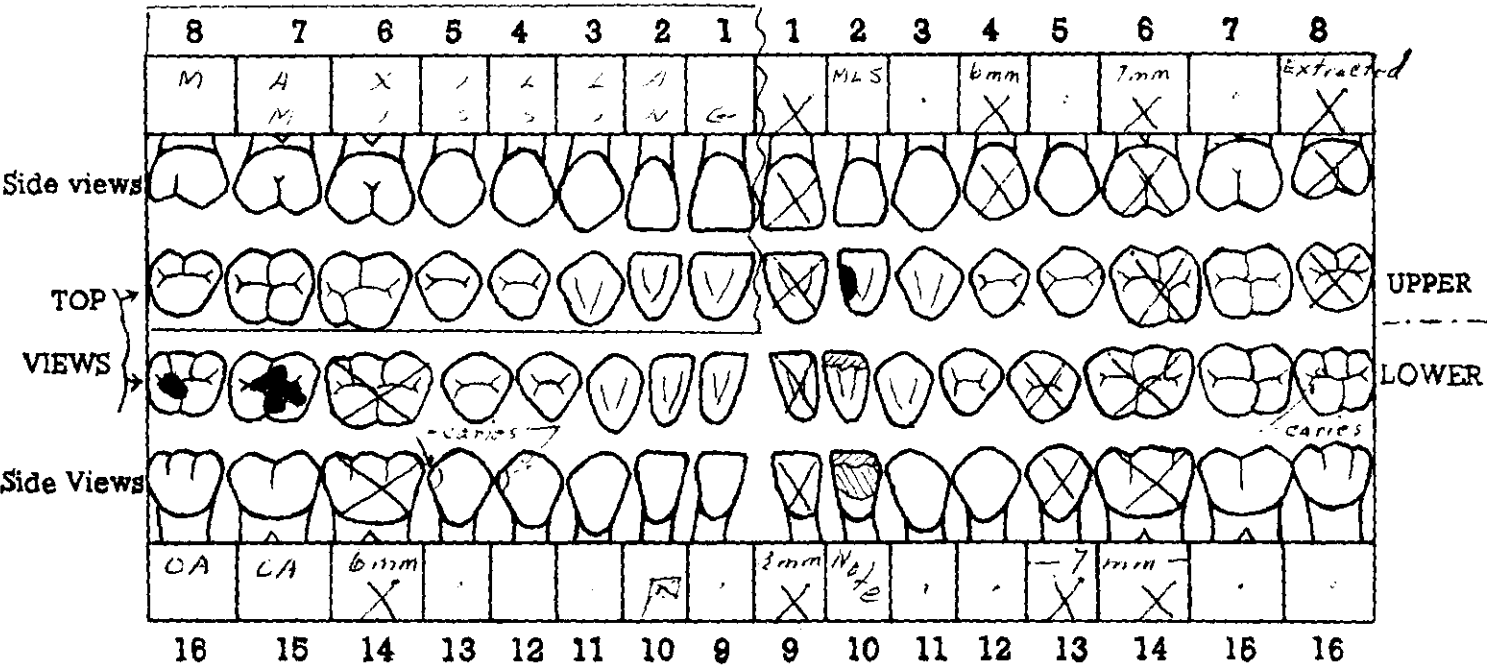

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.

REPORT OF INVESTIGATION

17 September 1956

Information received from the Italian Ministry of Defense revealed that on 25 July 1956, the remains of three (3) deceased were discovered on the property of Mr. Raffaele Grossi of the Commune of Terelle, near Cassino. Identification tags for Henry P JOSLYN, O-1309746 and Chas. T WILLIAMS, 32758939 were found, no identification tag for the third remains was located.

Remains were released to the AGRS team on 3 August 1956 at Terelle. Inspection of the remains, revealed that practically all the lower extremities were missing. According to the Mayor of Terelle, the remains had been interred in an extremely shallow grave (60 centimeters) and therefor the missing portions could not have been overlooked at time of exhumation. Mr. Grossi was not available for interview at the time.

