A Board of Officers appointed by paragraph 1, Division Order No. 1, dated 15 January 1958, convened at _____ hours, _____ 1958, and after consideration of the following factors, approved the identification of Unknown X-70088, Frankfurt (MED) Mausoleum, as unidentifiable.

Reference is made to the attached letter, dated 26 February 1957, headquarters, United States Army Quartermaster Mortuary Detachment, Subject: "Letter of Transmittal" which pertains to Unknown X-70088, Frankfurt (MED) Mausoleum.


The remains of this unknown were discovered by the German War Graves Commission during exhumation of thirty-four casualties from the German Section of Cemetery Frazionc-Turano, Massa, Italy. Since this unknown designated ER #5010 was believed to be American, custody was accepted by an American Search Team, presumably in early February 1957 since the Report of Investigation gives no date. This unknown was subsequently removed to the Frankfurt Mausoleum where it was designated Unknown X-70088. Found with the remains were several US coins, an Italian coin, a sterling silver crucifix with chain bearing a US shield on the front and the inscription: "I am a Catholic. Please call a priest" on the reverse, a three-inch section of a medical thermometer, remnants of a first aid bandage, fragments of a page of prayer and pages of an American calendar. No identifying data was obtainable from any of these items.


The identifying data of Unknown X-70088 was compared with all available identification data of unresolved casualties killed in action in the area of recovery with negative results.

In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that remains designated Unknown X-70088, Frankfurt (MED) Mausoleum, be declared unidentifiable.



Remarks

Received from the German War Graves Commission who had recovered these remains from Grave 31, German Section, Cemetery Frazione-Turano, Massa, Italy, presumably in early February 1957 since the Report of Investigation gives no date.

Found with the remains were several US coins, an Italian coin, a sterling silver crucifix with chain with a US shield on the front and the inscription: "I am a Catholic. Please call a priest" on the reverse, and a three-inch section of a medical thermometer. According to the German War Graves Commission, remnants of a first aid bandage, fragments of a page of prayer and pages of an American calendar were found.

SUBJECT: Memorial Division Board of Review

1. Establishment. Under provisions of AR 15-6, dated 25 July 1955, there is hereby established the Memorial Division Board of Review (hereinafter referred to as the Board) to assist the Chief, Memorial Division, in the resolution of special cases which involve the identifiability, non-identifiability, or nonrecoverability of the remains of deceased persons.

2. Membership. The Board will consist of three (3) officers. The President of the Board will be designated by the Chief, Memorial Division. One member, as designated by the President, will act as recorder for the Board and will be responsible for the documentation of the findings of the Board.

3. Authority. In the resolution of all cases referred to in paragraph 1 above, the Board will serve as the reviewing channel between the operating branch and the Division Chief. The Board is authorized to review all such cases as are referred through it to the Division Chief. After documentation of its findings, the Board will recommend the approval of the Division Chief or his designated representative or return the case to the operating branch for reconsideration of its determinations.

4. Duties. The Board is charged with the following duties and responsibilities:

a. Establish a set of standards and procedures to determine the adequacy, authenticity, and completeness of records which serve as an operating basis for the Board.

b. Review case history reports concerning the identifiability of recovered remains as submitted by the operating branch.

c. Review case history reports concerning the non-identifiability of individual recovered remains and the non-identifiability of individual remains from group recoveries.

REPORT OF EXAMINATION

1. The remains designated U. S. 901 were discovered by the German War Graves Commission during excavation of thirty-four (34) casualties from the German Section of Cemetery Branciano-Burzio at Vigona (21°10' Italy, U. S. material) burial site. This remains file for subject's casualty is American. Items found included a sterling silver crucifix with a U. S. shield on the face and the inscription "I am a Catholic please call a priest" on the reverse side. Other items consisted of various U. S. coins dated 1933, 1941, 1943 and 1944; a 2-inch section of U. S. medical thermometer; remains of a lot and package and pages from an American calendar.

2. On the basis of the items recovered the remains have been accepted and designated U. S. 901-7001 Frankfurt (11) -Auslohn. Processing data are as follows:

The skull articulates with the first cervical vertebra but the succeeding five (5) cervical vertebrae are missing and further post-cranial articulation cannot be verified. The majority of all portions and the lack of duplication, however, indicates all portions are for one and the same decedent. The teeth are in an excellent state of dental repair. The fillings are smooth and well polished and there are no teeth in need of further repair. This dental condition is in agreement with and indicative of the dental care given members of the U. S. military.

