Grave 121, USMC Griesheim/Main Mausoleum, have been reviewed in accordance with par 159, SR 830-110-5, DA dated 3 March 1949, and it is the opinion of the Board of Review appointed by par 4, SO 93, Headquarters, Frankfurt Military Post, dtd 22 April 1952, -as amended by par 10, SO 107, Headquarters, Frankfurt Military Post, dtd 9 May 1952, that sufficient evidence is not available to establish the identity of the deceased concerned, and it is recommended these remains be classified as unidentifiable.

CASE HISTORY

UNKNOWN No. X-9120

Griesheim/Main Mausoleum

The remains designated Unknown X-9120 Griesheim/Main Mausoleum were reportedly recovered from STEUDNITZ/Stadtroda, (M-51/J-85) Germany. Clothing found in the box containing the remains was of US Air Force origin indicating this was the remains of an American.

Information received from the agents making the recovery of this remains indicate that a grave-digger who had disinterred three (3) British airmen from this cemetery in 1950 also knew of the location of two (2) American graves. It seems that two earlier attempts to recover the two (2) US casualties from this cemetery met with negative results and the cemetery caretaker indicated that there were no US burials in that cemetery. With the assistance of the grave-digger who had disinterred the three (3) British airmen in 1950, a third attempt was made resulting in the recovery of remains now designated as Unknown X-9120 (Prev. SR 348) and Unknown X-9134 (Prev. SR 349).

A thorough examination of the records of known casualties lost in the area surrounding place of recovery and covered by map sheets M-51, M-52, N-51 and N-52 has disclosed no favorable comparison between unrecovered casualties and Unknown X-9120.

In view of the lack of precise information as to the date, place and cause of death of this deceased, it is recommended that Unknown X-9120 be declared unidentifiable.








This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). CERTIFICATE

Upon instructions from Mr. Keilmann, two (2) further deceased were exhumed from the grave of Allied nationals in the local cemetery, which concern members of the US Army.

At the time the three (3) members of the British Army were disinterred, only these three (3) were evacuated to Berlin since they were known by name and the transport only was to include these three.

Since an exact location is no longer known, it was necessary to dig up the entire area concerned.

Since the Community Council in Steudnitz did not possess any records concerning those buried in the aforementioned grave, no exact report could be made.

REPORT OF EXHUMATION

SR's # 348 & # 349

1. Acting on information received from a JENA gravedigger, two (2) deceased were removed from the cemetery at STEUDNITZ/STADTRODA, (M-51/J-85) Germany and transferred to BERLIN, Germany.

2. The above mentioned grave-digger claims to have disinterred three (3) British airmen (only missing members of one crew) during 1950 from this particular cemetery and they were removed to the British War Cemetery in Berlin. He claimed that he knew of two (2) US burials at the STEUDNITZ cemetery.

3. Two visits to the cemetery of STEUDNITZ were met with negative statements that indicated there were no US dead buried there. A third visit accompanied by the JENA grave-digger is claimed to have forced an admission from the Burgomeister and grave-digger at STEUDNITZ that there were actually two (2) US dead buried there.

4. These two (2) cases were transferred to CIL Morgue in Frankfurt as cases SR # 348 and SR # 349 for complete processing.

NARRATIVE OF PROCESSING

1. Search and Recovery Case # 348 pertains to one (1) deceased recovered from the Allied Nationals' section of the local cemetery at STEUDNITZ/STADTRODA, (M-51/J-85) Germany.

2. The recovery of portions of US electrically heated flying suit, the top portion of a US fleece-lined flying boot and a Gem "Micromatic" safety razor indicated that this was the remains of an American flyer. There was no contradictory evidence which might indicate this was other than the remains of an American.

3. An unknown "X" number has been assigned as follows:

SR # 348 is now designated UNKNOWN X-9120 Griesheim/Main Mausoleum
Grave 121

4. Laboratory examination reveals the following physical characteristics:

Teeth are intact in skull and mandible. There is excellent occlusion and articulation between mandible and maxilla and skull. Articulation of the skull with the rest of the remains is not possible because of missing vertebrae. Agreement in age and structural features indicates that all portions are for one and the same deceased.

5. CAUSE OF DEATH: The opening noted in the left temporo-parietal region of the skull does not appear to have had any bearing on the death of this casualty. Condition of fracture indicates injury could not have happened during life but may have been caused by a disinterment instrument. There are no other evidences of injury by which cause of death might be determined which indicates death occurred as the result of disease or loss of blood from flesh wounds.

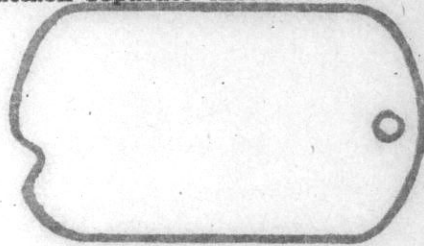
