Griesheim/Main Mausoleum

The remains designated Unknown X-9133 represent one (1) of three (3) deceased recovered from a destroyed bunker located 2 kilometers SSW of GERMETER in Forest District # 20 "Raffelsbrand", (3/F-012303) Germany.

The finding of considerable U. S. Military clothing and equipment is the only indication that these are the remains of an American casualty.

A study made of the records of casualties lost in the areas surrounding the recovery site indicates a large number of possible associations but due to the small amount of skeletal portions recovered and the consequent lack of sufficient identification media, it is not possible to make any definite individual or group association between these remains and known American casualties lost in this area of large scale fighting.

In view of the above noted circumstances, it is recommended that the remains designated Unknown X-9133 be declared "Unidentifiable".

MARRATIVE OF PROCESSING

- 1. Search and Recovery Cases # 358 A. B and C pertain to partial remains of three (3) deceased recovered from a bunker located two kilometers SSW of GERMSTER, in forest district # 20 "Reffelsbrand", (3/F-012303) Germany. The finding of a considerable amount of U.S. clothing and equipment is a good indication that the recovered portions represent partial remains of American camualties. It was also noted that the finding of two badly damaged US helmet liners coincided with the finding of skull fragments for two (2) deceased.
- 2. We association could be made with known US easualties because of the small amount of skeletal portions recovered. Segregation was accomplished according to size, weight, structure and age of portions recovered. Besignation of Unknown "X" numbers has been made as follows:

SR # 358-B now designated UNKNOWN X-9132 Griesheim/Main Mausoleum Grave 133

4. CAUSE OF DEATH: Severely shattered condition of skeletal remains indicates death was probably caused by explosion.

NARRATIVE OF DISINTERMENT

In accordance with ID # 973, Case # Wisc., dated 13 June 1952, an investigation was conducted in COLOGNE and the Hurtgen Forest area in order to recover a remains believed to be those of a US World War II deceased.

In a letter dated 19 May 1952, Dr. LUDWIG FINKE, procurist of a textile firm in COLOGNE (K-51/F-95), Muchlengasse 1-15, informed this office that upon an excursion to the Hurtgen Forest he had found human remains, clothing fragments, and an American helmet near a bunker. Concluding the presence of an American deceased, Dr. FINKE collected the remains as best he could at the time and took them to his residence in COLOGNE for safekeeping pending further disposition by American authorities.

Upon contacting Dr. FINKE in COLOGNE, the remains recovered by him, and consisting of several shattered arm, leg bones, several vertebrae and ribs, pieces of skull and hip and a part of mandible were submitted to this investigator. Questioning Dr. FINKE, it was learned that he had recovered the remains together with helmet liner and clothing fragments at a bunker located 2 kilometers SSW of the town of GERMETER in the forest district # 20 "Raffelsbrand" on 1 June 1952. (See attached sketch). No ID tags or other means of identification had been found at or near the site of finding.

Arriving at the subject bunker, which had been blasted after the war, the area was thoroughly searched. The huge masses of destroyed bunker prohibited the thorough search of all crevices, however, the site where the remains had originally been found and which appeared to have been r cently disturbed was excavated to hard soil at 70 cm. In an area of 3 x 5 meters additional human remains, consisting of vertebrae, ribs, leg bones, pieces of skull and various fragments of German and American equipment were found intermingled. No means of identification could be found.

The remains have been assigned SR # 358 and submitted to the CIL Morgue, Frankfurt/Main for further processing and possible identification.
