A Board of Officers appointed by paragraph 1, Division Order No. 1, dated 15 January 1958, convened at hours, 1958, and after consideration of the following factors, approved the identification of Unknown X-70038, Frankfurt (MED) Mausoleum, as unidentifiable.

Reference is made to the attached letter, dated 26 February 1957, Head-quarters, United States Army Quartermaster Mortuary Detachment, Subject: "Letter of Transmittal" which pertains to Unknown X-70088, Frankfurt (NED) Mausoleum.

The remains of this unknown were discovered by the German Var Graves Cormission during exhumation of thirty-four casualties from the German Section of Cemetery Frazione-Turano, Massa, Italy. Since this unknown designated SR #5010 was believed to be American, custody was accepted by an American Search Team, presumably in early February 1957 since the Report of Investigation gives no date. This unknown was subsequently removed to the Frankfurt Mausoleum where it was designated Unknown M-70086. Found with the remains were several US coins, an Italian coin, a sterling silver crucifix with chain bearing a US shield on the front and the inscription: "I am a Catholic. Heese call a priest" on the reverse, a three-inch section of a medical thermometer, remanats of a first aid bandage, fragments of a page of prayer and pages of an American calendar. No identifying data was obtainable from any of these items.

The identifying data of Unknown X-70080 was compared with all available identification data of unresolved casualties killed in action in the area of recovery with negative results.

In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that remains designated Unknown K-70088, Frankfurt (KED) Mausoleum, be declared unidentifiable.



Under provisions of AR 15-6, dated 25 July 1955, there is hereby established the Memorial Division Board of Review (hereinafter referred to as the Board) to assist the Chief, Memorial Division, in the resolution of special cases which involve the identifiability, non-identifiability, or nonrecoverability of the remains of deceased persons.
- 2. Membership. The Board will consist of three (3) officers. The President of the Board will be designated by the Chief, Memorial Division. One member, as designated by the President, will act as recorder for the Board and will be responsible for the documentation of the findings of the Board.
- 3. Authority. In the resolution of all cases referred to in paragraph 1 above, the Board will serve as the reviewing channel between the operating branch and the Division Chief. The Board is authorized to review all such cases as are referred through it to the Division Chief. After documentation of its findings, the Board will recommend the approval of the Division Chief or his designated representative or return the case to the operating branch for reconsideration of its determinations.
- 4. <u>Duties</u>. The Board is charged with the following duties and responsibilities:
- a. Establish a set of standards and procedures to determine the adequacy, authenticity, and completeness of records which serve as an operating basis for the Board.
- b. Review case history reports concerning the identifiability of recovered remains as submitted by the operating branch.
- c. Review case history reports concerning the non-identifiability of individual recovered remains and the non-identifiability of individual remains from group recoveries.

Information received from the German Dar Graves Commission, one, Italy, revealed that during exhumation of 34 German deceased at the Cemetery Prasione-Turano, Massa, Italy, remains believed to be those of an American deceased were discovered.

Upon disinterming Grave 31, German section, of the above mechanic centery, several U.S. coins, portion of a American type thermometer, a small crucifix inscribed on revenue side "I am a Catholic blacke call a Priest", were found with these remains. According to Ir Temman's report of disinterment (attached), remains of a first rid bundary and names of an American calcades were also found.

No records exist in Neces concerning the interment of the 34 resains. According to the Cemetery Maministration the interments were unde exclusively by members of the Norman Mehrmoht during the combat period eccerning in the Massa crass.

The remains, unon exemination, were found to be nearly complete. Summarize teach were posthurously missing, the remaining teach in excellent state of demol remain.

On the basis of the above restioned fluitary resting were accepted as those of an American decedant all assi med by . 5010.
