DETAILS AND CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING DISAPPEARANCE OF PERSONNEL REPORTED
MISSING IN ACTION

1. In compliance with paragraph 15, Section IV, Circular No. 10, NATOUS, dated 24 January 1944, the following report is submitted:

a. CARL E. WILLIAMS 35 706 717 Pvt Co "G" 362d Inf

b. Vicinity of Mt. Calvi, Italy.

(Place or locality where soldier was last seen)

c. Type of mission and duty assignment at time of disappearance:

Pvt Carl E. Williams, 35 706 717, saw his platoon sergeant on 23 September 1944 to obtain permission to report to the dispensary as Pvt. Williams suffered from exhaustion. Permission was granted him by his platoon sergeant and a report was made to the 1st. Sgt. Pvt Williams left Mt Calvi at approximately 1600.

d. Opinion, based on available facts, as to probable fate of individual reported: It is possible that Pvt Williams strayed too far to the right and was captured by the enemy. No Admittance Record to a hospital can be traced. No other men have seen Pvt Williams since he left the top of Mt Calvi. There is also a possibility that Pvt Williams might have been caught in a mortar or artillery barrage and was killed.

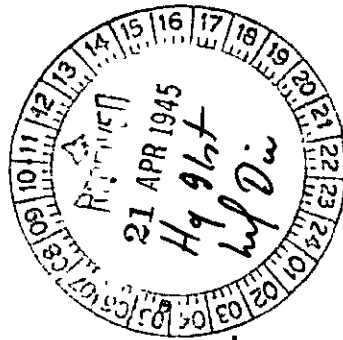

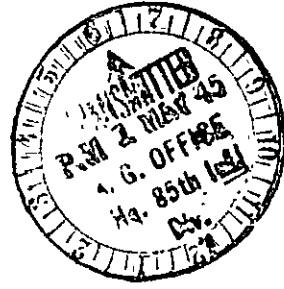

STATEMENT

On the 3rd of April 1945, I evacuated a body from the vicinity of Mount Altuzzo, at the coordinates: Q 897 - 973. Parts of the body were scattered over an area of fifty square feet, indicating death was caused from direct hit by a medium sized shell. The entire surrounding area and houses nearby were thoroughly searched and no means of identification could be found. Due to the time elapse since death, nothing could be found on the body to establish identity. I was a member of the Regimental Graves Registration Section at the time of the attack on Mount Altuzzo and know of no member of this Regiment missing or killed in the vicinity of coordinates Q 897 - 973.

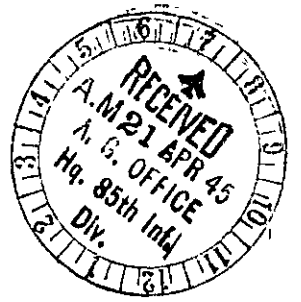

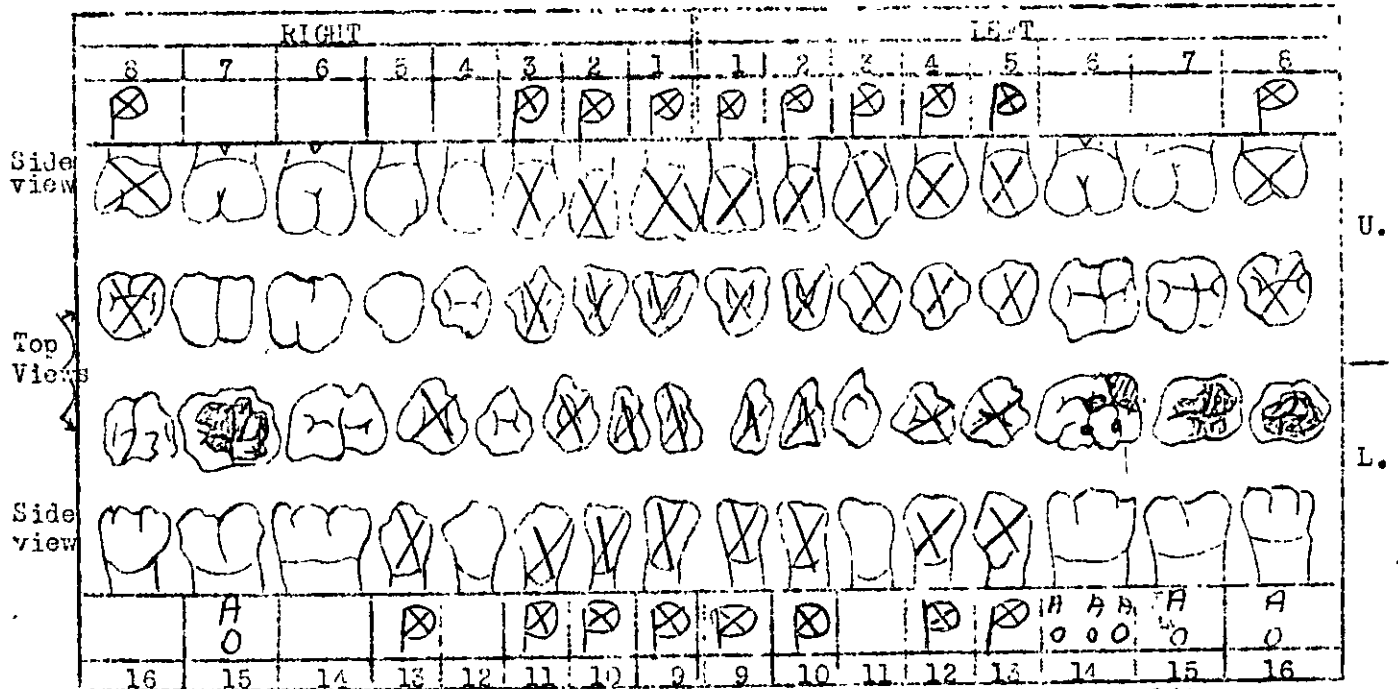

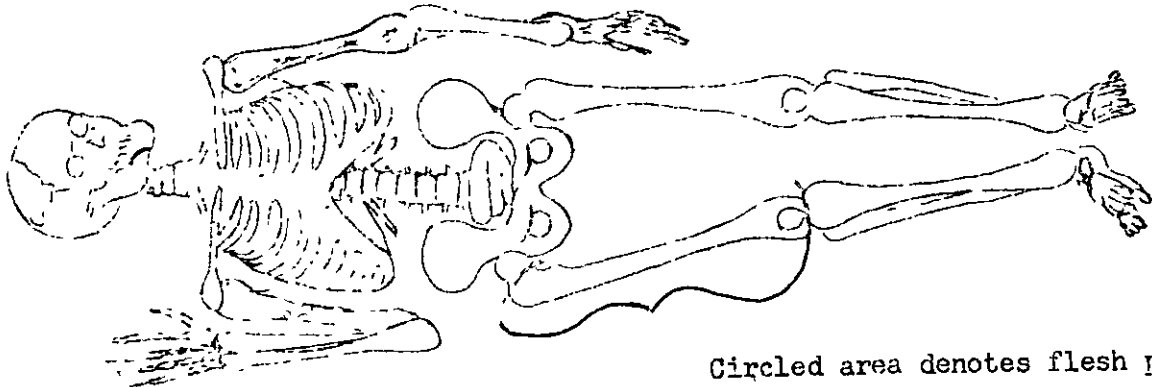
