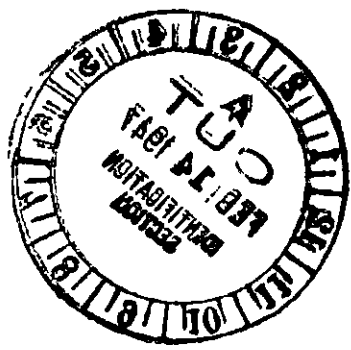

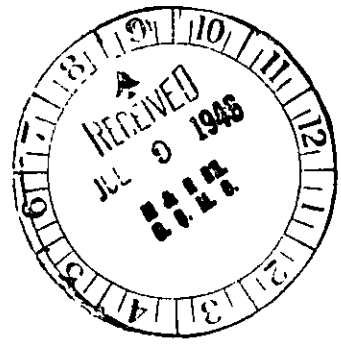

1. Submitted herewith is a field report of investigation of this office covering Unknown American Soldier X-255, whose remains were exhumed from an isolated grave vicinity of Monte Morosino, Italy, coord: M (O.1-1.9) Sh. 11, Map Ref: 1/200.000.

2. Facts:

Investigation team led by Pfc. Labon R. Jones went to the above coordinate to exhume said American soldier, and that Pvt. ALEX A. COX, 38534052 was reported missing in that area.

3. Findings:

A. The isolated grave was found with the aid of Torrini Florio, a civilian living at Rocca Nuova, comune di Fontanelice, Italy.

B. Remnants O.D. clothing no markings.

C. Tooth chart was possible. DARK hair noted.

D. The height was estimated at 6' and weight at 185.

4. Recommendations:

That the tooth chart of X-255 be checked against that of ALEX A. COX 38534052.

5. Comments:

A. On investigation of ALEX A. COX 38534052 we find that there is no Monte Morosino about 15 miles south of Faenza as our correspondence stated, but about 15 miles south west of Imola there is a Monte Morosino coord: M (O.2-2.3) in which vicinity the body was found.- We are carrying these remains as unknown X-255.

B. The area in above coord, has been well searched for American dead, according to the civilians living in that locality they do not know of any other American deceased, buried in that locality other than the re-

mains of X-255. It is the opinion of this office that the remains of X-255 are those of ALEX A. COX 38534052.

6. Conclusions:

The remains of Unknown American soldier X-255, are now interred in plot 2-J Row 87, grave 4787, in the U. S. Military Cemetery at Castelfiorentino, Italy and OMC form No. 1 GRS will be forwarded to your Headquarters.

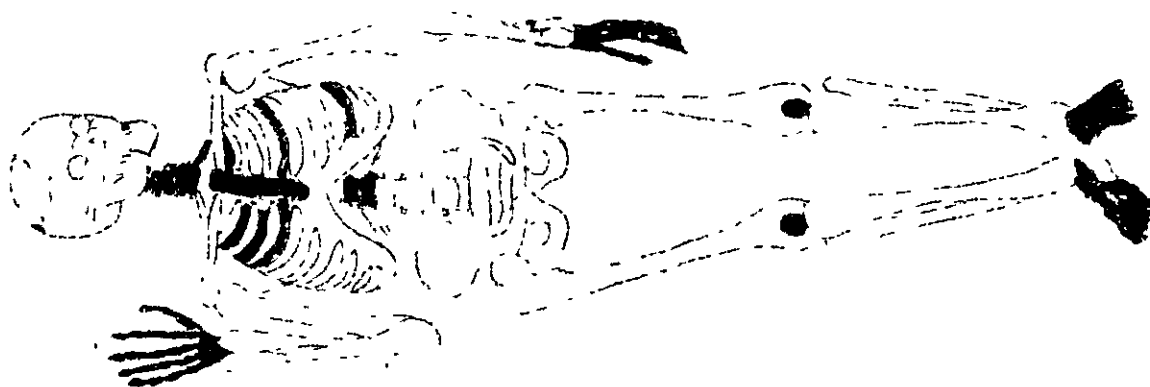
