





- 1. An investigation is being conducted by this office to determine the identity of an Unknown member of our Armed Forces, who was killed in the vicinity of Dillingen, Germany on or about 1 February 1945. Remains were recovered with those of Zeno L. Sanders, ASN. 62912852 of the 101st Engineering Command Battalion. The laundry mark "M-1969" was found on the clothing of the Unknown.
- 2. It is requested that your records be searched for all personnel of the lOlst Engineering Command Battalion reported missing or killed in action in that area on approximate date 1 February 1945, who would have the laundry mark "M-1969". Any other information which may be of assistance in establishing the identity of the Unknown should be forwarded to this office at the earliest practicable date.
