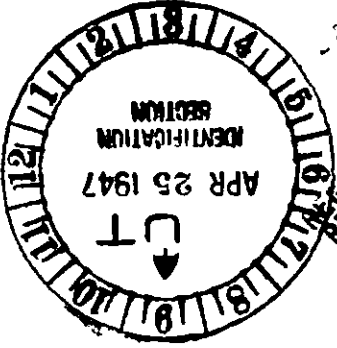

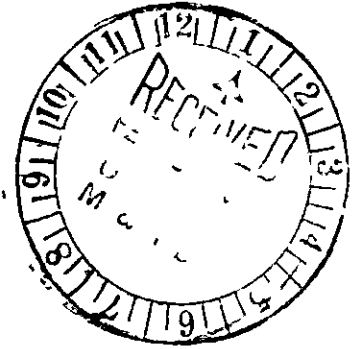
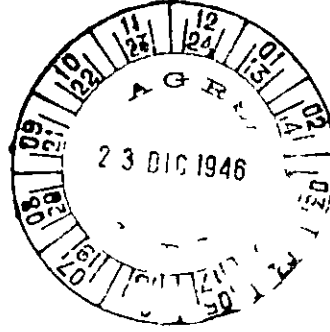

1. The remains of Unknown American X-266 were found on the surface of the earth in the vicinity of Mt. Canala, Seravazza, Italy, Grid Coords. U-96.6-96.7, sheet 104, Map reference 1/100,000 and interred in the U.S. Military Cemetery, Castelfiorentino, Italy, plot 2-J, row 91, grave 4833, 2 July 1946.

2. Casualty records on file this headquarters indicate that troops of the 92nd Division were engaged in combat in the aforementioned area from October 1944 to April 1945. Date of death for X-266 was estimated as 28 October 1944.

3. Information available to this office indicates that identification tags were removed from the remains of X-266 by an Italian, and delivered to AGRS Office in Leghorn, about 25 November 1945. No record of identification tags available, but correspondence on file indicates that they belonged to "Duhart Limus, 34 404 982."

4. Physical characteristics:

- a. height: 5'9"
- b. weight: about 175 lbs
- c. hair: black curly

Laundry marks: (W-2639) found on scrap of clothing on the surface of the earth. Also found was a raincoat collar with laundry marks "W-2639". A check of these digits was made with negative results. Remains consisted of broken and shattered bones, evidence of close artillery fire.

5. It is requested that physical characteristics of Unknown American X-266 be compared with those on file War Department for: "Duhart Limus, 34 404 982" and report of findings be forwarded this office upon completion thereof.

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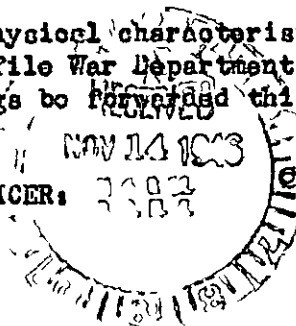

1. Submitted herewith is a field report of investigation of this office covering remains of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-266, recovered from the surface of the earth on Mt. Canala in the vicinity of Seravezza, Italy at Coord. (96.6-96.7) Sh 104, Map Reference 1/100,000.

### 2. FACTS:

A. Investigation team led by T/5 Tadashi Ishida went to the above mentioned Coord. to recover remains of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-266.

B. The remains were reported by BUSELLI, ADAMO, an Italian civilian living in the town of Seravezza, Italy to our investigation team. With Buselli acting as guide, the team started their climb up Mt. Canala to the location of said remains. During combat this area had been held by elements of the 92nd Div. (Inf). The rough mountainous terrain still remains littered with dangerous mine fields and unexploded artillery shells.

C. The Italian guide stated that one identification tag of said UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-266 had been given to Major Curtiss J Ivey (then Captain) who is now in charge of the Civilian Personal Section in Naples, Italy. This office is now in the process of obtaining said identification tag.

### 3. FINDINGS:

A. The remains of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-266 were discovered on the surface of the earth just off the beaten path that led up to the top of Mt. Canala. At this point the investigation team was four (4) kilometers from the town of Seravezza, Italy, proceeding in a western direction.

B. The remains found on the surface of the earth, indicating lack of completeness for bones were scattered within a radius of several feet.

After a complete and thorough search of the surrounding area, the following listed bones were recovered

(3. FINDINGS: cont'd)

C. Tooth chart was impossible as head, mandible and maxilla were all missing.

D. Only clothing found was a toru raincoat bearing laundry marks (W-2639)

E. Kinky black curly hair was also found.

F. It is estimated that UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-266 died on or about October 1944 and that he was 5'9" in height, weighed about 175 lbs and 23 years old. The remains are presumably that of a colored soldier.

4. COMMENTS:

A. Our files have been checked for the above mentioned laundry marks which were found on raincoat of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-266, no available information can be found at this Office.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

A. That we carry the above mentioned remains as UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-266 until we can contact Major CURTISS J. IVELY in regards to the identification tag was given to him and see if it concides with laundry markings (W-2639) which were found on raincoat of deceased soldier.

6. CONCLUSIONS:

The remains of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-266 are now interred in Plot 2-J, Row 91, Grave 4833 at the UNITED STATES MILITARY CEMETERY AT CASTELFIORENTINO, ITALY and QIC Form #1 GRS will be forwarded to your headquarters.

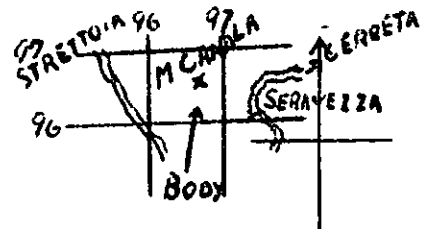

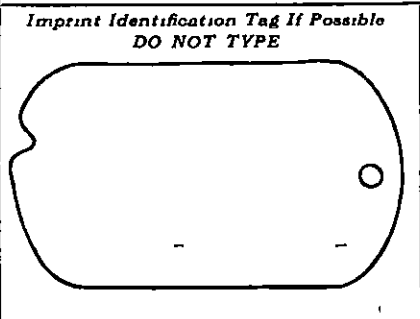


