



The remains now designated Unknown X-70046 were recovered after discovery by an Italian farter while searching for scrap metal near his home at Nonte Childerare (sheet 88/3033) Italy. Also another isolated grave was found at the same time, approximately 200 meters away, which contained the remains now identified as Pfc Andrew J. Lorencik, 33490660, of Company "a" 377th Infantry Legiment, 85th Division, reported NIA 27 October 1944.

Unknown K-70046 was tentatively identified by this headcharters as the remains of Opl Harry K. Touchtone, 34531310, Company "A" 337th Infantry Resiment, LIA 27 October 1914, on the basis of; date and place of death being in agreement with casualty information and favorable height and weight estimation. However, upon review by CONG it was revealed that difference between the estimated age of the remains and the actual age of Touchtone was of such variance to preclude identification as subject decedent.

Extensive review of former mediterranean Zone files on casualties lost in the general area of monte rezzanc and onto Jalderare, Italy failed to provide a 'clear cut' (positive) association between an unreceivered decedent and 1-70016. As a result of this survey it was found that the following capualties possess characteristics of similarity in more than one aspect:

SUBJECT: Field Board Findings recommending identification of Unknown X-70046 Griesheim/Main (MED ZONE) Mausoleum (Recent Recovery) as Cpl Harry K. Touchtone, 34531310.

- 1. Field Board Findings recommending the above identification are predicated upon the erroneous conclusion that Cpl. Touchtone and Pfc Andrew J. Lorencik, 33490660, members of Company A, 337th Infantry Regiment, reported MIA 27 October 1944 in the vicinity of Monte Mezzano, Italy, are the only unresolved casualties in that area. Unknown X-70045, Griesheim/Main (MED ZONE) Mausoleum, (recovered from an isolated grave approximately 190 yards distant from the grave in which Unknown X-70046 was interred) is being identified as Pfc Lorencik; ergo, the subject Unknown is Cpl. Touchtone. This assumption is unwarranted. There are at least two (2) other unresolved casualties of record in the area, both of whom were members of the same company and were reported MIA on the same date and in the same action as Cpl Touchtone; i.e., Sgt. William R. Mills, 31061171, and Pvt. Floyd W. Taylor, 39904563.
- 2. Estimated age of Unknown X-70046 is 18-19 years. Corporal Touchtone's age at the time he was reported missing in action was 31 years, 11 months, 19 days. (The Field has never been furnished the date of Cpl. Touchtone's birth.) Comparison of tooth chart accomplished for the Unknown with available dental records for Cpl. Touchtone is inadequate and inconclusive. (Comparison chart attached)
- 3. In view of all the facts, it is recommended that the above Findings be rejected and that the Field be advised accordingly.





The toeth are intact in the skull and mandible and the skull articulates with the first six (6) conviced vertebrae. The next two (2) vertebrae are missing but the similarity of the adjacent vertebrae indicates the vertebral column is for one and the same deceased. The teeth are in agreement with the dental data available for Ffc LOWENCIK. NOIE (*) The age is not shown on the Form 371 but a newspaper clipping found in the wallet of Pfc LOWENCIK refers to the celebration of his also birthday while in Italy.

The maxillary teeth are intect in the skull but the mandible is missing. The skull cannot be articulated with the rest of the remains because the first eight (8) vertebrae are missing. The teeth are not contradictory with the limited dental data available for Cpl TOUCHTONE. The one and three-quarter inch difference between the estimated height and height as indicated on the Form 371 may be accounted for by additional growth from the date of induction (19 Nov 42) to the date of death (27 Oct 44).

4. CAUSE OF DEATH: The skeletal portions present with these cases do not reveal any evidence which would indicate the actual cause of death.



NARRATIVE OF INVESTIGATION

I. AUTHORITY AND HATTERS INVESTIGATED:

In accordance with the Instructions contained in ID # 1050, an investigation was conducted in the vicinity of Castel San Pietro (38/E3), in an effort to recover the remains of Pfc Andrew J Lorencik, 33490660.

II . FACTS AND CIRCUESTANCES:

Pfc Lorencik was reported missing in action on 27 October 1944 while a member of Co "A" 337th Inf Regt. A report recently received from Italian authorities indicates that two supposed American remains and an identification tag bearing Lorencik's name were found in the vicinity of Castel San Pietro.

III. FUDDAGE:

A visit was made to the Carabinieri of Castel Sah Pietro. At the station the ID tag and some personal effects were recovered. At the cemetery in Castel San Pietro, two remains were recovered. A visit was then made to ir. Cavalieri at Monte Calderaro, which is in the mountains some 20 kilometers from Castel San Pietro. Mr. Cavalieri, a farmer, found the remains on 15 September 1952 while looking for scrap metal near his home. The enclosed sketch will show the relative position of the remains when found. Mr. Cavalieri does not remember from which grave came the remains bearing the ID tag. Remains were assigned SR # 741 and 742.

IV. CONCLUSION:

It is concluded from the above that the remains recovered at Monte Calderaro are American, and the one of them is the remains of Pfc Andrew J. Lorencik, 33490660.

V. RECOMENDATION:

It is recommended that an attempt be made to associate the remains recovered with Pfc Lorencik and Cpl Touchtone.