3. SKULL OF FACE: Severely shattered bones comprising the nose and the upper right are indicative death as the result of a heavy explosion and not shell case blow.

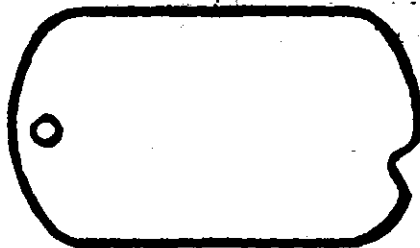

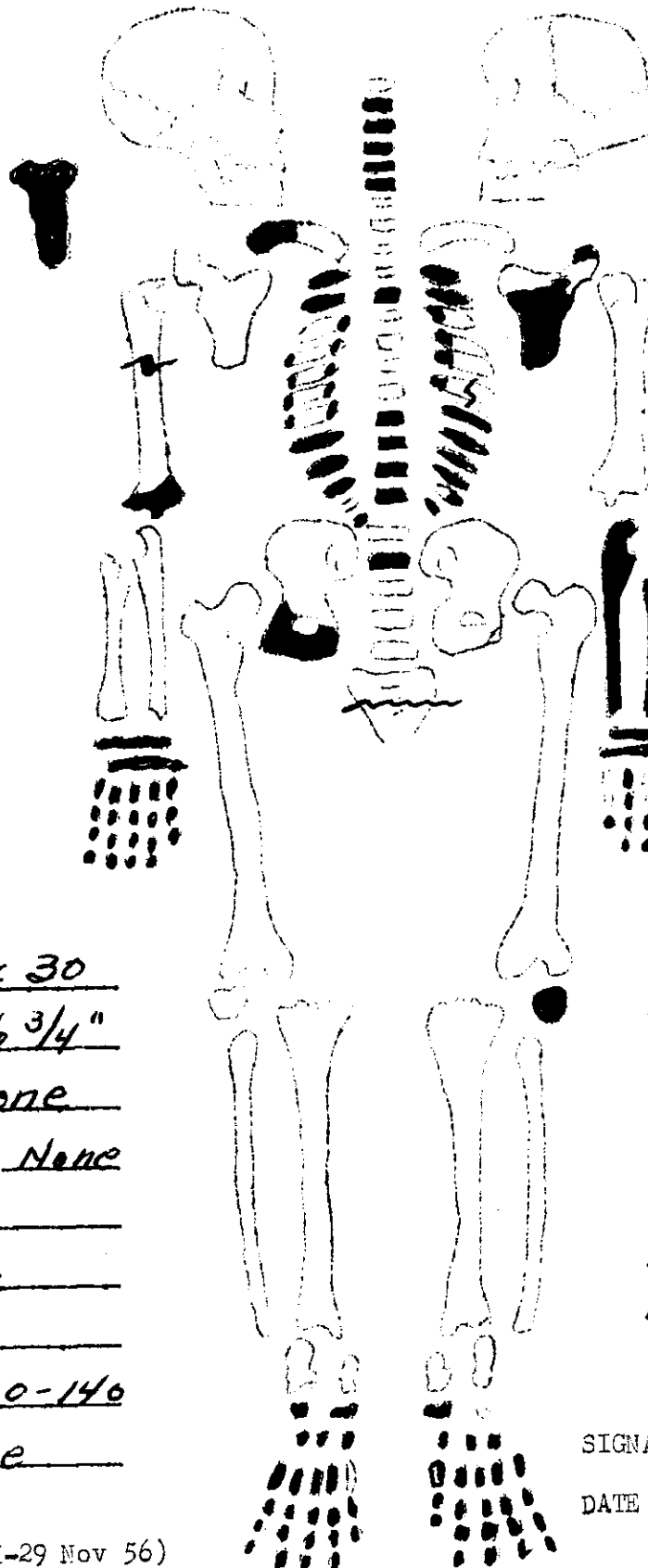

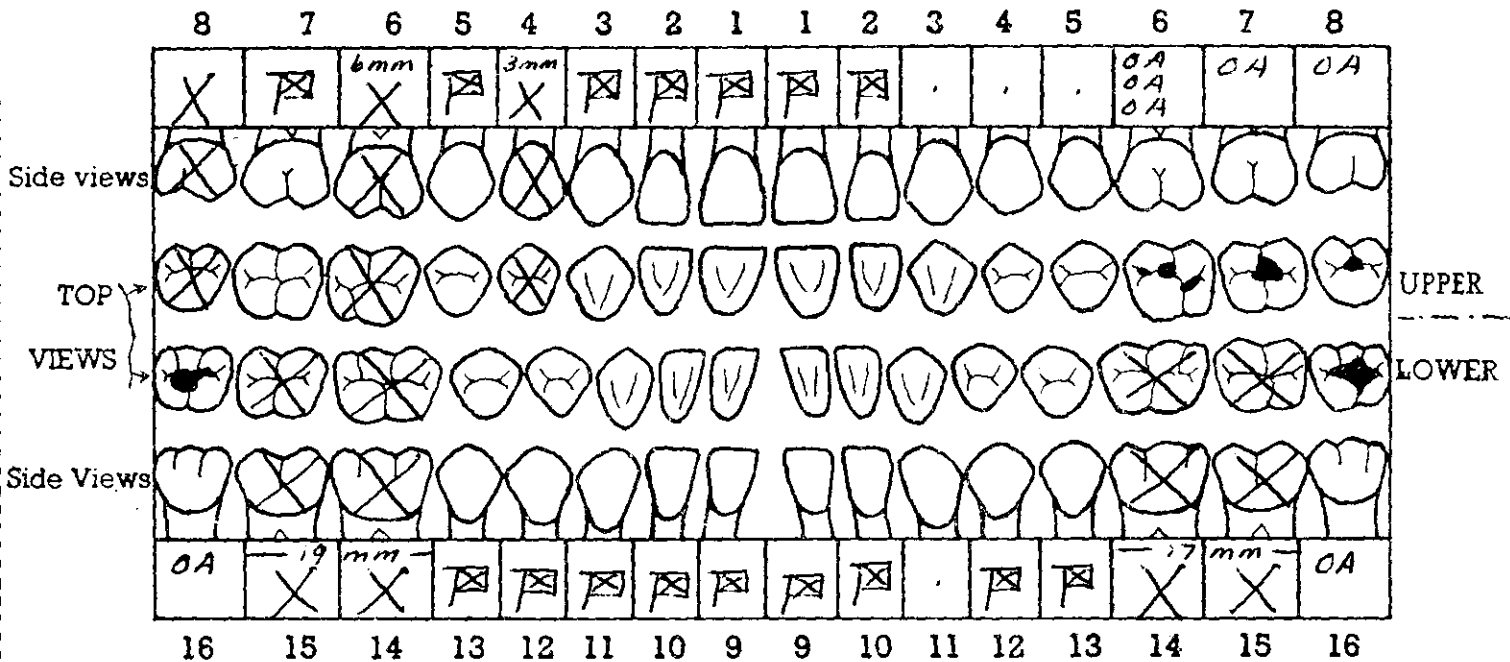

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.

REPORT OF INVESTIGATION

Information received from the German War Graves Commission, Rome, Italy, revealed that during examination of 34 German deceased at the Cemetery Frasane-Tusano, Massa, Italy, remains believed to be those of an American deceased were discovered.

Upon disinterment Grave 31, German section, of the above mentioned cemetery, several U.S. coins, portion of a American type thermometer, a small crucifix inscribed on reverse side "I am a Catholic please call a Priest", were found with these remains. According to Mr Youman's report of disinterment (attached), remnants of a first aid bandage and pieces of an American calendar were also found.

No records exist in Massa concerning the interment of the 34 remains. According to the Cemetery Administration the interments were made exclusively by members of the Terra Hebrrecht during the combat period occurring in the Massa area.

The remains, upon examination, were found to be nearly complete. Numerous teeth were posthumously missing, the remaining teeth in excellent state of dental repair.

On the basis of the above mentioned findings remains were accepted as those of an American deceased and assigned ID # 5019.

Translation of Herr Neumann's Report

Exhumated corpse in the community Campo Aviazione (Caserena R. Marina). Pages of an American calendar. Fragments of a thermometer, non-chemical. One cross with metal-chain, white, symbolizing the VIRGIN MARY. $\frac{1}{4}$ American Dollar coin, two other smaller coins American origin. First aid kit with inscription PUKER SIDE NEXT T. WONNO (Put this side next to wound). Remnants of military clothing (shredded) Fragments of a page of prayer, partly legible in South-American language.
