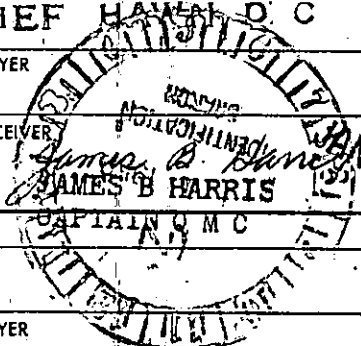

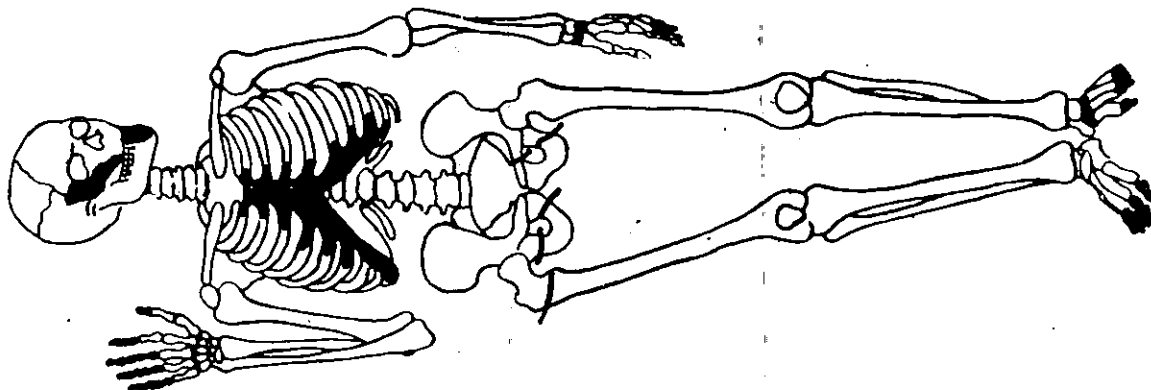

Picture a fairly tall man of very slender build. The skull is ellipsoidal in shape and very small in size. The vault is high. The forehead is quite high and rather straight. The face is small, narrow and probably rectangular in shape. The nasal root is low and cavo-convex in profile. The upper jaw presents alveolar prognathism and the incisor teeth are shovel shaped and the molars are very large and well worn.

From indications above stated, this man is probably of oriental origin.

Fluoroscopic examination unnecessary. Teeth charted.

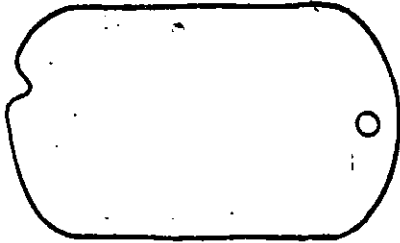