Remains were evacuated under the following Search and Recovery numbers:

On 13 September 1956 an additional investigation was conducted in conjunction with the recovery of John H. CANTRELL, 34 806 492 at Cassino in an effort to recover the missing portions.

Upon being interviewed, Mr. Grossi reiterated that he and three (3) laborers had meticulously searched the grave sites and had recovered all portions present. Mr. Grossi did, however, recall that the former owner of his property had mentioned several years ago that partial remains had been found in the garden area, which were removed and buried in a small hole to the side of the vegetable patch. The exact place was not known to Mr. Grossi.

During the course of digging shallow trenches through the area, the missing portions were located, interred approximately three (3) meters from the foot of the former graves site. The long bones had been placed vertically in a space one half meter in diameter.

Portions recovered were evacuated under Search and Recovery number 5007-A-Band C.

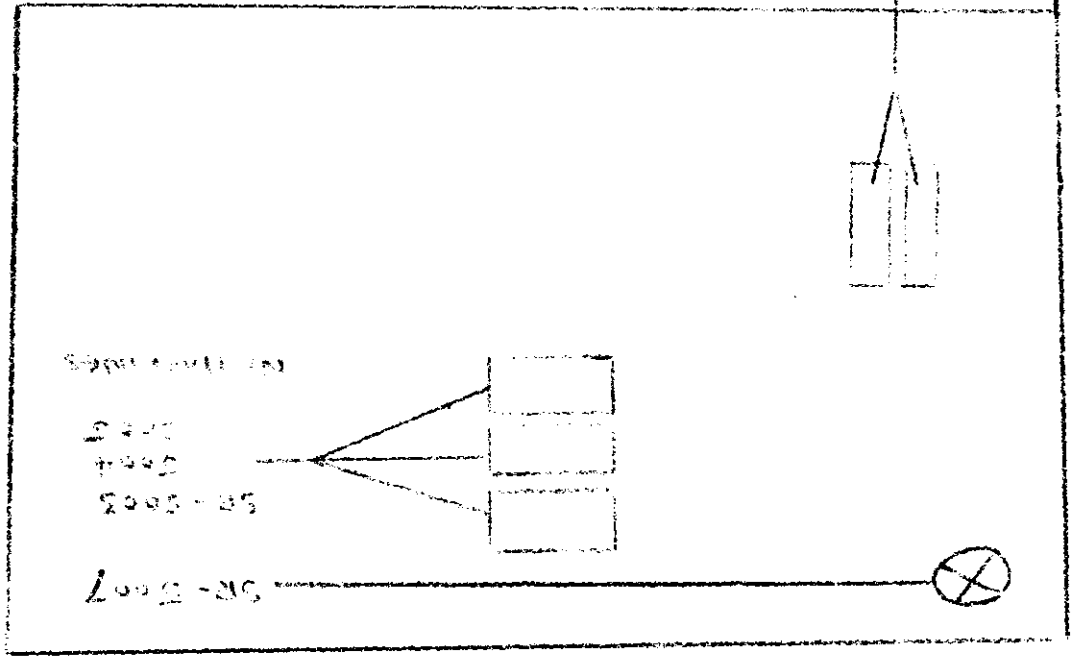
SITE OF RECOVERY

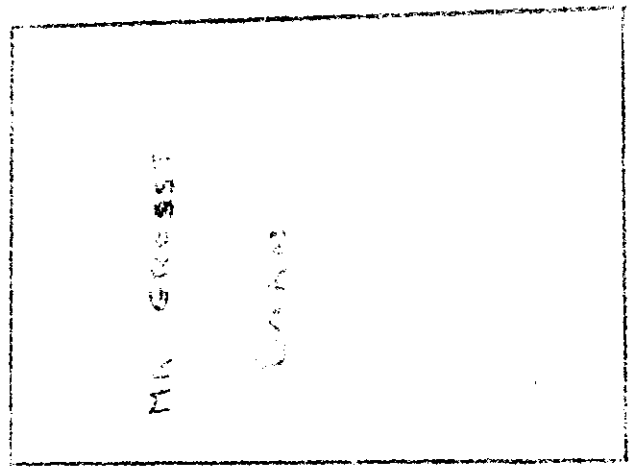
