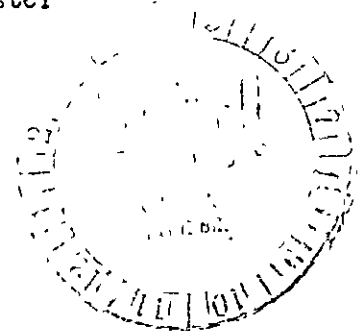

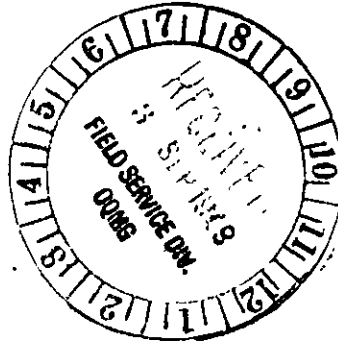
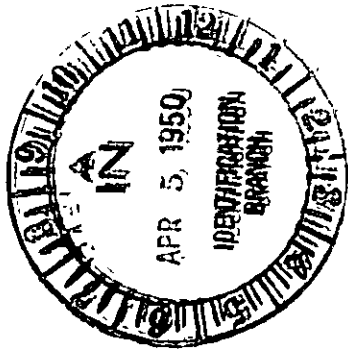

1. The remains of Unknown American X-200 were found on the surface of the earth, Grid Coords: U-943966, Sheet 104-IVNE, Map of Italy, and were interred in U.S. Military Cemetery, Castelfiorentino, Italy; plot 2-G, row 89, grave 4523, on 7 August 1945.
2. The listings for unrecovered casualties for this area have been processed to eliminate all casualties from units which were not in the vicinity of Porta (3 miles North of Forte dei Marmi, Italy) Grid Coords: U-943966, Sheet 104-IVNE.
3. Records on file this headquarters and review of casualty listings, indicate that casualties were sustained in this area by the 92nd Division from October 1944 to April 1945, these dates being based on identified casualties from the same Division. It is assumed that date of death for Unknown American X-200 could have been during this period.
4. When found body was too decomposed to fingerprint and teeth were missing. A First Aid packet was found with numbers "G-1970", and a web belt with numbers T-4662. A check of the numbers revealed the web belt belonged to Thorton, Joseph, interred. No clue for the First Aid packet was found. Clothing found:

O.D. Pants size: 31 - 33  
Approximate height: 5'9"

Although the long bones indicate a height of 5' 11" this is not correct. The vertebral column is abnormally small and therefore would reduce the height considerably. The height estimate is about 5' 8" all factors considered.

In the opinion of the undersigned, the representative parts of a human remains graphically represented in par 19 are those of one and the same individual.

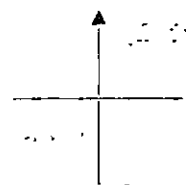

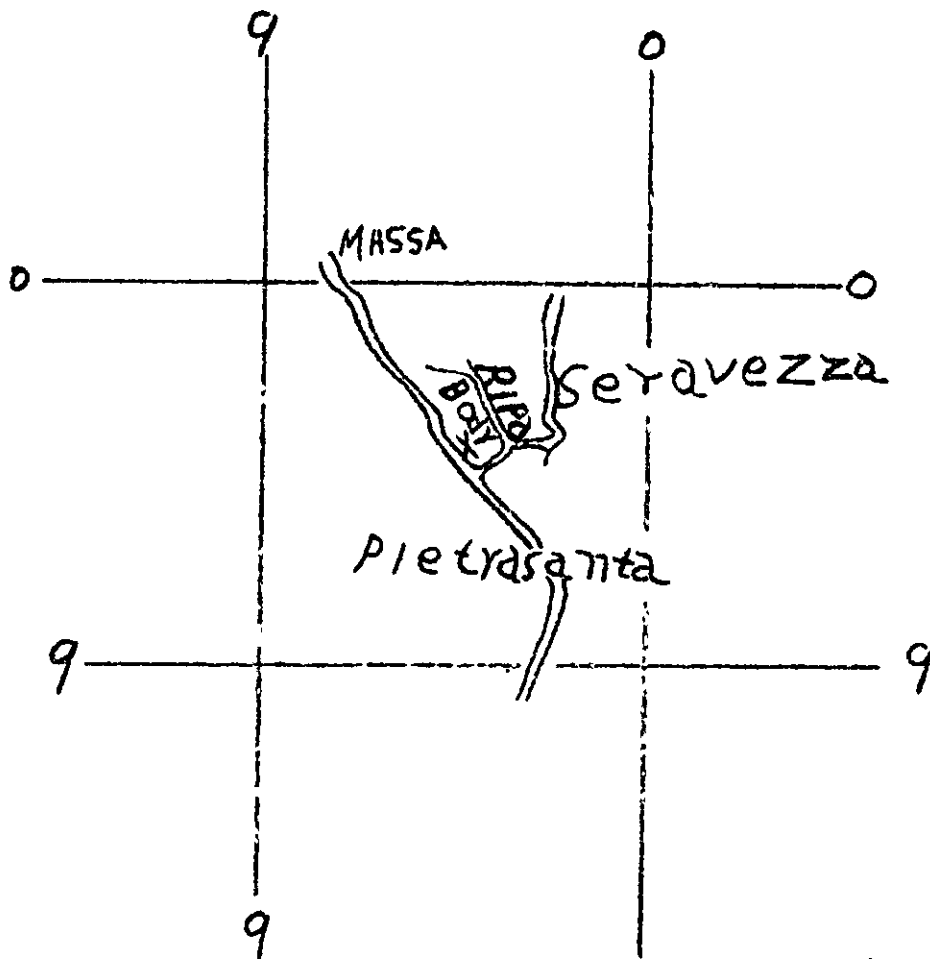
